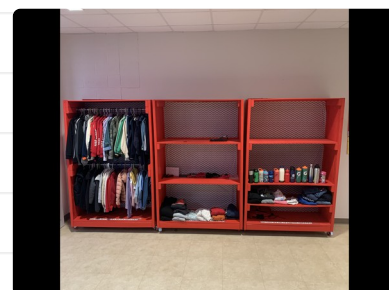

ATTENDANCE

As a reminder, we are required to document student absences, whether Excused (ex: illness related) or Unexcused (ex: vacation). Regardless of how a child performs, once enrolled in a public school, students are required to attend 90% of the year.



Once a child receives 18 missed days, whether Excused or Unexcused, at the end of the year a committee will convene to determine Promotion (Promoted or Retained) status. A child's report card will indicate all missed days. The school must show that it was aware, communicated with families, and determined that Promotion is warranted, despite the missed instructional days.

PARENT DRIVE PROTOCOL

In an effort to expedite the process of morning drop-off, we ask that all students and families are prepared once the door is opened.

Preparedness includes:

- * Shoes on students
- * Food consumption ceased
- * Backpack next to student in car and not in the trunk where safety is compromised with a parent needing to open the trunk to retrieve it
- * Conversations concluded so child is focused on exiting the car

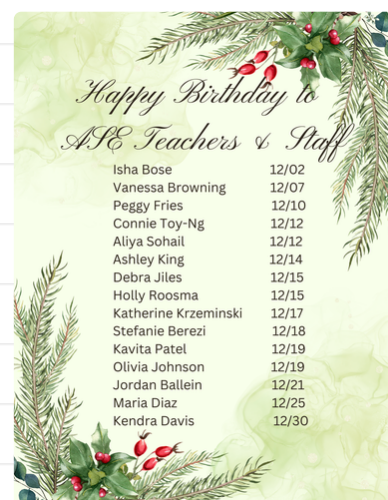

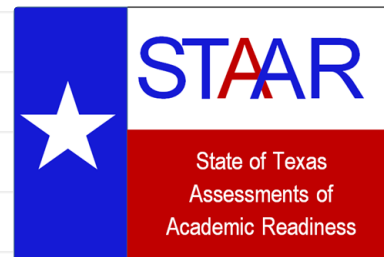

At school, positivity shows up through teamwork, encouraging others, and trying again even when something is hard. These small actions create a classroom environment where students feel supported, safe, and confident.

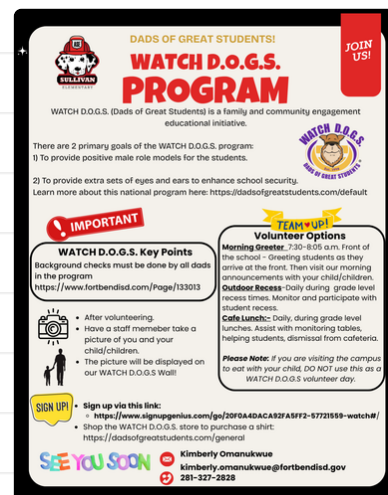


WATCH D.O.G.S.

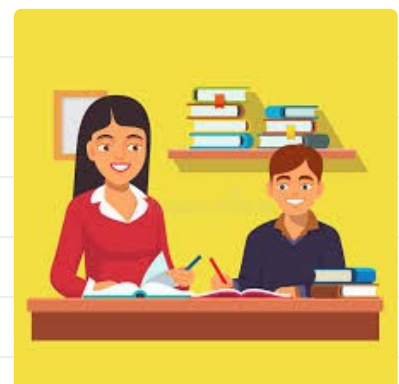

RAINY DAY DISMISSAL

Rainy Day dismissal pertains only to those families whose children walk or ride a bike to school each day. Each parent of a child who walks or rides a bike is required to notify the homeroom teacher of a Rainy Day alternative plan.

At 2:45 p.m. a Blackboard Connect notice will be sent to parents informing the community of a RainyDay Dismissal. Walkers/bikers will either become a car rider or remain a walker. If your child

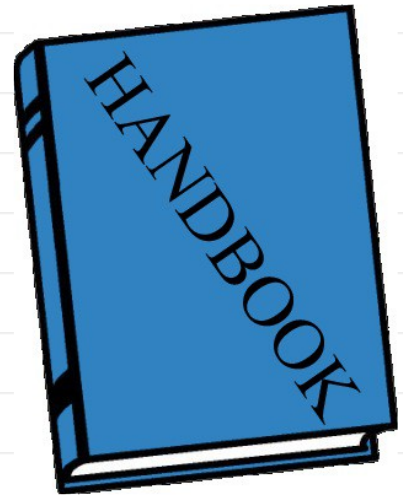


remains a walker, he/she will meet you at the normal pick-up location. Parents are not permitted to come to the building doors or encroach on the campus sidewalks to get their children in the rain. This can lead to an unsafe dismissal.

All other students going home on buses, in cars, or daycare vans will not have a change in dismissal.
