Class Lists

Later this Spring we will begin working on class lists and teacher assignments. We anticipate four sections each in all grade levels except for six sections in second grade and five sections in fourth grade. It is also likely we'll have 5 sections in 1st grade as well. If you know of anyone who hasn't yet registered for any grade level it is helpful to remind them we need to have that information sooner rather than later for staffing and planning. Staffing decisions have not yet been finalized so teachers may be changing grade levels.

The staff and principal build the class lists together, in a series of meetings, considering each student's achievement level, motivation level, special program needs, strengths/talents, and learning style. Our goal is a balanced classroom that will enable a teacher to meet the needs of all the students in the classroom. If you wish to provide input to the process with your perspective of a child's learning preferences and learning style, or previous school experiences a letter or email to Mrs. Kirchgessner must be submitted no later than March 29th. Input that requests specific teachers is not accepted and input based on a teacher's reputation, or other parents' opinions will not be considered since each child's learning profile and school adjustment is unique.

If you choose to provide input, send your letter to the office before

March 29th. Your input will be taken into consideration when the final decision is made; however, it is not possible to honor specific input.
