Stuart Municipal Utilities, Stuart, IA (Owner) is requesting Bids for the construction of the following Project:

## 2022 WATER MAIN IMPROVEMENTS Stuart Municipal Utilities – Stuart, IA 120.1118.09B

Sealed bids for the construction of the Project will be received at the City of Stuart City Hall located at 119 E Front Street, PO Box 370, Stuart, IA 50250, until **Thursday, June 2, 2022, at 2:00 PM** local time. At that time and place the Bids received will be publicly opened and read by the Engineer.

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Board of the City of Stuart Municipal Utilities on the proposed contract documents (plans, specifications, and form of contract) and estimated cost for the project at its meeting at 5:30 P.M. on Thursday, June 9, 2022, in said City of Stuart City Hall for the 2022 Water Main Improvements – Stuart, IA project. Said Board will also receive and consider any comments/objections to said plans, specifications and form of contract or to the estimated cost of said improvements made by any interested party.

Notice is hereby given that at 5:30 P.M. on Thursday, June 9, 2022, at the City of Stuart City Hall, Stuart, Iowa, the Municipal Board of the Stuart Municipal Utilities, Stuart, IA will consider the construction bids received and will either award a contract, reject all bids, or adjourn thereon to a subsequent meeting of the Board. The USDA-RD (Agency) has to concur in the award before the Owner can issue the Notice of Award for the project.

**The Project includes the following Work:** Replace approximately 44,047 LF of 6", 8", and 10" water mains along with associated valves, service connections, fire hydrants, and other miscellaneous and associated work. The Project is located throughout the City of Stuart, IA.

Bids are requested for the following Contract: 2022 Water Main Improvements – Stuart, IA.

Owner anticipates that the Project's total bid price will be approximately \$4,228,000. Work on the Project shall commence on the date specified in the written Notice to Proceed. The Project has an expected duration of 655 calendar days to substantially complete and completed and ready for final payment on or before 697 calendar days. Late start date is August 1, 2022.

Prospective Bidders may obtain or examine the Bidding Documents at the Issuing Office on Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM and may obtain copies of the Bidding Documents from the Issuing Office as described below. Partial sets of Bidding Documents will not be available from the Issuing Office. Neither Owner nor Engineer will be responsible for full or partial sets of Bidding Documents, including addenda, if any, obtained from sources other than the Issuing Office.

Printed copies of the Bidding Documents may be obtained from the Issuing Office by paying a deposit of \$0.00 for each set.

A Bid must be accompanied by Bid security as required by Iowa Code section 26.8, as security that the successful bidder will enter into a contract for the work bid upon and will furnish after the award of contract a corporate surety bond, acceptable to the Owner, for the faithful performance of the contract, in an amount equal to one hundred percent of the amount of the contract. The bid security shall be made payable to Owner in an amount of five (5) percent of Bidder's maximum Bid price (determined by adding the base bid and all alternates) and shall be in the form of a cashier's check or certified check drawn on a state-chartered or federally chartered bank, or a certified share draft drawn on a state-chartered or federally chartered bank, or a certified share draft drawn on a state-chartered or federally chartered bank of the form included in the Bidding Documents) issued by a surety meeting the requirements of Paragraphs 6.01 of the General Conditions.

#### Pre-bid Conference

A pre-bid conference for the Project will be held on Tuesday, May 24, 2022 at 10:00 AM at City of Stuart City Hall, 119 E Front Street, Stuart, IA 50250. Attendance at the pre-bid conference is encouraged but not required.

### Instructions to Bidders

For all further requirements regarding bid submittal, qualifications, procedures, and contract award, refer to the Instructions to Bidders that are included in the Bidding Documents.

To the extent required by lowa law, a resident bidder shall be allowed a preference as against a nonresident bidder from a state or foreign country if that state or foreign country gives or requires any preference to bidders from that state or foreign country, including but not limited to any preference to bidders, the imposition of any type of labor force preference or any other form of preferential treatment to bidders or laborers from that state or foreign country. The preference allowed shall be equal to the preference given or required by the state or foreign country in which the nonresident bidder is a resident. In the instance of a resident labor force preference, a nonresident bidder shall apply the same resident labor force preference to a public improvement in this state as would be required in the construction of a public improvement by the state or foreign country in which the nonresident bidder is a resident. Failure to submit a fully completed Bidder Status Form with the Proposal may result in the Proposal being deemed nonresponsive and rejected.

To the extent allowed by Federal law and regulation, by virtue of statutory authority, a preference will be given to products and provisions grown and coal produced within the state of Iowa.

American Iron and Steel

Section 746 of Title VII of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2017 (Division A - Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2017) and subsequent statutes mandating domestic preference applies an American Iron and Steel requirement to this project. All iron and steel products used in this project must be produced in the United States. The term "iron and steel products" means the following products made primarily of iron or steel: lined or unlined pipes and fittings, manhole covers and other municipal castings, hydrants, tanks, flanges, pipe clamps and restraints, valves, structural steel, reinforced precast concrete, and Construction Materials.

The following waivers apply to this Contract: *De Minimis*, Minor Components, Pig iron and direct reduced iron.

This project is a federally funded project with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and the federal prevailing wage requirements will apply.

# Section 3 clause

## (This language is to be included in all procurement documents/ solicitations)

A. The work to be performed under this contract is subject to the requirements of section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u (section 3). The purpose of section 3 is to ensure that employment and other economic opportunities generated by HUD assistance or HUD-assisted projects covered by section 3, shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed to low-and very low-income persons, particularly persons who are recipients of HUD assistance for housing.

B. The parties to this contract agree to comply with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR part 135, which implement section 3. As evidenced by their execution of this contract, the parties to this contract certify that they are under no contractual or other impediment that would prevent them from complying with the part 135 regulations.

C. The contractor agrees to send to each labor organization or representative of workers with which the contractor has a collective bargaining agreement or other understanding, if any, a notice advising the labor organization or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this section 3 clause, and will post copies of the notice in conspicuous places at the work site where both employees and applicants for training and employment positions can see the notice. The notice shall describe the section 3 preference, shall set forth minimum number and job titles subject to hire, availability of apprenticeship and training positions, the qualifications for each; and the name and location of the person(s) taking applications for each of the positions; and the anticipated date the work shall begin.

D. The contractor agrees to include this section 3 clause in every subcontract subject to compliance with regulations in 24 CFR part 135, and agrees to take appropriate action, as provided in an applicable provision of the subcontract or in this section 3 clause, upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR part 135. The contractor will not subcontract with any subcontractor where the contractor has notice or knowledge that the subcontractor has been found in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR part 135.

E. The contractor will certify that any vacant employment positions, including training positions, that are filled (1) after the contractor is selected but before the contract is executed, and (2) with persons other than those to whom the regulations of 24 CFR part 135 require employment opportunities to be directed, were not filled to circumvent the contractor's obligations under 24 CFR part 135.

F. Noncompliance with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR part 135 may result in sanctions, termination of this contract for default, and debarment or suspension from future HUD assisted contracts.

G. With respect to work performed in connection with section 3 covered Indian housing assistance, section 7(b) of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450e) also applies to the work to be performed under this contract. Section 7(b) requires that to the greatest extent feasible (i) preference and opportunities for training and employment shall be given to Indians, and (ii) preference in the award of contracts and subcontracts shall be given to Indian organizations and Indian-owned Economic Enterprises. Parties to this contract that are subject to the provisions of section 3 and section 7(b) agree to comply with section 3 to the maximum extent feasible, but not in derogation of compliance with section 7(b).

Section 3 Businesses are encourage to respond to this proposal.

A Section 3 business is a business that is:

51% owned by Section 3 residents\*

Whose permanent, full-time staff is comprised of at least 30% Section 3 residents\*

Has committed 25% of the dollar amount of its subcontracts to Section 3 businesses

\*A Section 3 resident is defined as a public housing resident <u>or</u> someone with a household income that is less than 80% of the area median income.
