

Westfield is excited to announce its summer challenge for 2022.

The Summerquest challenge is open to all <u>Current</u> Preschool through Grade 7 students. Summerquest is a great way for students to keep learning over the summer. Students who complete the Summerquest challenge will be eligible for an end of the summer reward.

Research shows that students who engage in learning activities over the summer have the best chance of keeping their skills sharp and being prepared for their next school year. Summerquest offers students a structure where they can pursue a variety of learning activities in a variety of ways and be rewarded for their efforts.

There are many different Summerquest choices for students to explore. Students can choose from the free Summerquest activities or pick from the other options. Please note that parents are responsible for any fees related to the Summerquest learning choices that are made.

Summerquest will run from Monday, May 30st through Friday, July 22nd and requires students to complete 20 hours of learning. All activity logs must be submitted no later than Wednesday, July 27th. They may be emailed to dorene.petersen@d300.org or dropped off in person to the Westfield office. If you are dropping off, please call the school ahead of time to make sure the office is open. Late activity logs will not be accepted.

Summerquest Requirements

Students are required to complete and log 20 hours of learning. Students are able to choose interesting activities that meet their needs. Any online learning minutes that are completed should include some kind of verification of minutes completed from the learning program. The verification should accompany the Summerquest log. Print or email a screenshot or other PDF of your minute totals.

Summerquest Options

We are not endorsing or requiring any of the choices listed below. They are only suggestions for students who need activity ideas.

- WCS Summerquest Learning Packet: These are grade level
 packets for students. Packets and parent answer keys will be
 available in the Door 2 vestibule (middle school). Log the hours
 spent completing the packet, and submit the packet with the log.
- Summer Skills Workbook: Log the hours you spend working in a skills workbook. There are several workbook options.

- Library Reading Program: Partner with your local library and participate in a summer reading program. Log the hours you read.
- Free Choice Reading: Choose books that interest you, and log the hours you read.
- Summer Experiences Journal: Write about the fun and interesting things you do over the summer. Log the hours you spend writing about (not doing) the experiences.

- I-ready: Log your math and/or reading hours and take a screenshot of your hours. Print or email a screenshot with your Summerquest activity log. Access I-Ready through Rapid Identity.
