

Immunization Requirements for the 2019 - 2020 School Year

K.A.R. 28 1-20 defines immunizations required for any individual who attends school or a childcare program operated by a school. Below are the requirements for the indicated school year. Please carefully review the requirements. The usual number of closes required are listed; however there are exceptional circumstances that could after the number of doses a child heads. If you have questions about your child's immunization status, centact your child's primary care provider or local health department.
