Pharmaceuticals. Fairbanks has worked as an adviser to President Paul Kagame of Rwanda, the President of the Inter-American Development Bank and the Minister of Finance of Afghanistan. He was an adjunct professor at Georgetown University and the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts, and a visiting fellow at Stanford. He studied philosophy and biochemistry at the University of Scranton and African politics at Columbia University.

Soren was born in Odense, Denmark. In his youth he was an avid soccer player who played on elite club teams, select regional teams, youth national teams, and was a semi-professional until the age of twenty-five. In his late teens he fell in love with science and the wonders of space. This led to a master's degree in physics and astronomy from the University of Copenhagen in 1999, a PhD in astrophysics from the University of Wisconsin – Madison in 2005, followed by a 14-year research career at the Harvard-Smithsonian Center for Astrophysics in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Art was a constant presence in Soren's home and childhood as his father was an artist father. He drew, printed, sculpted, and painted from an early age thus developing a deep and lasting passion for visual art. Despite the demands on his time he managed to stay productive and kept alive his passion for art. He is now a full-time artist.

Rawan AlHeresh, MScOT, OTR/L, PhD, earned a number of degrees worldwide including a Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy from University of Jordan, Amman, and a Master of Science in Occupational Therapy from Brunel University, West London. In 2011, Dr. AlHeresh moved to the United States to complete her PhD in Rehabilitation Sciences from Boston University in 2015. Dr. AlHeresh completed a two position-postdoctoral fellowship through the Health and Disability Research Institute at Boston University's School of Public Health, and as a visiting scientist at the Tufts University's occupational therapy department where she received training on modern methods of assessments of rehabilitation outcomes. Dr. AlHeresh is an expert in cross-cultural validation of Patient-Reported Outcomes, especially measuring function and participation among children and mental health globally. Dr. AlHeresh is the founder and Director of the "Toward an All-Inclusive Jordan" Initiative, an academic-community partnership model serving as a platform for education, clinical training, and advocacy for the rights of people with disabilities using Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) in the Middle-East.

He is a member of the Boston College class of '86 and the Woburn High School class of '82.

Tram Nguyen is the State Representative for the 18th Essex District, which includes parts of Andover, Boxford, North Andover, and Tewksbury. She is a first generation Vietnamese-American immigrant and was the first person in her family to graduate from college and law school. She earned a Bachelor's Degree from Tufts University and a Juris Doctor from Northeastern University School of Law. From the start of her legal career until she took office, Nguyen worked at Greater Boston Legal Services as a legal aid attorney and advocated for domestic violence survivors, workers, seniors, veterans, and children. She also engaged in legislative advocacy and worked with statewide coalitions, lawmakers, and lawmaking bodies to push for laws that address issues of racial and economic justice and protect the rights of the most vulnerable populations. Nguyen was first elected into office in November 2018 and is the first Vietnamese American woman in elected office in the Commonwealth, the first Vietnamese American elected to the Massachusetts House of Representatives, the first Asian American on the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts Caucus of Women Legislators, and the first Asian American woman to serve as vice chair of a committee.
