Here are some reminders of things coming up:


- Tonight is Jam the Gym at Millard South High School. All Disney students get in free and get a ticket for the concession stand.

HOW DO YOU GET YOUR CHILD STARTED?

Matching

When matching your child with a mentor, we take into account the needs, personality, interests, and goals of both the child and the adult volunteer.

Activities

We host two free activities a month for all of our matches. We also have many partners in the community who provide activities for our matches for free and/or at a discounted cost.

Staff Support

Each match is supported by an assigned BBBS Match Support Specialist who will provide resources, guidance, and assurance for your child's match.



HOW DO I GET MY CHILD STARTED?

- Reside in the BBBSM service area
- Be between the ages of 7 and 14 at the time of enrollment
- Show a desire to be matched in the program.
- Have a custodial parent/guardian that will demonstrate a supportive and cooperative attitude toward BBBSM and abide by the Agency's policies and guidelines
- Be in the area for at least 12 months to make a commitment to the program
- Be able to meet with their mentor 2-4 times per month for a total of at least 4 hours per month

- Su hijo debe de vivir en el área de servicio de BBBSM.
- Su hijo debe de tener entre 7 y 14 años al momento de la inscripción.
- Su hijo debe mostrar un deseo de ser emparejado en el programa.
- Su hijo debe de tener un padre/tutor con custodia que demuestre una actitud de apoyo y cooperación hacia BBBSM y cumplir con las políticas y directivas de la Agencia.
- Su hijo debe de mantenerse en el área para poder comprometerse al programa por lo menos un año.
- Su hijo debe de poder reunirse con su mentor de 2 a 4 veces al mes.

Supporting Tips for the Holidays

It's December, and time to celebrate the winter season. As we all prepare for what can always seem like a crazy, hectic time of year, let's focus on



what is truly important; family, friends, laughter, fun, gatherings (stay 6 feet apart;) and for some...gifts! This newsletter will highlight some tips for choosing educational gifts, as well as some ways we can celebrate by spending time TOGETHER.

Ideas for quality toys:

- o Select toys without batteries or screens ~ the more the toy does, the less your child has to do. Buy gifts that stimulate thinking and skill-building.
- o Look for toys that allow your child to learn naturally through discovery and exploration.
- o Think quality over quantity ~ consider fewer high-quality toys. Less is more!
- o Keep your child's interests in mind, but be willing to introduce new types of learning.
- o Spark imagination ~ find toys that encourage creative play!
- o Developmentally appropriate ~ ensure your child is able to experience success during play time. Challenge their abilities, however note that toys too advanced can cause unhealthy frustration.
- o Books are toys ~ interactive books can teach children many different ways of learning. A child can never have too many books!

While gift buying can be fun, remember the memories you make as a family is what your children will remember. Think of some fun things to do as a family while spending extra time at home this Winter Season: Puzzles, Arts and Crafts, Building forts and telling stories, making a treat together and letting your child help, drinking hot cocoa with marshmallows...

A simple and easy art activity that you and your child(ren) can do at home together:


How to Make 6-Pointed Paper Snowflakes.

- 1. Step 1: Start With a Square. First, begin with a square piece of copy paper. ...
- 2. Step 2: Fold in Half Diagonally. ...
- 3. Step 3: Fold in Half Again. ...
- 4. Step 4: Fold One Third. ...
- 5. Step 5: Fold Again. ...
- 6. Step 6: Cut the "top" Off at an Angle. ...
- 7. Step 7: Shape It! ...
- 8. Step 8: Unfold to Reveal!
