

The Empty Stocking Fund has been bringing holiday cheer to metro Atlanta's underprivileged children since 1927. Each year the generous contributions received from thousands of Atlanta's along with local businesses and foundations enable Empty Stocking Fund to provide gift packages to children living in Clayton, Cobb, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry and Rockdale counties. For most of the children we serve, the gifts they receive from The Empty Stocking Fund are the only gifts they will receive

Since the AFJROTC Program started back in June 2002, Marietta High School cadets have donated over \$126,000 to the fund. Every dollar we have collected has been given directly to Empty Stocking Fund. Due to changes in how the cadets can now collect money for the Empty Stocking Fund, we must look for new ways to raise our average annual \$15,000 contributions. I have challenged each cadet to collect at least \$50 this year. In return, Lt Col Wilson has agreed to collect \$1000 before 5 Nov 18.

This is a tough challenge and we need your help. Please consider going to the link above and make a pledge to the Empty Stocking Fund. Every dollar you pledge can be used as tax write off and every dollar will go directly to the Empty Stock Fund under Marietta High School AFJROTC.
