
What are your post-high school plans?

Dear Juniors, Seniors, and Parents:

We are excited to announce our 2020 Prom. We hope that this prom will be an occasion of happy memories for you. The prom will be held on March 20, 2020 from 7 p.m. – 10:00 p.m. at Marina Grande Dunes.

The restaurant will serve heavy appetizers, ice cream bar, and tea/lemonade/water. The following are reminders of opportunities and rules for this event.

A junior or senior must meet the eligibility requirements stated below in order to purchase their ticket(s), and the purchaser must be able to provide proof of eligibility for their guest; all attendees will be verified. Any tickets purchased under fraudulent terms or conditions can and will be revoked at any time, with NO REFUND.

Tickets will be available: Now through March 13th

Up to February 14 - \$60.00 February 17 – February 21 - \$65 February 24 – February 28 - \$70 March 2 – March 6 - \$75 March 9 – March 13 - \$80

No Sales after March 13th

Sales Locations: Monday – Friday - 8:30-4:30 in Mrs. Debbie McAdoo's office or online at the Mypaymentsplus. No tickets will be sold at the door on the night of the event.

Eligibility Requirements:

- ALL School Fees MUST be paid to be eligible to purchase a prom ticket. This includes: café, textbooks, calculators, library fees, athletics fees, HGTC fees, etc.
- You must submit the name of your guest and a copy of a driver's license or state issued id when you turn in your permission form.
- You MUST attend school until 11:30 a.m. on March 20th. If you plan to leave school early, the attached early dismissal form must be signed and returned when you purchase your ticket.
- Signed permission slips are due prior to purchasing a ticket.
- All guests must not be more than 20 years of age and no younger than 9th grade.
- The ticket purchaser is responsible for their guest and all behavior thereof. Any misbehavior will result in the student and guest having to leave the event.
- Guests must be in good standing with the public school system. Students who
 have been expelled, attending Alternative School, etc. are not eligible to attend.
- January Completers are ineligible to purchase a Prom ticket; however, they may attend as a guest.
- Homebound and Home-based students are not able to attend prom in any capacity.
- You must arrive and sign-in with your guest. The guest you bring to the prom MUST match the name who is listed on permission form.
- Tickets are not transferrable.
- If you leave the Prom, you may not re-enter, and you and your guest must leave.
- No Refunds for any payments will be given.
- Non-ticket holders (such as parent, guardian or family member) will not be admitted to the Prom.
- Students need to be dropped off no earlier than 6:30 pm and picked up no later than 10:00pm.

Prom Dress Code

The Prom is traditionally an opportunity for students to dress in formal attire. Young men typically dress in suits with ties or tuxedos. Young women typically wear formal dresses or evening gowns. At the ECHS Prom, students are allowed some creative freedom to express their personal style in their attire; however, there are a few basic attire guidelines to which all ticket holders must adhere in order to attend the event.

- The length of skirts or dresses should provide appropriate modesty when dancing.
- Female dress/top bodices should appropriately cover the chest area.
- Male students should wear dress slacks and dress shirts with sleeves, with or without ties and jackets. Dress or casual shoes are allowed.
- Shorts should NOT be worn.
- Jeans should NOT be worn.
- Athletic attire should NOT be worn.
- HCSD guidelines prohibiting clothing with profanity, referencing or depicting alcohol, tobacco or weapons, will apply to Prom attire.
- Any student who has a concern about arranging appropriate attire to adhere
 to these dress code guidelines should speak with the ECHS school
 administration prior to the week of the Prom. No dress code conversations
 will be held at the door.
- Students will be required to acknowledge their understanding of the Prom
 attire guidelines before purchasing their ticket(s). <u>Students and guests</u> who
 arrive in attire not in compliance with the guidelines WILL NOT be
 admitted into the ECHS Prom and the ticket price <u>will not</u> be refunded.

- Seniors may pick up tickets on Thursday, March 19th during the day from the front office.
- Juniors may pick up tickets on Friday, March 20th after 11:30 am from the main office.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance – General Statement on Horry County Schools Policy

The South Carolina Attendance laws and policies are in the Horry County Schools Parent Student Handbook. ECHS will use the following procedures and policies to process student attendance. SC Truancy Law is defined in the handbook, as well.

High School Class Absences - Students will be allowed five (5) unexcused absences in a semester class, which meets every day to receive credit for the course. The Truancy Law states: A child who has accumulated three (3) consecutive unlawful absences or a total of five (5) unlawful absences is a school year is considered Truant.

Lawful absence - Lawful absences do not count against the student's total number of allowed absences and they include:

- a) Illness or medical appointment; documentation must be provided upon return
- Administrative or guidance reasons
- d) School sponsored trips or activities
- Extenuating circumstances approved by the principal
- District Approved Religious holiday

*On the morning of the student's return to school following an absence (excused or unexcused), a written excuse must be turned into the school secretary, in the main office. Students are cautioned that notes and excuses will be verified by the office, and forgeries will be dealt with as an administrative disciplinary matter.

Exceeding 5 absences - You WILL have to repeat the course, attend afterschool make-up or attend Summer School. SC attendance policy state, "Students who have absences in excess of those allowed by law and policy will be denied credit regardless of their grade."

ECHS tardy policy - Students who are tardy to school should report to the main office.

- 1st Tardy Warning;
- 2nd Tardy Students will be required to take the tardy policy home and have it signed by a parent/guardian
- 3rd Tardy 2nd Warning
- 4th Tardy Letter to parent
- 5th Tardy Administrative Detention 30 minutes
- 6th Tardy Administrative Detention 1 hour
- 7th Tardy Administrative Detention 2 hours

Sign out early - Prior to the start of the school day, a note signed by a parent/guardian that includes the following information should be submitted to the school secretary: student's name, date/time, phone number where parent can be reached to verify request, reason for early dismissal, and parent/guardian signature. If a student wishes to leave early without a note or without a parent/guardian physically present, permission must be verified by the school secretary before the student can leave. Arrangements will be made to dismiss the student at the appropriate time. If parents come to sign students out, we request that they do so during the change of classes so as not to interrupt instruction. The early dismissal does count as an absence unless it is for an excused reason as listed above. If a student misses a college class, the professor will count it as an absence regardless of the cause.

School Tardy due to Late Bus - All students who arrive on a school bus after the 7:55 class start time will be issued a late bus pass from the main office. It is the student's responsibility to obtain this pass and present it to the classroom teacher. The only excused tardy is for bus riders on a late bus or students with a medical or legal note.

Excused pass - Students that arrive to school with a medical or legal note should report to the office upon arrival for an excused tardy pass.

Do traffic and/or car problems count as an excused tardy? No, traffic and mechanical issues are not excused reasons for tardiness. Be aware that some college courses will count excessive tardies as a full absence regardless of reason. Check your syllabus and plan accordingly.

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DRESS CODE

Our dress code has been developed to help students prepare for the world of work/college. The dress code has been developed with modesty and appropriateness in mind. According to the Horry County School District Policy, student dress must conform to the following regulations:

- Attire must comply with requirements for health and safety. (This prohibits the wearing of chains and studded clothing or accessories.)
- Hats/Headwear, sunglasses, headphones/earplugs, sweatbands, combs/picks, hoodies, headscarves, bandanas, headgear, head coverings, and sunglasses are prohibited inside school buildings.
- 3. The possession of all bandanas is prohibited at ECHS.
- 4. Shoes must be worn at all times. No bedroom shoes/slippers are allowed at any time.
- 5. Pants & shirt must overlap at all times. Clothing should be worn so that undergarments are not visible.
- 6. Attire must not display any sexual behavior, sexual innuendos, or ethnic derogatories.
- Items such as spiked jewelry (including body piercings), padlocks, chains, and metal heel plates are not allowed.
- 8. No vulgar, obscene or otherwise inappropriate symbols, language, pictures, or wording will be permitted on clothing or accessories. Clothing or accessories (ex. Bookbags, jewelry, hats, etc) that display weapons, alcohol, tobacco, or other drug symbols are not permitted. Clothing must not display any information about, representations of, or advertisements for alcoholic beverage(s), tobacco, controlled drugs, illegal drugs, or paraphernalia associated with the foregoing. Clothing which is controversial or disruptive is not allowed.
- 9. Attire must not be immodest, obscene, profane, lewd, vulgar, indecent, or offensive.
 - a. Shorts, skirts, and dresses, even with leggings, jeggings, etc. must be longer than the student's fingertips when in a relaxed standing position. Slits/holes in clothing must also be no shorter than the student's fingertips when extended in the relaxed position.
 - b. See-through clothing, bare midriff tops, backless blouses, shirts/tops with low necklines, halter-tops, spaghetti-strap tops, muscle shirts, and tank tops are prohibited. All shirts must cover the undergarments. It is never appropriate to show undergarments.
 - c. Gym shorts, cutoffs, bathing suits and short shorts are not appropriate at school.
 - d. Appropriate undergarments should be worn and should be covered by outer clothing.
 - e. No pajamas or pajama bottoms/pants are allowed.

Consequences of breaking the dress code:

1st Offense: Student will be asked to come to the office and requested to change the inappropriate clothing, reverse the offending garment, or call parents. The student will not be allowed to return to class until the situation is corrected.

2nd **Offense**: Student will have to correct the dress code violation, parents will be notified, and the student will be assigned to afterschool administration detention. Additional discipline action will include, but not be limited to OSS and parent conference.

You must follow the instructions of the teacher or administrator regarding your dress. If you fail to do so, you will be written up for insubordination, which makes the issue worse. If you feel that your dress was unfairly criticized you may appeal to the principal.

^{*} The ECH community asks that students follow the spirit of the policy and not just the letter of the restrictions. Questionable clothing will be handled on a case-by-case basis at the discretion of the administration and teachers.



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ELECTRONIC DEVICES - CELL PHONES*

Cell phone use at school - Students may use cell phones and other electronic devices before 7:55, after 2:25, and during the student's lunch period. Cell phones and other electronic devices are to be turned off and and put away before entering the classroom.

Headphones and ear buds are not to be worn on the head, neck, or be visible during the times of 7:55 a.m. until 2:25 p.m.

The following consequences are in place for a violation:

1st offense: The phone will be confiscated, discipline infraction entered into PowerSchool, and a letter mailed to the parent.

2nd offense: The phone will be confiscated, discipline infraction entered into PowerSchool. The student's parent or guardian must come to the school to retrieve the device.

3rd offense: The phone will be confiscated, discipline infraction entered into PowerSchool. The student's parent or guardian must come to the school to retrieve the device and the student loses cell phone privileges at any time while on school grounds. ECH is not responsible for the loss, damage, or theft of any personal technology devices students choose to bring to school.

ECH students who violate this policy while in a college classroom will be dealt with at the discretion of the college instructor and HGTC policy.

- The unauthorized use of cell phones and other electronic devices to communicate or access information during classes or testing is prohibited.
- The use of cell phones and other electronic devices in locker rooms or restrooms is prohibited.
- The use of audio or video recording capacity of any cell phone and other electronic devices is prohibited in locker rooms, restrooms, or during regular school hours without prior permission from the building administration.

Note: Refusal to obey any staff member who asks for a cell phone/ electronic device will result in an additional disciplinary infraction including an assignment of another day of OSS.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES - MUSIC

When can I listen to my Electronic device? These devices may be used before school, during lunch, and after school. Students may not use them in the hallways between classes. This includes any type of ear buds or headphones.

* ECHS administration recommends that no items of value be brought to school. If any items are lost or stolen, the school will not be responsible for them.
