SCHOOL REPORT CARDS

Each year schools receive a rating from the Illinois State Board of Education; the 2018-19 reports were released on Wednesday, October 30th. The report is based on several components that include: academic growth and proficiency, chronic absenteeism, and school climate. The areas of student performance are measured by overall student population and by subgroups within the population. One component of the School Report Card is the summative designation. Lakewood Creek was designated as "Underperforming." Last year, we identified math as an area for growth and created goals focused on math instruction and professional

development for staff; we are proud of the gains we made in just one year! This year, we are focused on strengthening our academic instruction in the area of reading, and providing staff with professional development and resources to better support our students. Through our ongoing school improvement process, Lakewood Creek will continue to review data and implement plans for improvement in all areas. 

AVID FOCUS

Costa's Levels of Thinking:

One of the core strategies that AVID utilizes to support students' academic growth is the implementation of Costa's Levels of Thinking to promote deep thinking about a topic.

Level 1 questions are simple recall. These can be thought of as "copy and pasting" level. These might include creating lists, definitions, or simple memorization.

Level 2 questions involve processing. Students need to bring two or more pieces of information together and requires the student to synthesize, find similarities, discover differences, or group concepts.

Level 3 questions require application. Again, students need to pull together multiple pieces of information, but also requires the student to utilize their own ideas to create a cogent answer. In this level, students evaluate, imagine, predict, and judge, which requires the combination of ideas that they have learned with their own thinking in order to apply that information.

At Home: Be sure to use level 2 and 3 questions in your discussions, especially non-academic discussions. "Why do you think the grocery store has aisles organized in this way?" "What would our home look like without interior walls?" "Do you think the dog understands our facial expressions? Why or why not?" "With more research about CTE from repeated head injuries, should tackle football be banned? Does the age of the player make a difference?" "Was ____ the right choice?"
