Planning for 2019-20

The Old Bonhomme staff has begun discussions on master scheduling for next year. We currently have 24 classrooms and are using all 24 rooms this year. With transitioning four classes of current fourth graders to the Fifth Grade Center next year, we only have physical space for four incoming kindergarten classes at this time. Due to this, we are closely watching our current kindergarten and first grade enrollment. I want to share with you more information about how oversize classrooms might be addressed given our space issues.

The district class size policy for these grades is a maximum of 20 students per classroom. If we go over that number by one student before August 1, another teacher is hired if there is physical space and financial resources. If we go over after that date, or there is no physical space, teacher assistant support will be provided.

Currently in kindergarten, (future 1st grade) we are at 80 students, so we are currently, on paper, at 4 sections for next year. We need 81 to be at 5 sections in first grade for 2019-20, which I anticipate hitting in May/early June. Options have been discussed with Mrs. Stephanie Taggert (new Principal), Dr. Jim Wipke (new Superintendent), and Dr. Julie Helm (new Human Resources) in case we end up with oversize numbers in Kindergarten as well as First Grade next year.

There are no easy options, and some we don't control (a trailer) so we need to be creative. Typically Kindergarten doesn't go oversize to 5 sections until very near August 1 or after. August 1 is the district date for the decision to split, but since we don't have any physical space this may be an August decision for Mrs. Taggert to manage. If both grade levels get the oversize numbers around the first of August, the best option at this point is to consider a K/1 split classroom, which would have one teacher with about 10 first graders and 7 kindergarteners.

With so many unknowns and different numbers of classes needed at various grade levels there will be some teachers in new grades next year in kindergarten through fourth grade. If you know of families that have not registered for school (especially kindergarten or first grade), please remind them to start the process on-line or contact the school office at 993-0656. As soon as the picture is a little clearer we'll share all of that information with our families.
