A Message from the Principal:

With Marking Period 1 ending on Monday, November 9th, it is critical that students turn in any missing assignments or complete any retakes that they are able to. While we have a number of our students that continue to make their schooling a priority, we unfortunately have 371 students (59% of our students) that are currently failing 1 or more of their classes. Much of this is the result of students not attending class and/or turning in their assignments (currently 283 grades of a 0% by 108 students). Report cards will be distributed on November 17th and students and parents are encouraged to routinely check grades in PowerSchool and contact individual teachers if there is a questions or concern about a grade. **Also, those students participating in a Fall sport or are interested in trying out for a Winter Sport need to maintain athletic eligibility. Any student that receives an "F" on his/her First Marking period report card will not be eligible to participate in high school athletics beginning on November 18th.**

School Attendance: Attendance to each class will be required. Teachers will be instructing both synchronously and asynchronously during their 89-minute block and it's essential that students arrive to each class (even on Wednesdays) on time and ready to learn. **Students that are scheduled for in-person instruction at Bohemia Manor High School will be marked absent, even if they attend that day virtually.** However, all students that are not able to attend a lesson (regardless of the reason), need to make sure that they complete and submit the work assigned for the class that they did not attend. A student's attendance in each course of enrollment will be used to determine a student's daily attendance. **If your student does need to be absent from school, they will need to provide our attendance secretary with a note stating their name, reason for being absent, and the date(s) in which they were absent once they return. Show everyone you are committed to a drug-free life. Rock some **orange** and **black!**

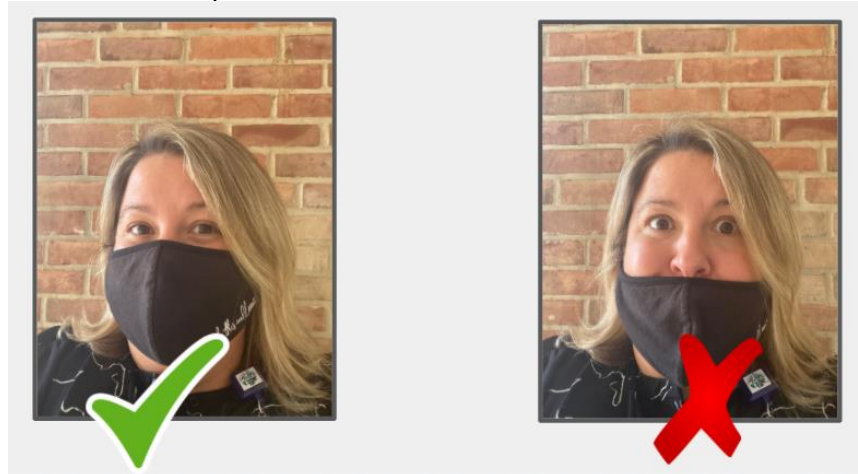
National Honor Society: All juniors and seniors with a 3.5 or higher GPA are eligible to apply for this year's National Honor Society. Eligible students (and parents) were emailed all the necessary forms to apply to the National Honor Society. However, please understand that just because students received an application does not mean that they will be selected to this year's National Honor Society. Students not only need to meet the grade requirement, but also must meet other requirements that include school bases activities, non-school based activities, service in the community, work experience, and leadership. A copy of the rubric for how each student will be evaluated is included in the application packet that was emailed to all eligible candidates. Candidates also must have one letter of recommendation (which is included in the application packet) filled out and returned to Bohemia Manor High School. **Completed applications must be returned to Ms. Donna Craig, in the Bohemia Manor Guidance office by 3:00 on Friday, October 30, 2020. No applications will be accepted after the 3:00 deadline.** If you have specific questions about National Honor Society or the application process, please feel free to contact either Mr. Zimmerman or Ms. Wilcox.

Maryland General Assembly Student Page: Each year, we are asked by the state to select students to participate in the Maryland Student Page Program. **This year's page program will be a virtual experience and is open to seniors who are at least 16 years old.** The 2021 MGA "Re-imagined" Virtual Page Program will be a modified version of the traditional program that will be totally virtual for the students and offered on a Zoom platform. 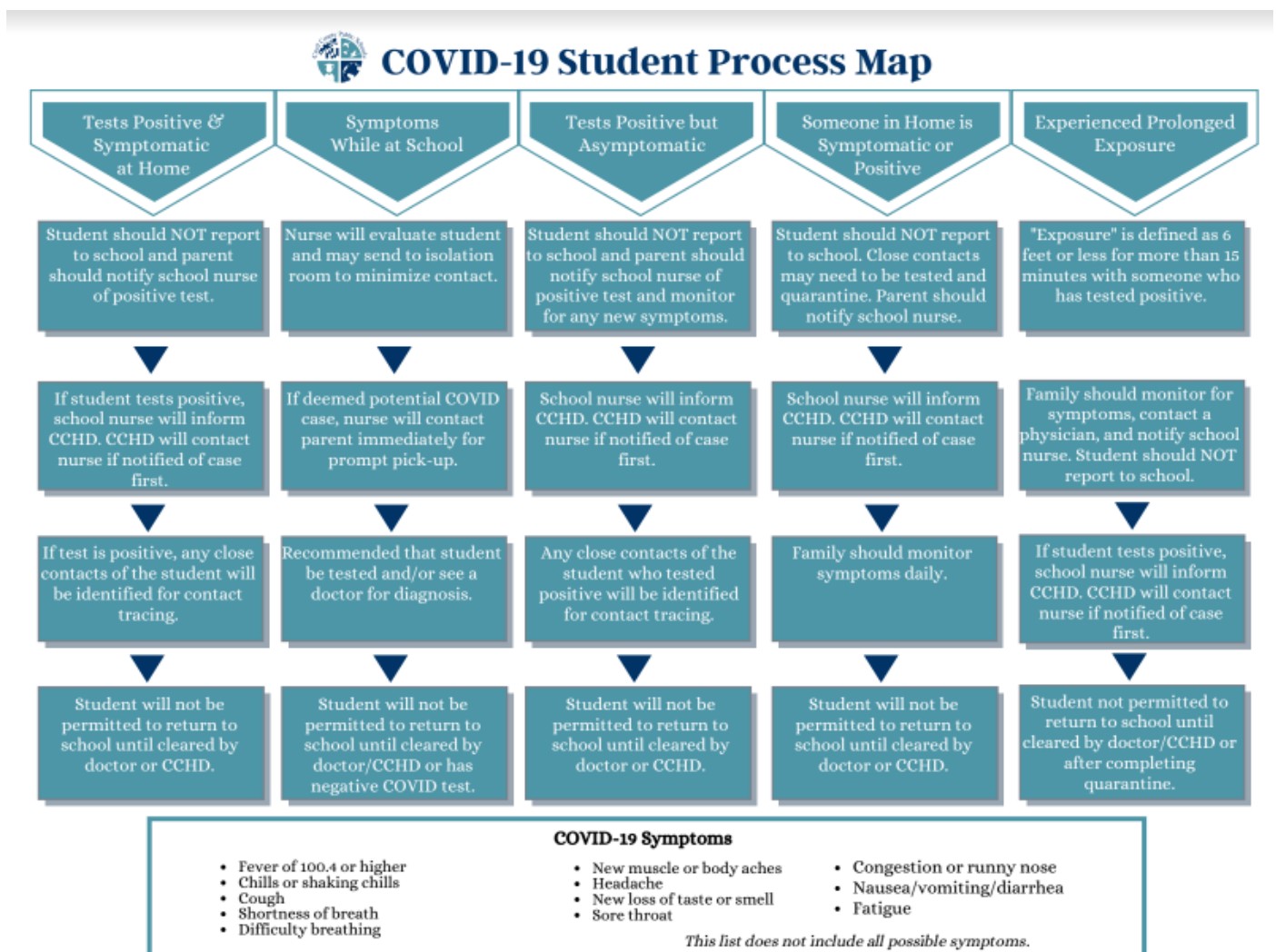

Mask Reminder: We want to remind all of our students that are currently receiving in-person instruction that masks must be worn at all times (and worn appropriately over the nose and mouth) while in the building. The only exception to this is during lunch. **Also the CDC has now determined that Gaiter type face covering are not acceptable.** Students attending Bohemia Manor for in-person instruction will not be permitted to wear this type of face covering. Those students that come to school wearing a gaiter face mask will be referred to the nurse and an appropriate cloth mask will be provided.

Fall Sports: We had another great week of sports competitions with our Fall teams and want to thank all of our players, coaches and spectators for doing a great job adhering to COVID Protocols in order to make sure that everyone is able to stay healthy and safe.

While next week will conclude our Fall season, we are excited to announce that 11 V 11 Contact Football will be returning! Starting now, Cecil County Public Schools will begin tackle football. Practices, will begin introducing pads and full contact as we conclude the 7 vs. 7 competitions with scrimmages remaining on October 23 and October 30. Our first full contact controlled scrimmage will be the first week of November with the other events following. The schedule will be in County Sports Zone soon. If you are a student that is currently playing and want to continue, you don't need to do anything. If you haven't been playing but would like to, you need to have all of the required paperwork completed with a physical being completed on or after June 1, 2020. **Cecil County Public School's eligibility requirements will be enforced. That means that any student with an F's on their 1st Marking Period report card will not be able to participate. As recommended by the Cecil County Health Department, students and visitors who enter CCPS facilities will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms on a daily basis. Please answer the questions below prior to school each day. Forms completed by students/guardians should be collected by the school nurse. The forms will be filed at the school and remain confidential.

If you have answered **YES** to at least one of screening questions #1-5 **OR** answered **YES** to two or more from screening questions #6-13, please follow these steps:

- Do not report to school
- Contact your healthcare provider
- Notify your school nurse and the principal at your school

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
