<u>Black History Month:</u> In continuing with our celebration of black history month, today we will reflect on the accomplishments of Dr. Lillie May Carroll Jackson.

Dr. Jackson was born in Baltimore on May 25, 1889, the seventh of eight children. Jackson attended schools in Baltimore and graduated in 1909 from the Colored High School and Normal School. After graduating, she taught second grade at the old Biddle Street School. Jackson became concerned about discrimination against blacks after two of her children were refused admission to local colleges. One daughter, Virginia, wanted to be an artist, but was not admitted to the Maryland Institute because of her race. The other daughter, Juanita, was denied admission to the University of Maryland. Both women were accepted in schools out of state.

Her children's failure to be accepted by local schools prompted Jackson to become active in the cause of racial equality. She first helped support a youth movement protesting job discrimination. In 1935, she was asked to become president of the Baltimore branch of the NAACP, which began her nearly 35-year tenure. Jackson infused new life into the organization, greatly increasing its membership.

Jackson and the NAACP helped win a Court of Appeals decision allowing the admission of blacks to the University of Maryland. She also helped put blacks on the police force, desegregate swimming pool and equalize the salaries of black and white teachers in Maryland. Jackson supported one of the earliest court cases involving segregation in the public schools.

<u>School Attendance:</u> We had another great week of attendance and I appreciate all of our students' efforts to make coming to school on a regular basis a priority!

However, we do have several students that have already exceeded the 17 day of absences allowed by the county attendance policy. These students are considered Chronically Absent from school. These students must contact their school counselor ASAP to schedule Attendance Recovery Time in our Twilight Program so that they can earn their credits at the end of the school year.

Please make sure that you continue to help support and encourage your student arriving to school each day and arrive on time. Even missing the first several minutes of a student's block one class can cause a them to miss valuable instruction or review the of essential information. Starting the 3rd Marking Period (1/28/20), administration will be closely monitoring those students that are habitually tardy to school (regardless of the reason) and issuing consequences in an effort to help them improve their behavior (5 tardies – 1 hour session of Twilight, 10 tardies – 2 hour session of Twilight, 15+ tardies – full day placement in MIP).

<u>Bohemia Manor High School Scheduling Informational Night:</u> Thanks you to all of our 8th, 9th, 19th, and 11th grade students and parents that participated in this year's Scheduling Informational Night. Students and parents had the opportunity to visit informational tables from each of our core areas to learn about the various class we offer including AP and Honors Courses, Project Lead the Way Courses, and other special programs Parents and students also had the opportunity to touch base with a counselor to discuss scheduling classes for the 2020-2021 school year!


