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Class Interruptions

It is not too late to pay the tech fee, giving you a big discounted price on damages if something accidentally happens to the laptop. If there is an accidental break WITHOUT the tech fee, it can cost more than \$100 to fix in many cases. The tech fee also means that the student is given a charger and is allowed to take their laptop home.

# Nurse's Corner

- What a whirlwind we've experienced in starting this school year! I truly hope this finds you and your family well.
- As I am in the process of reviewing immunization records, I have become aware of a large number of our students who have not received, or have not completed the series, for HPV (**Human Papillomavirus**) and Meningitis. Although these immunizations are not required for school attendance, they are highly recommended by the CDC (**Centers for Disease Control and Prevention**).

#### According to the CDC:

- **HPV vaccination is cancer prevention**. While most U.S. adolescents are starting the HPV vaccine series, **less than half** have finished the HPV vaccine series. Every year that adolescents aren't vaccinated is another year they are left unprotected against cancer-causing infections.
- Meningococcal disease has two common outcomes: <u>meningitis</u> (infection of the lining of the brain and spinal cord) and <u>bloodstream infections</u>. The bacteria that cause meningococcal disease spread through the exchange of nose and throat droplets, such as when coughing, sneezing, or kissing. Symptoms include sudden onset of fever, headache, and stiff neck. With bloodstream infection, symptoms also include a dark purple rash. About one of every ten people who gets the disease dies from it. Survivors of meningococcal disease may lose their arms or legs, become deaf, have problems with their nervous systems, become developmentally disabled, or suffer seizures or strokes.
- If you are unsure if your child is up to date on the recommended vaccines, check with your child's healthcare professional(s) for the most current record.
