





# Immunization Requirements for the 2019 - 2020 School Year

K.A.R. 28 1-20 defines immunizations required for any individual who attends school or a childcare program operated by a school. Below are the requirements for the indicated school year. Please carefully review the requirements. The usual number of closes required are listed; however there are exceptional circumstances that could after the number of doses a child heads. If you have questions about your child's immunization status, centact your child's primary care provider or local health department.



Proof of receiving the required Immunizations must be provided to the school prior to the student attending the first day of school.
