Dr. Rhodes' Weekly Message

I hope everyone has had a great week so far. Our 4th and 5th grade students worked hard the past two days completing their STAAR tests. Just a reminder, the remainder of this week we continue to have a "closed campus" as we have students making up tests Thursday and Friday.

Dress Code: As the temperatures rise, students are breaking out the shorts. We have noticed students (mostly grades 3-5) wearing inappropriate clothing to school, especially shorts that are too short. The district dress code (click here to read) states "acceptable shorts are no shorter than mid-thigh for all grades." If a student is dressed inappropriately, the student's teacher will call to let you know. This call will be notification that the item/items like it should not be worn to school. At the elementary level, repeated dress code violations are a level two offense which will require an office referral. We will begin monitoring dress code more closely beginning Monday. 

Learning to be patient

Patience is a skill that can be learned. Kids who develop it tend to have greater self-control and even do better in school. Foster patience in your youngster with these tips.

Live in the moment. Encourage your child to enjoy what's going on right now, rather

than looking forward to what will happen next. For example, she could look out the window at the sunset while she waits for you to get off the phone. Or if she's having trouble falling



asleep because she can't wait to visit her friend tomorrow, she might focus on how warm and cozy she feels in her bed now.

Enjoy the payoff. Have your youngster think of something that took her a while to master, such as learning to read music. Then, remind her of how good she felt when she succeeded. Share an example from your life, too. *Idea*:

Let her take on an activity or a project that requires patience, like growing a plant or putting together a jigsaw puzzle.♥
