Dr. Rhodes' Weekly Message

This week, we will begin discussing our Wildly Important Goals (WIGs) for the school year. We have three WIGs this school year and in this edition of the Bryant Bulletin we will begin discussing Goal One- Student Growth. It is our goal that each and every student grow by at least one full school year or more by the end of each school year. This may seem like a given as students move up a grade level each year, but it is actually quite challenging. Since every student enters a grade level at a different "spot" in their learning, the most important aspect is for teachers to get to know and understand what students already know and determine a pathway for their learning. Continuous growth occurs when we do not focus on teaching all students the same thing in the same way, but teaching students overarching skills and then tailoring those skills to individual student need—practice with on-level materials, filling in gaps that students may have with the skill, or pushing students further who already know the skill. It is important to teach our students through the lens of a growth mindset; always pushing forward, setting goals, and growing in new ways.

Some specific ways we plan to ensure a year of more of growth for each student is through goal setting. Students will begin to set personal goals in class as well as academic goals. Students in all grade levels will use data to track their progress and record this data in their own data notebook/folder. Students, teachers, coaches, and administrators will discuss goals with students, how to set goals, how to measure success and what to do if we don't quite meet our goals and what to do next if we meet or exceed our goals. This of course will look different in Kindergarten than it will in 5th grade. Through this process, teachers will know their students even better, students will become more invested in their learning because they are intrinsically motivated to reach their goals, and overall, this will help each teacher to help grow each student by one or more years.

In next week's Bryant Bulletin, we will discuss other ways teachers and students will focus on Student Growth this school year.

FYI: Curriculum Nights begin on Thursday. Please see below for scheduled grade levels and times. Doors will open five minutes prior to the published start time. Please enter at the front of the school. The evening will begin in your student's classroom where they will show you around and explain routines. After 10 minutes we will transition to the gym where teachers will explain expectations, curriculum, and answer general questions about the grade level. This is a new format for us. Last year we conducted a Virtual Curriculum Night but parent feedback from the Parent End of Year Survey indicated that an in-person Curriculum Night would be preferred. Curriculum Night is not a time for parent/teacher conferences but will focus on broad expectations and curriculum to be covered during the year. Parents are welcome to bring their student and other siblings but all children must be supervised at all times, will need to sit with parents in the gym, and remain quiet during the presentation so everyone can hear. At the end of the Curriculum Night, all guests will exit through the gym doors, as we will be welcoming our next grade level through the front doors.

FYI: Based on the End of Year Parent Survey we have made adjustments to several key areas across grade levels to provide consistency. These include:

-A more specific School Management Plan with specific steps and consequences which are the same in all grades. -Consistent lines of communications between home and school, K-1 daily folder, 2-5 planner with <u>daily</u> indication of student behavior. Teachers will also communicate via phone, newsletter and email. There will not be the use of a variety of apps for different communication with different teachers.

-A different approach to homework. In the End of Year Parent Survey, parents were asked if students in grades K-2nd should have more homework than last year. 14.46% said "yes." The same question was asked of 3rd-5th parents and 8.43% said "yes." In the open comments section there were quite a few parents who discussed the need for flexibility in homework due to students' busy schedules. In response we have designed homework menus for each 9 weeks. Current research indicates reading nightly is important as well as the study of sight words; therefore, each grade level is indicating how many minutes students should read or practice sight words. Math facts are also important and should be practiced. The homework menus are designed to add extra activities for students to complete during the 9 weeks. Many of these activities involve interacting with family members, etc. Our goal is for students to intrinsically want to do these extra assignments. However, as a parent, if your student does not have time, they do not have to complete them. The homework menus are not for a grade but rather to share via technology and in the classroom. As the year progresses teachers will also provide links to websites/programs which you can use at your discretion for additional homework.

FYI: We will be making further adjustments to car rider arrival. This morning our car rider line was backed up to the roundabout, which also meant buses could not get in to the school. We are also not able to unload cars fast enough in the morning to get everyone in by 8:20. We are a growing campus (over 100 additional students just over the summer months) and will continue to grow, so it is important we get everything adjusted so we can handle growth over the coming years without continuing to make major adjustments each year. I will keep you updated through email as to changes as we make them. Once we make changes, we will also have staff members along the route to help guide you through any changes. Please remain flexible and calm. Working together, we will determine our best course of action to keep everyone safe, keep traffic flowing, and get everyone to school on time.

Thank You: Our new Treasure Tower in the Front Office has been sponsored for the first semester by <u>Cody's Tree</u> <u>Service, Inc.</u> Thank you to the Geimans for their sponsorship of this new initiative. Our Treasure Tower will be used to recognize student attendance as well as kindness exhibited by one student towards another.

Thank You: We have made some changes to our arrival and dismissal procedures and we appreciate your cooperation and understanding as everyone learns the new routines. Our goal in making these small changes is to increase student safety and streamline our processes.
