






COUNSELOR CORNER

This month in counseling, our students have been learning about *fairness* and *justice*—important character traits that help us build a caring and respectful school community. As we approach the holiday season, we're also reflecting on *gratitude* and the importance of being thankful for what we have and the people who make a difference in our lives.

November 3-7th

We've been learning that fairness doesn't always mean everyone gets the same thing—it means everyone gets what they *need* to do their best. At home, try talking about what fairness looks like in your family or play a "fair or unfair?" game with real-life examples. Modeling patience, sharing, and listening to each other's feelings helps children understand what fairness looks like in action.



Rainy Day Dismissal

Rainy Day dismissal pertains only to those families whose children walk or ride a bike to school each day. Each parent of a child who walks or rides a bike is required to notify the homeroom teacher of a Rainy Day alternative plan.




At 2:45 p.m. a Blackboard Connect notice will be sent to parents informing the community of a Rainy Day Dismissal. Walkers/bikers will either become a car rider or remain a walker. If your child remains a walker, he/she will meet you at the normal pick-up location. Parents are not permitted to come to the building doors or encroach on the campus sidewalks to get their children in the rain. This can lead to an unsafe dismissal.

All other students going home on buses, in cars, or daycare vans will not have a change in dismissal.
