## Director's Note

Welcome back East Orchestra families! My name is Michael Hayden, orchestra teacher, and I am thrilled to start my 10th year teaching in Wauwatosa and my 20th year teaching orchestra.

We have had a great month in orchestra, returning to our music routines, getting to know one another, and hitting the ground running making music. The beginning of each year focuses primarily on technique and tone development. Technique relates to right/ left hand position as well as how we hold the instrument and position our bodies while playing. Tone production is the quality of sound and how students can use the weight of their bow and the placement on the string to produce warm, rich, and resonant sound. Both are key to successful string playing.

If you're looking for some new supplies/goodies for your string playing, the fall is a great time to stock up for the school year. Items like rosin, shoulder rests, or extra strings are often found on sale at this time. I prefer local music stores for these items, however online retailers such as SWStrings and Shar Music are great resources (and will ship to your home).

Your first opportunity to see our musicians in concert is a little under one month from now. Our fall performance this year will take place in the **Dale K. Hidde Theatre at Tosa East on October 28th at 7:00pm**. The concert will also be streamed live for those families unable to join us in person. Happy 2025-2026 school year and I look forward to seeing you all soon!
