NEW SCHOOL YEAR

We have had another great start to the school year this year. Our enrollment is up, close to 1100 students, which is a pretty good increase from where we have been in the past few years.

We have started a couple of new initiatives this school year and they are going well so far. The first is the use of YONDR pouches for cell phones in classrooms. The expectation is that any student that has a cell phone puts that cell phone in a YONDR pouch as they enter the classroom. If a student does not place a cell phone in a pouch and later has one out at any point during the class period that student has violated the cell phone policy and one of the administrators will come and get the students phone from them. This has gone really well to start the year, teachers are reporting that students are much more attentive and that they have to plan more in their lesson because they are covering more material than they use to. Students are also having more in class discussions about topics which is enhancing their learning.

The other new initiative that we have started this year is 5-STAR students. This replaces our old positive incentive point system where we used Charger Bucks for students to purchase. This electronic system allows teachers and administrators to awards points to students for various things including being on time to class, being involved in school, and attending school events. Students can put the 5-STAR Student App on their phone or access it through their Chromebook to track the points they have earned. They can then spend their points throughout the year on various things including free admittance to home games at Topeka West. Students access the app by using their student ID and last name.

SEXTING

There is school discipline for sexting and also possibly criminal charges for students who possess or distribute images that are considered child pornography (Sexting). What is Sexting?

Sexting is the practice of sending or posting sexually suggestive text messages and images, including nude or semi-nude photographs via cellular phones or over the internet. According to a report on Teens and Sexting, issued on pewinternet.org, sexting by teens occurs most often in one of three scenarios;

.Pictures are exchanged by romantic partners;

- .Pictures exchanged by romantic partners are shared outside the relationship; or
- .Pictures are exchanged by people not yet in a relationship, but where one of the individuals hopes to start a relationship with the other.

Students who possess the images could be prosecuted for possessing or distributing child pornography and may be required to register as sex offenders. Sexting may also have tragic consequences. Often sexting begins as a photo intended for one person, but when the relationship goes awry the photo is widely disseminated.

If students do not submit a senior photo, or the photo submitted does not meet the requirements outlined below, the Lifetouch photo will be used. The Topeka West yearbook is a publication that reflects the school, the student body, and the community; therefore the following specifications are required in order for submitted photos to be included in the senior portrait pages.

Senior Photo Specifications:

*Only VERTICAL-not horizontal-images will be accepted.

*Only head and shoulders should appear in the photo. No props, hats, hoods, pets, etc.

*Attire worn in the photo must adhere to school dress code.

*No "selfies" or photos deemed inappropriate for a professional publication will be accepted.

*Photos must be submitted electronically through email or media on a disc or jump drive.

*An indoor photo with a solid color background is <u>suggested</u>. *Do not cut the head/hairline at the top of the photo. Leave enough space around the subject in order for some cropping to occur. *Head size from the top of the hair to the bottom of the chin in the photo should be a minimum of 1"and a maximum of 1.25". *The photo itself should be a maximum width of 2.25" and a maximum height of 3".

All claims will be filed with your insurance. If uninsured, you must qualify for the free/reduced lunch program and an upfront cost of \$60 per filling/extraction will apply on day of service.
