**FYI:** Did you know that your children have access to a program that will help them achieve success in math? DreamBox is a program purchased by Katy ISD for all students. It is <u>designed to create a deep learning experience</u> that motivates students to progress and achieve success, providing just the right amount of support when they need it. Parents naturally want to help a child who is struggling with a challenging lesson. <u>Here's why you should resist the instinct to intervene</u>. Instead, help maximize your child's learning experience with DreamBox by encouraging him or her to:

- Try every problem: Persist, even when it's hard.
- **Finish every lesson**: Persevere instead of choosing another lesson.
- Click the Help and Hint buttons, as needed: Assistance is always just a click away.
- Use your headphones with the volume on: Listen to the directions and feedback.
- Work Independently: Don't let others do your work for you.

DreamBox is available through MyKaty Cloud, and students have been working in the program at school since September. In order for students to show optimum growth in math, they should complete at least 5 lessons per week and 90 lessons total by the beginning of February. Encourage them to access the program at home during the break to keep their math skills fresh!

Announcement: Texas Senate Bill 725 and Texas House Bill 367, named the Fairness in Feeding Act, allows for schools to create Sharing Tables within the cafeteria in order to rescue and redistribute food for students who may be hungry at breakfast or lunch. Bryant Elementary will begin Sharing Tables in grades 2-5 in the Second Semester when we return from Winter Break. Please click here for a flyer about Sharing Tables. Please note, teachers nor volunteers monitor what students are donating or choosing from the Sharing Table. Students will raise their hand with a symbol to indicate they want to go to the Sharing Table and teachers/volunteers will allow them to go. It is important for students with food allergies to know what they can and cannot eat. Students with allergies can always ask a teacher if they feel an item from the Sharing Table would be good for them to eat. If you have a student with allergies and are concerned, you may want to let your child know they should never choose anything from the Sharing Table. Food allergies and maturity is the basis for our decision to only allow Sharing Tables in grades 2-5. Again, please click here for all information regarding Sharing Tables. All rules and classifications of what can be left on a Sharing Table are described in the flyer. A table will be designated for sealed items and fruit with inedible peels. A small refrigerator will be available for milk rescue and redistribution.

# Home to School Connection



## **Frosty science**

With this experiment, your child can see frost and learn why people sprinkle salt on icy sidewalks and roads.

How? Have your youngster rinse out two empty soup cans, remove the labels, and fill each can halfway with ice. She should stir \(\frac{1}{4}\) cup salt into just one can and set both cans aside.

**What happens?** After 10 minutes, she'll notice frost on the "salty can" and water on the other one.

Why? Salt lowers the melting point of the ice, so the can with salt got colder than the other can. When water in the air condensed onto the cans, it froze into frost on the one with salt. That's why salt is useful in winter—it melts snow and ice, making it safer to walk or drive.♥
