About the position:

In this role, you will work with the Flood Control System Manager along with Public Works staff and departments coordinating a variety of components for the City's flood control system. Project management activities are a critical part of this position.

Coordinates and manages a variety of components for the City's Flood Control System (FCS) Program, with key duties focusing on operations and management of the FCS system. Performs project management activities.

Position Schedule: Monday-Friday 7:30am-4:30pm

Salary: \$25.75/hour- Commensurate

Successful completion of a pre-employment background check, physical examination (if applicable) and drug screen are required prior to employment with the City of Cedar Rapids.

EXAMPLES OF ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- Communicates with external entities including FEMA, US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), and Iowa DNR regarding the FCS
- Manages and documents annual inspections required for compliance with the USACE levee safety program, ADA, and FEMA certification related to the FCS
- Develops and manages permitting program for the FCS right-of-way, and issues related permits
- Monitors projects, anticipating issues with scheduling, costs or other projects
- Assists with and inputs annual FCS budget; assists with grant applications
- Creates and maintains technical documentation and manuals for FCS operations and maintenance
- Coordinates private utility company work for construction activities
- Coordinates maintenance activities for Public Works, Utilities, and Parks and Recreation departments tasked with maintenance of the FCS
- Responds to citizen inquiries; communicates with the public regarding FCS project impact
- Prepares and issues required reports for funding partners
- Gathers, prepares and coordinates correspondences, reports, lists, files and other documents.
- Coordinates, schedules, and prepares agendas for associated FCS meetings; records meeting minutes; creates and distributes written minutes
- Prepares non-technical public outreach, Council and committee reports and documents
- Performs related work as required

Required Education and Experience

- Associate's Degree in Engineering Technology, Planning, Construction Management or related field and
- One (1) to three (3) years of experience related to civil engineering, flood plain management, levee inspection, technical writing, or related work or
- An equivalent combination of education and/or experience
