SOCIAL HOSTING

Social hosting or unlawfully hosting is generally defined as providing and/or serving alcohol to a young person who is under the minimum legal drinking age. It can take place in a party-like atmosphere or by any adult simply providing alcohol to young people and their peers for them to drink. It can even extend to parents and homeowners who are not on the premises and/or did not provide the alcohol.

Social host liability refers to laws that hold non-commercial individuals responsible for underage drinking events on property that they own, lease or otherwise control.

You may not need to actually serve or provide alcohol to underage guests to violate these laws.

The penalties for breaking this law include possible jail time, and the potential for criminal or civil lawsuits, as well as public humiliation for breaking the law.

By violating the law, you are sending every child you know a message that can have risky consequences.

What parents can do to stop UNDERAGE DRINKING...

Talk with your teen and let him or her know your expectations. Teens need clear behavior guidelines and boundaries.

> Ask questions about your teen's daily life. Listen to his or her opinions and concerns.

Talk with your teen. Get to know your teen's friends and who their parents are. Always know what your teen is doing and who he or she is with.

Have your teen check in with you regularly from a landline phone, not a cell phone. If they are at a friend's house or attending a party, call or stop by to check on them.

Tell your teen that even if he or she is some place where adults are drinking, they are NOT to drink under any circumstances.

> Spend time on a regular basis with your teen doing one-onone or family activities.

What is SOCIAL HOSTING?

Social Hosting is providing and/or serving alcohol to a young person who is under age 21. Hosting can take place in a party-like atmosphere or anytime someone provides alcohol to young people and their friends for the purpose of drinking. It can even extend to parents and homeowners who are not home, out-of-town, or unaware that underage drinking is taking place in their home.

What PARENTS should know

If you host a party for underage drinkers, you are sending a message to teens that it is okay to break the law. The question is, which laws do you decide can be broken? You may think you are doing teens a favor by allowing them to drink in a safe environment. The truth is there is no safe environment for underage drinking.

As a host, you can't predict the behavior of teens drinking in your home or the amount of alcohol consumed. If injuries, alcohol poisoning, or sexual assaults occur on your property, you can be held criminally liable.

THE PENALTIES

Unlawfully hosting minors who are consuming alcohol or cereal malt beverage is a Class A person misdemeanor and carries a minimum fine of \$1000.

PAUL'S STORY ...

In 2001, 17-year old Paul Riggs was killed while returning home from a party at a friend's house. The friend's parents had been home but did not monitor the party at which alcohol was served. Paul died after crashing into a tree---only blocks from his house---as he drove home that night.

His friend's parents told police that they didn't know alcohol was being served in their home. Later, police charged their daughter with furnishing alcohol to a minor. The parents and daughter could not be penalized because there was no law in place.

Kansas passed a Social Host Law, also known as "Paul's Law," that became effective July 1, 2004. In 2006, the Kansas Legislature strengthened the law by designating it a Class A person misdemeanor and increased the minimum fine from \$200 to \$1000.

Teens and their HEALTH

The brain goes through dynamic changes during adolescence. Studies have shown that judgment is the last area of the brain to develop. A person who begins drinking as a teen is four times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than someone who waits until adulthood to consume alcohol.

Teens who drink alcohol are more likely to become sexually active, placing them at greater risk of HIV infection and other sexually transmitted diseases. Short-term or moderate drinking impairs learning and memory in teens. Teens only need to drink half as much alcohol as adults to suffer the same negative effects. ¹

Promote RESPONSIBILITY

What happens in your home affects the community. Teens naturally want adult privileges. Our job as parents and guardians is to make them understand that alcohol is a drug and consuming it as a teen is harmful to their health and well-being. It is also illegal for the teens to consume it and for adults to provide it.

Parents and other adults need to remember that they are the greatest influence on the decisions teens make. Parents also bear the primary responsibility for their teen's misconduct.

Not In Our House is a nationwide initiative on underage drinking and social hosting. The Kansas Leadership to Keep Children Alcohol Free, a program of Kansas Family Partnership, Inc., has partnered on the campaign with the International Institute on Alcohol Awareness, The Century Council and Scholastic.



Topeka West High School Yearbook 2018-2019 Senior Portrait Requirements

It is not required to have a professional take the portrait that will appear in the senior section of the Topeka West yearbook. Lifetouch photos will be taken at school. All students are required to have their photo taken by Lifetouch. If students do not submit a senior photo, or the photo submitted does not meet the requirements outlined below, the Lifetouch photo will be used. The Topeka West yearbook is a publication that reflects the school, the student body, and the community; therefore the following specifications are required in order for submitted photos to be included in the senior portrait pages.

Senior Photo Specifications:

- *Only VERTICAL—not horizontal—images will be accepted.
- *Only head and shoulders should appear in the photo. No props, hats, hoods, pets, etc.
- *Attire worn in the photo must adhere to school dress code.
- *No "selfies" or photos deemed inappropriate for a professional publication will be accepted.
- *Photos must be submitted electronically through email or media on a disc or jump drive.
- *An indoor photo with a solid color background is <u>suggested</u>.
- *Do not cut the head/hairline at the top of the photo. Leave enough space around the subject in order for some cropping to occur.
- *Head size from the top of the hair to the bottom of the chin in the photo should be a minimum of 1"and a maximum of 1.25".
- *The photo itself should be a maximum width of 2.25" and a maximum height of 3".



The TWHS Yearbook reserves the right to refuse a photo not meeting these specifications. Lifetouch photos will be used in place of photos not meeting these requirements or no photograph at all if a Lifetouch photograph is unavailable.

Submission Process and Digital File Format:

- *300 DPI (minimum)
- *JPEG or JPG
- *Do NOT submit as Power Point, Word, Works, Photoshop, tiff, gif, or PDF
- *Submitting images that you have scanned lose quite a bit of quality, so we do not encourage this.

Please take this form to your photography session. It will help your photographer if he or she is submitting the photo on your behalf. You or your photographer may email your photo and student's name to Jennifer Miller, Yearbook Adviser, at jmiller3@tps501.org.



COUNSELOR'S CORNER

<u>SECOND SEMESTER ENROLLMENT FOR SENIORS</u>: Some seniors elect to enroll in a shortened schedule. To be eligible for honor roll, students must be enrolled in five "letter-graded" classes. "Classroom Assistant" is not a letter-graded class. A student must be enrolled in five classes to participate in competitive activities and be considered a full-time student.

<u>SECOND SEMESTER COURSES</u>: Students should be visiting with their counselor <u>now</u> to update their second semester schedule. <u>The last day to make schedule changes for second semester is Monday, December 17, 2018.</u>

<u>COLLEGE CLASSES</u>: It's not too late! On Thursday, January 17, 2019 at 5 p.m. in the Topeka West Media Center students can still sign up for concurrent credit courses on the Topeka West campus for second semester. 
