Kindness Crew: Did you know that Bryant Elementary has a Kindness Crew? This group of third, fourth, and fifth graders are selected by their peers and teacher to represent their classroom as a Kindness Crew member. They meet with the Counselor once a month to discuss relevant issues on campus and ways to instill and enhance kindness throughout the school. They also come up with the weekly Character Challenges based on their experiences. You may see them giving out high fives and greeting students on Monday mornings, as they hope to get other students excited about the school day.

Kindness Scouts: We also have Kindness Scouts for each classroom/homeroom in Kinder-2nd Grade. These students are on the lookout for kind acts happening around the school. Each week, the Kindness Scouts reports kindness they have seen around the school to their class. They also nominate someone from their class for extraordinary kindness! Kindness and care are an important part of our school culture.

From Coach Gregorski, Coach DeLeon & Mrs. Howell, BES(t) PE Team:

As the weather gets cooler, we see more students wearing boots, which is perfectly fine. Please make sure tennis shoes are in your child's backpack so they can participate in PE class.

The first nine weeks in PE we focused on rules, procedures, expectations and safety. We also worked on throwing and catching. We are now moving on to cooperative games, scooter games, striking and basketball skill

From Our English Language Arts Coach:

In the 2019-2020 school year, the State of Texas adopted new Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for English Language Arts instruction. Katy ISD also adopted new instructional materials to support the teaching of the new objectives. Therefore, many of the materials and practice items for spelling at home may look different. Word Study is a conceptual way of thinking about how to read, understand, and spell words. Word Study has three components: phonics, spelling, and vocabulary. In Katy ISD and here at Bryant Elementary, kindergarten through second grade will focus on the phonics component of Word Study. The goal of phonics instruction is to support kid's progress as readers and writers. Students will be taught principles of phonics through singing, pretending, inventing, talking, writing, and spelling. Students will receive snap words, formally known as sight words. Students will be expected to read and spell the snap words correctly. Working with snap words at home is an excellent way to support your child's reading, writing, and spelling.

In third through fifth grade, the focus of instruction is on spelling and vocabulary. Word Study includes learning to correctly spell words. It requires students to think more deeply about words and how they are put together and not just memorizing words in isolation. Students will learn the rules of spelling and how to apply those rules as part of Word Study. Students will receive word sorts each week as home practice. Students need to be able to read, sort using the spelling patterns, and utilize the identified spelling pattern to correctly spell additional words. In addition, students also need to be able to understand the meaning of the words and use them correctly in sentences. Click here for a document that shows several ways to support the practice of words at home. In addition, the following are ways you can help your student study:

Sort the words into categories. Ask your child how he/she sorted the words at school. Remind your child to read each word aloud during this activity. Ask your child to explain why the words are sorted in a certain way--what does the sort reveal about spelling in general? Have your child sort again but faster. You can even time your child to add an extra challenge.

Do a blind sort with your child. Lay down a word from each category as a header and then read the rest of the words aloud. Your child must indicate where the word goes without seeing the word. Lay it down and let your child move it if he or she is wrong. Repeat if your child makes more than one error.

Assist your child in participating in a word hunt, looking in a book he/she has already read for words that have the same sound, pattern, or both. Try to find two or three words for each category.

Do a writing sort to practice writing the words. As you call out the words in random order, your child should write them in the correct categories. Call out any words your child misspells.
