## **SENIOR BANNERS**

The countdown is beginning! Banner orders are starting to get into the production line. You should expect to receive an email to tie up any loose ends you may have with your student's banner. This could be anything from confirming a quote to solidifying where the banner will hang. You will also receive a proof of the banner. This is a great way to correct any mistakes before the banner is made.

I will be requesting help placing the banners in the hallways. Get your ladders ready!!!

I've listed frequently asked questions below:

- 1. How do I place an order?

  Go to the PTSA website and place your order online or print off the order form and turn it in at the front office. Click here for the online order form.
- 2. How much do banners cost?

  As of January 2019, the 2'x3' banners are \$40 and the 2'x6' banners are \$75.
- 3. What can I have printed on the small banners?

  The smaller banners have room for a salutation. For example, "Love, Mom & Dad", "Love, Your Family, "Go Gators", "Go Bulls", "Charge On".
- 4. What can I have printed on the large banners?

  Large banners include a photo of your Senior and a quote. You can have up to 100 characters.
- 5. What picture should I use?
  Any high-resolution picture (300 DPI) will work. This could be a baby picture, a favorite picture from when your child was growing up, or a Senior picture.
- 6. I want a large banner but I'm not sure what quote to use. Should I wait to turn in the order form? Turn in your form ASAP. You will be contacted for the remaining information as the deadline approaches.
- 7. Where will the banners be placed?

  The banners will be hung throughout the hallways of the 200 & 300 buildings and the cafeteria.
- 8. Can I choose where I want my student's banner to hang?
  All those who placed their order by October 31, 2018 got to choose where their banner will hang. Orders received after that date will NOT be able to choose a spot for their banner. These banners will be hung in the 200-300 hallways.
- 9. When will the banners be hung?
  Banner will be hung after school on April 11.
- 10. How long will the banner be up?

  The banners will come down Thursday, May 2 so the students can get them back before AP exams.
- 11. How do we get our banners? Banners will be returned to students during their lunch periods from May 2-10. Any remaining banners can be picked up at Senior meeting
- 12. What help is needed with banners?

  Your help is greatly appreciated. I will need help hanging &/or taking down the banners. Bring your ladders!!

# **Guidance News**

The guidance department will provide updates on a regular basis through emails and entries on the Guidance, College & Career Edsby Group Page, and on the Steinbrenner website under "Resources" "Guidance".

Programming and Success Center Activities took place January 9-28 for all students in 9-11 grades. Counselors met with students to finalize their class selection for next school year. Students also worked in the Success Center to explore careers, colleges, scholarships, and learn the importance of linking their PSAT scores to Khan Academy for practice. Be sure to ask our student for the handouts we gave them. Each student received a copy of their course requests for the 2019-2020 school year when they left the meeting with their counselor. Parents, ask to see it and review it with your student. It's important that all classes be finalized with the appropriate paperwork by March 15. There will not be any schedule adjustment after this date.

**February 21--Junior Night; 6:30-8:00p**—This is an opportunity to learn all about the college application scholarship, and financial aid process. Our guidance staff as well as professionals from local universities and colleges will present information. Parents and students welcome.

**February 21—Mini-College Fair; 6:30-8:00p—Cafeteria—**Area colleges will be in attendance including USF, FSU, UT, FL POLY, HCC, HC Honors, & FAU. Meet the representative and ask questions. Military Recruiters will also be in attendance.

February 22 & March 3—Girls/Boys State Program—Junior girls and boys have the opportunity to apply for the Girls and Boys State Program which will take place this summer. This program is for students who are interested in Government and Leadership. The selected students spend one week during the summer in Tallahassee. This program's goal is to inspire and develop interest in the study of government, foster civic leadership, but most of all, to stimulate a desire to protect the privileges and responsibilities of our democratic form of government. This is an excellent opportunity for students interested in Military Academies also. The program provides the opportunity for students to earn high school and college credit. Applications are available from Mrs. Pressley in Guidance. Interviews for girls will be held March 3 from 1:00-3:00 at the American Legion. Applications should be taken to the interview. Boys State interviews will be held February 22 at Steinbrenner.

**May 3 deadline**—Seniors who have not completed the Virtual School Graduation Requirement must do so by May 3.

**Bright Futures Scholarship Applications** – The application opened for seniors to apply for Bright Futures and other State of Florida Scholarships at <a href="www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org">www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org</a>. All seniors should apply and turn in community service hours if they haven't done so already. Students may continue to meet the SAT/ACT, and GPA requirements through June. Community service hours must be completed and turned in before graduation. Step by step directions have been posted to the Steinbrenner Guidance Page and to Edsby Guidance Page.

**Financial Aid** – Seniors and parents should be completing the financial aid process to apply for assistance in paying for college. There are several organizations that charge fees for completing the form so be sure to only use the official website – <a href="www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a>. This application allows students to obtain free money through grants, work study, and scholarships. Student may also be offered student loans through this process.
