What is the PSAT/NMSQT?

- The PSAT/NMSQT is highly relevant to your future success because it focuses on the skills and knowledge at the heart of your education.
It measures:
 - What you learn in high school
 - What you need to succeed in college
- The PSAT/NMSQT measures reading, writing, and math skills developed over many years.
- The PSAT/NMSQT does not ask for facts from literature, history, or science, or for recall of math formulas, because it measures your reasoning and critical thinking skills.

What is the PSAT/NMSQT?

Scores for the SAT[®] Suite of Assessments (SAT, PSAT/NMSQT[®], PSAT[™] 10, and PSAT[™] 8/9) are reported on a common vertical scale, allowing **educators to measure students' progress**

- Propels students toward **college** and **career readiness**
- Is cosponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation
- Serves as an entry point to over \$240 million in **scholarship dollars**



Who Should Take The PSAT/NMSQT?

- 10th graders who have taken Geometry are encouraged to take this test
- All 11th graders **should** take this test.
- 3.8+ million students take the PSAT/NMSQT each year to get feedback on their skills and practice for the SAT.



What to know about the PSAT/NMSQT

- Test length: **2 hours 14 minutes**
- The PSAT/NMSQT is a digital exam!
- The test is easier to take, shorter, has more time per question, and comes with a built-in calculator (**need to bring Chromebook**)
- Personalized SAT practice through Khan Academy[®] with students' own PSAT/NMSQT scores
- To prepare, full-length adaptive digital PSAT/NMSQT practice is available on the Bluebook[™] app.
- Scale ranges for the scores are 320 – 1520 for the total score

Reading and Writing Test

The Reading and Writing section includes **54 questions** evenly divided between **2 modules**. You have **32 minutes** to answer the questions in each module (**64 minutes total**)

The Reading and Writing section of the digital PSAT/NMSQT is designed to measure your success with building critical college and career readiness in literacy.

- Passages in this section represent the subject areas of literature, history/social studies, the humanities, and science.
- There is a single question per passage.
- Select questions in this section are accompanied by an informational graphic.

In this section, you'll answer multiple-choice questions requiring you to:

- Read, comprehend, and use information and ideas in texts
- Analyze the craft and structure of texts
- Revise texts to improve the rhetorical expression of ideas
- Edit texts to follow core conventions of Standard English

Reading and Writing Test

The questions in the Reading and Writing section fall into four broad categories:

- **Craft and Structure** - measure the comprehension, vocabulary, analysis, synthesis, and reasoning skills and knowledge
- **Information and Ideas** - measure comprehension, analysis, and reasoning skills and knowledge and the ability to locate, interpret, evaluate, and integrate information
- **Standard English Conventions** - measure the ability to edit text to conform to core conventions of Standard English sentence structure, usage, and punctuation
- **Expression of Ideas** - measure the ability to revise texts to improve the effectiveness of written expression and to meet specific rhetorical goals

Math Test

The Math section includes **44 questions** evenly divided between **2 modules**. You have **35 minutes** to answer the questions in each module (**70 minutes total**).

The Math section of the digital PSAT/NMSQT is designed to measure your success with building critical college and career readiness knowledge and skills in math.

In this section, you'll answer multiple-choice questions and student-produced response questions that measure your fluency with, understanding of, and ability to apply the math concepts, skills, and practices that are most essential.

- Approximately 30% of Math questions are set in context. These in-context "word" questions require you to consider a science, social studies, or real-world scenario and apply your math skills and knowledge, along with an understanding of the context, to determine the answer to each.
- Select questions in this section are accompanied by an informational graphic.

Math Test

Questions in the Math section fall into four content domains:

- **Algebra** - measure the ability to analyze, fluently solve, and create linear equations and inequalities as well as analyze and fluently solve equations and systems of equations using multiple techniques
- **Advanced Math** - measure skills and knowledge central for progression to more advanced math courses, including demonstrating an understanding of absolute value, quadratic, exponential, polynomial, rational, radical, and other nonlinear equations
- **Problem-Solving and Data Analysis** - measure the ability to apply quantitative reasoning about ratios, rates, and proportional relationships; understand and apply unit rate; and analyze and interpret 1- and 2-variable data
- **Geometry and Trigonometry** - measure the ability to solve problems that focus on area and volume; angles, triangles, and trigonometry; and circles

Know How the PSAT/NMSQT is Scored

Total Score

- Your total score is a number between 320 and 1520.

The total score is the sum of the two section scores: Reading and Writing and Math:

- Each of these 2 section scores is in the range of 160–760.
- Both sections contribute equally to the total score.

How the Section Scores Are Calculated

- All test questions are first scored as correct or incorrect. The difficulty level and other qualities of each question (such as how well it differentiates skill level or how easy it is to guess on a question), as well as whether you got the question right or wrong, are considered when calculating your raw score. Every test conforms to a standardized specification of question types and qualities, so all students have an equitable opportunity to demonstrate their strengths.




