Afternoon Car Line Pick-up Change

This portion of the Reef Review highlights areas of our curriculum which focus on the appreciation of diversity within our community, country and world. Through literature and non-fiction text, rich discussions take place in classrooms, with a goal of increasing our students' social emotional awareness and knowledge about the many people impacting the world in which we live.

Throughout the month of February we are honoring the past and inspiring the future by celebrating Black History Month. Every grade level is taking time to recognize the achievements and contributions of generations of Black Americans in the United States.

Kindergarten and first grade teachers are using virtual libraries that provide all students access to grade appropriate read alouds and videos honoring many Black Americans and their contributions to our country. Second and third grade teachers also have given students access to virtual libraries within their choice boards. They have been able to access books and participate in classroom activities and tasks that celebrate Black Americans who have inspired and shaped America.

Several second through fifth grade teachers are sharing with students a Black History Month Fact of the Day slideshow. Other teachers are engaging students in NearPod interactive lessons that recognize the accomplishments and contributions of individual Black Americans. Students are creating individual projects and/or responding to literature across all grade levels. These lessons provide students with an opportunity to reflect, learn and share with others what they have learned.

Every fifth grade student has been reading nonfiction text and has created story book covers on an individual Black American they chose to research. Students continue to share their projects with their classmates and display their artwork in their hallway. Individual projects will be shared on WDOL in the coming weeks.

Together we continue to work toward building each students' sense of pride as they show understanding and appreciation of the cultural diversity that has made our country so amazing.
