



This packet contains all necessary information for the 41st annual All City String Festival, hosted by American Family Field. We greatly look forward to celebrating this momentous event with you and your student musicians. Note: A few of the arrival times for students have changed this month.

Arrival Times and Location

All students should plan to arrive at the third based gate (the only one with a covered awning) at the times below. You can also refer to the map, linked [HERE](#).

12:30pm: High School Students Arrive (HS)

1:00 pm: Elementary Students Arrive (ES)

*1:00pm High School Sound Check

1:15pm Middle School Students Arrive (MS)

2:00pm: Concert Begins

3:15pm: Concert Ends

Once unpacked, elementary students will move to sit in sections 124 and 125 and middle school students will sit in section 111. Once finished with their performance, high school students will join elementary students in section 125 and 126.

Parking: General Admission

Parking is FREE for All City String Festival. Upon arrival, you will be directed towards one of three home plate lots (Aaron, Thomas, or Fingers). Admission for non-performers begins at 1:00pm through the home plate gates. Need a map? [CLICK HERE](#). Parking lots will open slightly earlier, at 12:30pm.

Tickets

All non-performers will need a ticket to enter the ballpark. Each student musician receives four (4) free tickets.

Security

American Family Field has the same security protocols for all events from Brewers games to All City Strings. Each person will be asked to go through a metal detector as well as limit the items brought into the stadium. Avoid large bags/purses and pack small. Frequently Asked Questions

What should my student bring to the concert?

All students should wear their string festival shirt (to be provided), shorts/pants/skirt (weather dependent), a folding music stand, instrument, and music. In some cases, middle and high school students can share between their stand partners. Cellos and bases should bring an end pin strap. It is also a GREAT idea to write your name on your music stand.

Where will we be playing?

Students will take turns playing on their warning track dirt with their peers. As a special treat, all students will combine at the end of the concert for a true all city string orchestra. Planning the best viewing area? In general, violins will be on the third base side, violas/cellos/basses will be on the first base side.

Where are cases being stored?

All cases are stored near the third base student entrance (see map) and can remain in this location for the duration of the performance.

Where will my student sit while waiting to play?

Students will sit with their peers while waiting to perform. Elementary students will sit by school in sections 124 and 125. High School students will sit in sections 125 and 126, and middle school students will sit in section 111 (first base side).

Where can I meet my student musician after the performance?

American Family Field recommends that all families meet their musicians outside the ballpark. You orchestra teachers will let each of their schools know their locations. You are also welcome to coordinate with your student musicians where you'd prefer to meet after the concert. If the weather is not in our favor on May 6th, locations will be shifted to inside (and displayed on the outfield screen).

Can I take pictures?

Yes, Please do! And share them with your child's orchestra teacher, the school district, and your social media accounts. This is a tremendous event that deserves to be shared! Non-performers will not be allowed on the field, however, there are many places to take great photos of your child with their instrument and the ballpark in the background.

Will there be concessions?

No. We will not have concessions available at this event. There are plenty of amazing places close by that would love to host you and your family for a post-concert celebration. You are able to bring in smaller items, such as sealed beverages. Please review the Brewers security procedures [HERE](#).
