Special Recognition: Bryant Elementary has once again earned the distinction of being a *No Place for Hate* School!! Our kids, staff, and our Counselor, Mrs. Flores, worked very hard and completed many lessons and activities to earn this distinction. As a collaborative effort, students helped create the "Tree of Respect" that highlighted a multitude of ways in which we can show respect towards one another at school, home, and in the community. In addition, we created a school-wide mural that emphasized the importance of being accepting of one another despite differences we may have and being inclusive of one another. Finally, we completed a project called "Empathy Shoes" in which students learned the meaning behind empathy and discovered authentic ways of practicing and showing empathy. We focused on reasons empathy is often hard to practice--because one person does not truly understand or know the other person to be able to empathize with what they are going through. So, every student created an empathy shoe that represented what a walk in their life was like. These shoes were displayed in the school as a reminder of the importance of accepting others, being respectful, and having empathy towards others. This summer, Mrs. Flores will be thinking of new and exciting projects for next year!!
