Automobile Accessibility Change for 2018/2019: With the addition of approximately 100 students next school year, we will no longer be able to allow cars to enter the front or side parking lots during arrival or dismissal. All cars will need to use the car rider line. Please go ahead and start practicing this so that it will become routine before next year. In the 18/19 school year, enter the front parking lot to enter the building if you need to: drop off cupcakes, making a special delivery, making a change of transportation, volunteering, etc. Parents wishing to avoid the car rider line or wanting to walk their student to the front door will be directed to the car rider line. This has been allowed this year due to our small number but as we grow it becomes a safety concern. Thank you for understanding and for helping ensure *safety* for all.

**Bike Rider Accessibility Change for 2018/2019:** We will also be streamlining how students riding bikes will enter campus grounds. Please see this map for information. This change is being made in order to reduce the use of the crosswalk which cuts through the car rider line. This will ensure more *safety* and keep the car rider line moving smoothly. Please go ahead and start having your students practice this new route this year so it is not brand new in August. Thank you!

# Prevent summer math slide

**Q:** I'm concerned that my daughter's math skills will get rusty while school is out. What should I do?

A: Keeping math "muscles" strong is fun!

Look for ways to add math to outdoor games. For instance, write math facts like 7 + 8 or 9 x 6 in hopscotch squares. As your daughter jumps to each box, she calls out the answer. If she's "It" during hide-and-seek, she could count to 100 by 2s, 5s, or 10s while players hide.

Also, give her opportunities to estimate. Cut open a watermelon, and ask how many seeds she thinks it contains. Or have her estimate how many people

are in the deep end of the swimming pool or in your row at a baseball game. Then, she should count to check her answers.

As she estimates and counts, her skills will improve. ♥
