Bikes/Scooters: Students who ride bikes/scooters to school need to use a lock in order to secure property. Without a lock, all bikes/scooters are left "at your own risk."

Friendship Parties: Friendship Parties will be held on February 14th. The party times are as follows: 10:30-11:15-- 2nd & 3rd Grades; 11:45-12:30-- Kindergarten & 4th Grade; 12:00-12:45-- 1st Grade; 2:00-2:45-- 5th Grade. **Please note-** in order to stay within building capacity and remain aligned to Fire Marshall standards, there is a limit of 2 adults per student during parties. We use the following guidelines for party visitors: Parent(s)/Legal Guardian(s), Grandparents listed on the Lunch Visitor Form completed in the 1st Day of School Packet, and aunts/uncles who are accompanied by a parent/guardian. We encourage all students to stay at school after their party as the remainder of the day is instructional and a regular school day. Students leaving early do receive a partial day absence. If you will be

attending your student's party, it is encouraged that you Pre-Raptor for the event so you do not have to wait in long lines to be processed. You can Pre-Raptor if you have previously visited our campus and had your Driver's License scanned into the Raptor system. <u>Click here</u> to Pre-Raptor before 2/11/19. In order to pick-up your Pre-Raptor Badge, you must present your current identification.

Friendship Cards: Friendship cards may be distributed on the 14th of February. Teachers will instruct students to not open any candy that may be attached as part of friendship cards. Home to School Connection

Read to succeed

Whether your child is solving a word problem in math or following instructions for a science experiment, strong reading skills play an important role. Here are activities to build his comprehension as he learns in three key subjects.


Math

Suggest that your youngster read a math

story problem aloud and then retell it in his own words—leaving out the numbers! This allows him to focus on what the problem is asking him to do before he tries to solve it. Example: "A panda had a lot of bamboo. Then he ate some. Now he has less. How much bamboo does he have left?" He'll know that he needs to subtract.

Science

Diagrams, charts, tables, and other graphics help your child "see" science concepts. Encourage him to create his own visual aids. If he's reading about the



layers of the Earth, maybe he will draw a diagram and label the *crust*, *mantle*, *outer core*. and *inner core*.

History

Your youngster will go back in time by reading historical fiction about topics he studies. He'll feel as if he's walking the streets of ancient Greece, for instance, while also getting background information on people, places, and events. He might try a series like Magic Tree House (Mary Pope Osborne) or Blast to the Past (Stacia Deutsch and Rhody Cohon).♥
