## **Principal's Message**



November is already upon us and we are beginning to talk about the Holidays and the end of the first semester. As we enter this season of thanksgiving, let me take a moment to thank you, our parents and families, for your continued support in partnering with us to educate our students thus far. The dedication of so many adults is an indication of our community's belief in public education and, more importantly, belief in our *students*. Thank you!

**Election Season**. In addition to the holidays, November is also <u>Election</u> <u>Season</u>. No, there are no *major* political elections this November like President of the United States or Governor of the State of Kansas, but there <u>are</u> positions on the ballot that directly affect you and Northwest High School.

An excellent website to verify (1) your own voter registration and (2) what positions you are eligible to vote for is <u>www.myvoteinfo.voteks.org</u>. This website will also allow you to see a sample ballot ahead of time with those candidates who will be on that ballot.

Three seats on the Wichita City Council are up for election: districts 1, 3 and 6. For City Council seats, a person must live in the district for which they are voting. *Most*, although not all, of the Northwest High School attendance area lives in district 5 and would not be eligible to vote for a City Council candidate, but I would highly encourage you to check your address to see if you have a specific seat for which you could vote.

Four seats on the USD259 Board of Education are also up for election; districts 1, 2, 5 and 6. For voting on BOE positions, a person must live inside of the USD259 boundaries, but does <u>not</u> have to live in that specific BOE district. In other words, you are allowed to vote for <u>all four</u> BOE seats up for election! That's great news!

Certainly, I would never presume to influence your decision about which candidate to vote for, however, I would encourage you to do some research into the candidates. A great place to start your research is at our district's website <u>www.usd259.org/boe</u>. On the left-hand side click on the 2017 BOE Election Information link.

Expected turnout for this off-sequence election is just 10% of eligible voters, which means your vote will count tenfold! Please consider voting in the November 7<sup>th</sup> Election!

Northwest High School utilizes the Parchment Transcript Electronic System to deliver transcripts electronically to community colleges, colleges and universities. To utilize Parchment, the student must create an account at <u>www.parchment.com</u>. From there, the student will be able to request that his/her transcript be sent to the school of his/her choice. Please allow 24 hours for the request to be processed. Make sure you use your student's LEGAL NAME in order to process transcripts.

Paper transcripts will only be printed for scholarship applications.
