Marking Period 4: Students begin Marking Period 4 tomorrow (Monday, April 12th). While we certainly want to celebrate that we are officially 75% of the way through the 20-21 school year, we also need to take time to reflect upon our progress and make plans for how we can finish the year as strong as we started it. Although we have a number of students that have done an outstanding job in their classes, we also have a number of students that are in jeopardy of not being promoted to the next grade level or graduating. Those students that failed a class both of the first three marking periods need to earn a minimum grade of a B- during the 4th marking period in order to pass the class for the year. One of the ways that all of our students can help to ensure their success is by making sure that they complete and turn in all of their assignments before the end of the marking period. With only 9 grades per class each marking, even earning one 0% can cause an overall poor grade for a class. Students must turn in every assignment, even if the assignment might not be 100% complete or a couple of days late. Earning some points on an assignment is better than receiving a 0%!

School Attendance: Now that we have made it through Marking Period 3, it's critical that students continue attending their classes so that they can get all the necessary information that they need, complete all of their work, and turn in all of their assignments. A reminder to all of our students and parents that a student's attendance in each course of enrollment will be used to determine a student's daily attendance. In order for a student to be marked present for a full day, they must attend and engage in learning a minimum of 50% of their classes each day. Students that are marked absent from a class can have that changed to being marked present as long as they complete and submit their assignments for the class they missed within 2 school days.

I am extremely pleased that through the first 135 day of school we had 262 students that had perfect attendance for the marking period. Below is the attendance data for the 3rd Marking Period:

627 Total Students

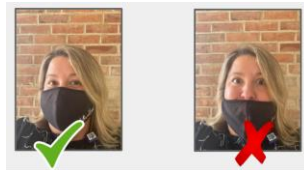
- 262 students missed 0 days (42% of all students)
- 413 students missed 0 days to 2 days (66% of all students)
- 505 students missed 0 days to 4.5 days (81% of all students)
- 122 students missed 5 days or more (19% of all students) – these students are considered “Chronically Absent” by the Maryland State Department of Education because they missed 10% of the total days
- 55 students missed 10 days or more (9% of all students) – these students are considered “Chronically Absent” by the Maryland State Department of Education because they have already missed 10% of the total number of days in a school year
- 17 students missed 18 days or more (3% of all students) - these students are considered “Chronically Absent” by the Maryland State Department of Education because they have already missed 10% of the total number of days in a school year

If your student does need to be absent from school, they will need to provide our attendance secretary with a note stating their name, reason for being absent, and the date(s) in which they were absent once they return. 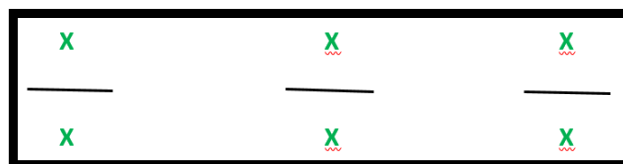
Student Attending School for In-Person Instruction:

All students attending in-person instruction must make sure that they are following the procedures and safety protocols that are in place. This will help ensure that we are able to keep all students and staff safe and healthy;

1. Students must wear a mask at all times (except when eating in the cafeteria). Masks must be worn appropriately over the mouth and nose.



2. Only two students are permitted in a restroom at a time (**this includes during class changes**). Teachers will issue a classroom bathroom pass that is to be hung on the hook outside of the restroom door.
3. Students must sit at an assigned table at a “Green Check Mark” in the cafeteria (6 to a table max). Students will have Monday and Tuesday to select their table and will not be permitted to move to another table (unless given permission by an admin) starting on Thursday, April 8th.



4. Students will be given an assigned seat in each classroom. Students will be responsible for wiping down their desk area at the conclusion of each class.
5. When traveling in from class to class, students must maintain appropriate social distancing and will not be permitted to congregate with one another in the hallway.
6. Those students that are receiving a breakfast each morning from the school (free to all students) will be able to pick up breakfast each morning at our Grab-and-Go Station.

SAT/PSAT DAY: Will we be administering the PSAT and SAT on Tuesday, April 13th, all of our 10th and 11th graders that pre-registered with Ms. Shaw or Ms. Wilcox (**STUDENTS WILL FOLLOW AN A DAY SCHEDULE**). Below is the information that all of students need to know concerning our plan for the day for testing and instruction. **Those 12th graders that attend CCST, will leave for CCST immediately following all of our buses arriving that morning.**

- Students who participate in the PSAT/SAT are able to leave school after the test is finished if they complete a [consent form](#) and send it to the main office

Prom 2021:

It is the honor of this year's Prom Committee to invite the Juniors and Seniors of BMHS to Prom 2021, **"Hidden in the Night."**

This year's prom will be an outdoor formal event held on **Saturday May 1, 2021 from 5 pm - 9 pm**. Prom will be set up in the courtyard of our school's campus (where graduation is traditionally held). Check-in / health screenings will begin promptly at 5 pm. Dinner will be served starting at 5:30 pm. Dancing will begin at 6 pm. This year's Prom King and Queen will be crowned at 7:30 pm.

One tent will be set up for our buffet dinner, catered by **Chesapeake Inn**. The menu includes Caesar salad, Chicken Piccata (sautéed breast of chicken, capers, lemon butter sauce), London broil (orange-marinated, grilled and sliced, au jus naturelle), Cheese Ravioli, whipped yukon potatoes, vegetable medley, and fresh baked cookies for dessert, along with an assortment of soft drinks and water.

The second tent will include a dance floor and musical selections being played by DJ Cat. **Due to Covid regulations, masks must be worn while dancing, and social distancing protocols must be observed.**

Tickets will be available **online** from Monday March 29, 2021 through Friday April 16, 2021. **Tickets will be \$60 per person**. When purchasing tickets, you will need to indicate if you would prefer to sit at a table of 4 or a table of 6. If you have a preference of who you would like to sit with, an email must be sent to Mrs. Christy (achristy@ccps.org) with the names of the guests you would like at your table.

If you are bringing a guest who does not attend BMHS, please reach out to Mrs. Christy for the required Guest Form. This form is due back to Mrs. Christy by Monday April 26, 2021.

Due to Covid regulations, masks must be worn at all times, with the exception of when you are seated at your table while eating. Once you check-in to prom, students / guests are required to remain in the courtyard for the duration of the event. If you choose to leave early, you will not be permitted to reenter the courtyard area, and will be asked to leave school grounds promptly.

Updates from Mr. Kline (our Athletic Director)

- **Academic eligibility** – The 3rd marking period ends on Friday 4/9. All athletes must be passing all of their classes at that time.
- **Attendance** – Athletes are required to be in school, either virtually or in school, in order to participate in practices and games.
 - Virtual students (all students on Wednesdays) must be logged in and active in their classes.
 - Face-to-face students must be in the building. Staying home and logging in virtually is **NOT** a substitute for being in the building.
 - Emergencies, appointments, etc. may be excused by the principal but are the exception, not the rule.
 - Athletes cannot miss more than one class each day to be eligible to participate.
- **Transportation** – CCPS will be providing transportation to and from all games. The expectation is that all athletes ride the team bus. The following protocols are in place:
 - Face-to-face students are required to ride the bus to away games.
 - Virtual students are encouraged to meet the bus at school, or at the Park and Ride on Route 213 between White Hall and Frenchtown Roads. If a student's car or parent is not at the Park and Ride on the return trip, they will be transported to the school for pick up.
 - Students and/or parents who drive to an away game are asked to remain in their car until the team bus arrives.
 - Parents may provide transportation home from games by following the proper sign out procedure. Coaches have a list of all of a student's emergency contacts who can sign them out of school and can release a student only to one of those people. An ID might be requested. We are taking every precaution to ensure we release a student only to those people approved by the parents.
 - Students will need to communicate clearly with the coach regarding transportation.
 - We are still waiting for a few students to return the Transportation Waiver. If your child has not returned that form, please see the attached document.
 - Please do not park or wait the bus loop in the rear of the building as we will have buses coming and going all afternoon most days.
- **Schedule** – The schedule is more fluid than in the past. Rain outs will not be rescheduled at this time. Also, game times are different due to transportation restrictions. County Sports Zone (<https://www.countysports.zone/>) will be your best resource for game times and/or changes.

Students or parents that have questions about practices, games, etc... are encouraged to routinely visit our school's athletic webpage. They can also reach out to our school's athletic director (Mr. Kline) with any specific questions.
