This Week's Character Challenge: Speak Up or Stand Up for someone in need.

Did you know that Bryant Elementary has a Kindness Crew? This group of third, fourth, and fifth graders are selected by their peers and teacher to represent their classroom as a Kindness Crew member. They meet with the Counselor once a month to discuss relevant issues on campus and ways to instill and enhance kindness throughout the school. They also come up with the weekly Character Challenges based on their experiences. You may see them giving out high fives and greeting students on Monday mornings, as they hope to get other students excited about the school day.

We also have Kindness Scouts in Kinder-2nd Grade. These students are on the lookout for kind acts happening around the school. Each week, the Kindness Scout reports kindness they have seen to their class, as well as nominates someone from their class for extraordinary kindness!
