




## **School District Universal ID Badges**

- SDPBC will be requiring universal ID badges next school year.

- Technology permitting, students will be scanned onto buses as well as into campus each morning.

## **NEW Classroom Supplies & Backpack Policy**

 Teaching in the smartphone era has become incredibly challenging for educators.



- Teachers are competing with TikTok, YouTube, social media, video games, texting & air dropping while trying to meet rigorous standards and teach students complex concepts.
- Beginning in August, students will be required to place what they
  need for class on their desk and place their backpacks in an area
  designated by the classroom teacher.








### Cafeteria Service
