*Please line up on Miccosukee Road to enter the Blacktop at 9:30 a.m. Proceed onto Blacktop, staying in your car. There will be several stations set up on the blacktop.

*The first station will be for students to drop off any Chromebooks and/or library books that need to be returned to the school.

*The second station is for the return of hardback textbooks. We ask that you place these books in some type of bag with your student's name and Homeroom marked on the bag.

*The third station will be for any uniforms you would like to donate to the Uniform Closet. Please place these laundered, in good shape items in a bag.

*If you ordered a Yearbook, pickup will be in the Front Office Loop. If you would like to purchase a yearbook, they will be for sale for \$50.00 and also be available in the Front Office Loop. Please bring \$50 in exact cash or a check made payable to Trinity Catholic School.

Summer appointments are an excellent opportunity to have the doctor fill out our Medication Form.

Middle School FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Trinity Catholic's Middle School Foreign Language Program now offers Latin and Spanish in 6th-8th Grades. The International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program (IB MYP) requires three years of consecutive foreign language. Only Eighth Graders have the opportunity to earn Spanish I, or Latin I, for high school credit. Students are not guaranteed to receive high school credit. High school credit will be issued based on grades, work ethic, and mastery of the subject. If high school credit is not issued, it will not appear on high school transcripts and the student will not receive a foreign language credit. There will be one section each for Eighth Grade Spanish I and Latin I. Placement will be on a first come, first serve basis. Please indicate which class your child would like to take next school year. Forms must be submitted by the last day of school, Friday, May 29, 2020.

All CURRENT 5th-7th Grade parents need to fill out the following form to indicate whether they would like their child to take Spanish or Latin, beginning next school year. Detailed information is on the form.

SCHOOL OPENING AUGUST 6, 2020

The coronavirus has caused great uncertainty regarding what school opening looks like in August. Our Administration is in consultation with teachers and staff and receiving direction from the CDC, the State of Florida/Governor's Office, and our Diocese in planning the opening of school. There are three basic models:

- A. Full Opening/On-Campus Learning This is our hope and main plan with all students, Faculty, and Staff beginning the new school year with Orientation Day on Thursday, August 6th and the first full day on Friday, August 7th. We are already putting additional safety measures in place in order to welcome students back in August. More details will follow over the summer.
- B. "Blended" Model We are in the process of finalizing this model if we are only allowed a smaller student population on campus. This would be a combination of in-person instruction on campus with additional days working from home.
- C. e-Learning/Distance Learning This is the model we have been using since Spring Break. This format will be evaluated, with improvements implemented going forward. Several parents have given input regarding this model, and we thank you for that. Please continue to give us feedback as we move forward.

Please note that if there are directives regarding schools not being allowed to physically bring students in, we would resume teaching with Model C, which would include any improvements. Trinity Catholic School is dedicated to offering our students the best education we can possible give, even in these stressful times. We greatly thank the parents and teachers for their patience and dedication to our childrens' learning.
