Upon returning to school on September 21, students will immediately notice that our campus has undergone many modifications to keep our children and staff as safe as possible. Parents, thank you for making your choice of instruction (distance or in-person) known by filling out the 'Make Your Choice' survey located in your student's portal. You may return to the portal and change your choice, however, please remember that fulfilling your new preference may take up to one week.

I also want to encourage you to verify that the contact information we have for you is accurate. This short video explains the verification process. <u>Verify your Contact Information Video</u>

Your children have not been on a campus setting for about six months. They will be excited to see their friends. It's important, however, to remind them that social distancing guidelines that we now have in place were created for their protection. It's paramount they understand that new procedures must be followed. Since your child last attended classes, the District approved a <u>COVID-19 Student Policy</u>. Please also be aware of the District's <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>.

Next week, a JHS *Welcome to Warrior Country* video orientation will cover specific information as it pertains to our school and the return to on-campus instruction. The video will include pertinent information such as lunch procedures, pick up and drop off processes, and more. The video will be sent to you via ParentLink on September 15th and will also be posted on our JHS Welcome Warriors web page.

Additionally, students will be provided with a series of informational videos that outline our Warrior 5 expectations and back-to-brick campus procedures. These will be shared with students in their 1st period/homeroom classes via school announcements and will be posted on the JHS Welcome Warriors web page at <u>www.jupiterhighschool.org</u>.

COVID PROTOCOLS

FACE COVERINGS

- All students must wear face coverings at all times. Facial coverings should cover your nose and comply with CDC recommendations.
- All face coverings must: be made with at least 3 layers of breathable material;
- Neck gaiters, fishing buffs, open chin triangle bandanas, and mesh material, valves, or holes of any kind are not acceptable face coverings
- Facial coverings are in addition to, and not a substitute for, the required social distancing
- Facial coverings may be removed ONLY after seated when eating or drinking at designated lunch or breakfast time

SOCIAL DISTANCING

- Abide by social distancing guidelines, keeping a minimum of 6 feet apart when possible.
- Avoid congregating or stopping when moving throughout the campus and hallways
- Students must not share any school supplies, such as pens, pencils, devices, textbooks, etc.

INSTRUCTION DURING CLASS

- Teachers will be teaching students online (via distance learning) and in person
- Students must assist with keeping their desks or workstations clean and clutter-free
- Students must wear face masks in classrooms & follow their teacher's established seating chart
- Students are encouraged to bring their own hand sanitizer, tissues, and water to drink
- Our bell schedule has been modified to include two lunches; this bell schedule is for both brick & mortar and virtual learning.
- Classroom sessions will be recorded in order to ensure that students experiencing internet issues have an opportunity to view the recorded classes
- Students should bring their PBCSD computer devices and power cords to campus each day for instructional purposes. Students may also bring their personal devices with them if available.
- PBCSD is taking action to protect the health, safety, and welfare of students and personnel. Certain measures will be needed to reduce the risk of exposure and spread of COVID-19. All schools will begin student desks at six feet apart. As the need arises to place additional students in classrooms, schools will follow guidance as outlined by the CDC and the American Academy of Pediatrics.
- If a classroom has reached capacity, students may be directed to an overflow room.

FOLLOW PROCEDURES AS DIRECTED AT ARRIVAL

- Appropriate face coverings must be worn on campus and all school-sponsored transportation at all times
- Avoid congregating or gathering in large groups
- Grab & Go breakfast is available from the cafeteria and mobile carts and is for free to all students until June 18; students can remove their masks to eat only AFTER being seated
- At the 7:15 bell, students will begin moving into the building and to their classrooms; the final bell rings at 7:30 am
- Parent drop off ONLY in the front loop off Military Trail; students should exit vehicles w/masks on and ID's visible to school personnel (once distributed)
- Walkers may enter the school through the main entrance or via the Daniel's Way or Toney Penna entrances
- > Parents will NOT be permitted to drop off forgotten items late

AT LUNCH

- Grab & Go lunch is free to students until Dec. 20th and will be available from locations in the courtyard and cafeteria
- Students should sit only in designated seats and areas, sit in one direction, and maintain social distancing
- Students will utilize individual barcodes rather than pin codes
- Students will wait in line in a socially distanced manner, while standing on the labeled floor stickers
- Students should remain at their lunch areas for the duration of the lunch period and should avoid roaming around
- Student lunch periods will be determined by the 5th period class. See attached bell schedule for additional info.

AT CLASS CHANGES

- Follow one-way flow of traffic in hallways and stairwells; signage will be posted throughout campus
- > Avoid crowding into closed spaces (restrooms or atriums)
- Students will need to carry their belongings with them throughout the school day; no lockers for SY2021
- Students are encouraged to utilize hand sanitizing stations or their own personal sanitizer between classes.

AT DISMISSAL

- Students must wear their face-coverings at dismissal and on school-sponsored transportation
- Students should exit campus immediately via their determined route and avoid gathering on school property

STUDENT HEALTH SCREENING

- Students will self-screen and not come to school if experiencing any of the following--cough, fever, sore throat loss of taste or smell, and any other flu-like symptoms; students will not report to school if using fever reducing meds
- Students or parents will report a positive COVID test to school administrators w/n 24 hours; students who test positive must provide a contract tracing list to their school's administration
- Students exhibiting symptoms throughout the day will be sent to the clinic and isolated until a parent is able to pick them up.
