Notes from Nurse Wilson:

Please keep your Patriot home from school if he/she has a fever over 100 or is vomiting. We are seeing more students at school with high fevers recently, as flu season is still in full swing here in Mount Pleasant.



If your child isn't feeling well in the morning, please check his/her temperature before sending him/her to school, or tell him/her to report to the clinic first thing to have his/her temperature checked before reporting to class. Students who have a fever or who are vomiting should stay home until the fever/vomiting has been gone for 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medicines.

Please remind your Patriots if he/she is not feeling well at school, he/she should come to the nurse to call a parent or guardian and *not* use cell phones without permission. If your child is picked up from the nurse, but does not have a fever, vomiting or emergency, they will need a doctor's excuse for their absence.
