PBIS Information for Parents



(Positive Behavior Intervention System)



South Elementary and District 47 are excited to continue

using PBIS, whose mission is to create a school community where positive and proactive behavior creates a supportive and safe environment for everyone.

- PBIS focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students.
- It is for all students, all staff and in all settings.
- The success of PBIS depends on consistency and expectations, involvement, implementation and accountability.

The core values of PBIS builds upon the pillars of Character Counts and includes these three core values of PBIS:

- Be Respectful
- Be Responsible
- Be Safe

South Sabre Cash is used to award students. All adults in the building may award students with "cash" whenever they feel the student or class have exhibited exemplary behavior in the school setting. Students then are provided the opportunity at set times throughout the month to utilize their cash for prizes!

Children may also receive a referral form from any adult in the building for inappropriate behaviors. This referral will serve as a communication tool between the teachers, parents, and administration, so behaviors can be addressed in a timely manner. There are two types of referrals- a minor incident and a major incident. Minor incident referrals are handled in the classroom, and major referrals are handled by administration.

We view misbehavior as a teaching opportunity and assume our students are trying to make the best choices; the error was accidental or a skill deficit. We will teach, model, guide, and check in with students to work towards making better choices in the future. We also ask that parents work with their children at home to discuss and address inappropriate behaviors that occur at school.

The school Matrix below outlines the expected school behaviors and will serve as a guide for our students.

How can you help?

+ Talk with your child about the core values of being respectful, responsible, and safe.

+Review with your child how their day went.

+ Donate! We are offering a variety of incentives. Some prizes are

activities, such as lunch with the principal, extra recess time, or pajama day. Other rewards are small prizes. Donations should be labeled PBIS and sent in with your child or dropped off at the school office.
