NOTICE TO BIDDERS

Time and Place for Filing Sealed Proposals

Sealed bids will be received by the City Clerk of the City of Randolph, Iowa, at the Randolph City Hall at 107 S Main Street, Randolph, IA 51649, until 2:00 p.m., local time, on July 30, 2025, for the following described public improvement:

Water System Improvements: Divisions 1, 2, and 3

Randolph, Iowa

Time and Place Sealed Proposal Will be Opened and Considered

Sealed bids will be opened by the City Clerk and bids tabulated at the above time and place. Bids will be considered by the Randolph City Council at their meeting at 7:00 p.m., local time, on August 5, 2025, at the Randolph City Hall, at which time the Council may take action on the proposals submitted or at such time as may then be fixed.

General Nature of the Public Improvement

The extent of work on this project is the furnishing of all labor, equipment, and materials for the construction of improvements in Randolph, Iowa under three separate contracts (Divisions) generally described as follows:

1. Division 1 – Well Nos. 3, 4, and 5: Construction of improvements to rehabilitate Well No. 3, plug and abandon Well No. 4, and construction of a new municipal water supply well. The project also includes the installation of a pitless unit, submersible pump and motor, raw water main piping, flow meter manhole, connection to the existing raw water main, installation of an emergency backup generator, installation of a liquid propane tank, erosion control, and site restoration. The project also includes the removal of pumping equipment, rehabilitation of Well No. 3, replacement of pumping equipment, installation of a pressure transducer, raw water main piping, and flow meter. The project also includes plugging and abandoning of Well No. 4 and the demolition of Well No. 4 well house.
2. Division 2 – Water Treatment Plant: Construction of improvements to rehabilitate the water treatment plant. This includes installation of new loss of head pressure gauges, new magnetic flow meter, removal and replacement of high service pumps equipped with VFDs, and masonry repointing and repainting.
3. Division 3 – Water Tower: Construction of a new water tower to replace the existing standpipe. This includes clearing and grubbing, site grading, tower construction, approximately 90 feet of 8-inch water main, hydrant, connection to the existing water distribution system, abandonment of the existing standpipe connection, erosion control, and site restoration.

Bidders may submit bids for any single or combination of Divisions.

Pre-Bid Conference

A Pre-Bid Conference will not be held for this project.

Contract Documents

The kinds of materials, estimated quantities, and work to be done for the project on which bids will be received are as shown on the bid proposal for said project.

All work is to be done in strict compliance with the Plans and Specifications prepared by Short Elliott Hendrickson Inc. which have been heretofore approved by the City Council and which are now on file for public examination in the office of the City Clerk.

All bids shall be made on the forms included in the project specifications and shall be filed on or before the time specified above, in a sealed envelope addressed to the City Clerk of Randolph, Iowa, clearly stating that the envelope contains a bid on this project.

Copies of the contract documents are on file with the City of Randolph, Iowa, for examination by bidders. Paper copies of Bidding Forms and copies of Plans and Specifications and contract documents may be obtained from the

Engineer's Office at Short Elliott Hendrickson Inc. (SEH), 5414 NW 88th Street, Suite 140, Johnston, Iowa 50131 (515.608.6000) for \$100 per set, all of which will be refunded if returned in reusable condition within 14 days of the Award of Contract. If all documents are not returned in reusable condition and within 14 days, the deposit shall be forfeited.

Bid Security

Each Bid shall be accompanied by a Bid Bond, certified check, cashier's check, or certified credit union share draft in an amount equal to five (5) percent of the total amount of the Bid. If Bid Bond is submitted, it must be on the form provided with the Contract Documents. The certified check, cashier's check, or certified credit union share draft shall be drawn on a bank in Iowa, a bank chartered under the laws of the United States of America, or said certified share draft shall be drawn on a credit union in Iowa or chartered under the laws of the United States and payable to the Treasurer of the Owner as security that if awarded a contract, the Bidder will enter into a contract at the prices Bid and furnish the required Performance, Payment and Warranty Bond(s) each in the amount of one hundred percent of the Work, and provide a Certificate of Insurance. The certified check, cashier's check, or certified share draft may be cashed, or the Bid Bond forfeited, and the proceeds retained as liquidated damages if the Bidder fails to execute a contract or file acceptable Performance, Payment and Warranty Bond(s) or provide an acceptable Certificate of Insurance within fifteen (15) days after the acceptance of said Bid by resolution of the Owner.

No Bidder may withdraw a Bid within sixty (60) days after the date set for opening Bids.

Preference of Products and Labor

By virtue of statutory authority preference will be given to products and provisions grown and coal produced within the State of Iowa and to Iowa domestic labor.

In accordance with Iowa statutes, a resident bidder shall be allowed a preference as against a nonresident bidder from a state or foreign country if that state or foreign country gives or requires any preference to bidders from that state or foreign country, including but not limited to any preference to bidders, the imposition of any type of labor force preference, or any other form of preferential treatment to bidders or laborers from that state or foreign country. The preference allowed shall be equal to the preference given or required by the state or foreign country in which the nonresident bidder is a resident. In the instance of a resident labor force preference, a nonresident bidder shall apply the same resident labor force preference to a public improvement in this state as would be required in the construction of a public improvement by the state or foreign country in which the nonresident bidder is a resident. Failure to submit a fully completed Bidder Status Form with the bid may result in the bid being deemed nonresponsive and rejected.

If it is determined that adherence to these Iowa statutory requirements may cause denial of federal funds which would otherwise be available for a public improvement or would otherwise be inconsistent with requirements of any federal law or regulation, the application of Iowa Code Chapters 73 and 73A shall be suspended to the extent necessary to prevent denial of the funds or to eliminate the inconsistency with federal requirements.

Sales Tax Exemption

The Bidder shall not include sales tax in the Bid. The Owner is exempt from paying sales tax and will issue a sales tax exemption certificate to the Contractor for all material purchased for incorporation into the project. Tax exemption certificates are applicable only for the specific project for which the tax exemption certificate is issued.

Commencement and Completion of Work

A separate Notice to Proceed will be issued for each Division. Work on said project shall commence within ten (10) days of a written notice to proceed is issued, and shall be completed as stated below. The Work shall be substantially completed for each Division as follows:

Division 1:

The Work will be substantially completed on or before May 1, 2026, and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions on or before May 29, 2026.

Division 2:

The Work will be substantially completed on or before May 1, 2026, and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions on or before May 29, 2026.

Division 3:

The Work will be substantially completed on or before December 4, 2026, and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions on or before May 28, 2027.

Liquidated Damages

Liquidated damages in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per consecutive day will be assessed for each day that the Work remains incomplete after the dates specified above for substantial completion and readiness for final payment.

Payment

Payment for the work will be made by the City in cash from such funds as may be legally available including cash on hand, proceeds from the sale and issuance of General Obligation Bonds and such other funds including the proceeds from the sale and issuance of such other bonds as may lawfully be issued as the City Council may at its sole discretion determine and provide.

Payment will be made to the contractor based on monthly estimates in amounts equal to ninety-five percent of the contract value of the work completed during the preceding calendar month and will be based upon an estimate prepared by the Contractor on the first day of the month, subject to the approval of the Engineer. Any such payment by the City shall in no way be construed as an act of acceptance for any part of the work partially or totally completed. Final payment by the City will be made in accordance with Iowa statutes and the contract documents.

Rural Development (RD) Funding Requirements

Funding of this project will utilize the U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development (RD) program. Refer to Section 00 43 12 for Bid Attachments and Section 00 80 10 for Attachments.

Bid Informalities

The City reserves the right to reject any and/or all bids and to waive any and/or all technicalities and/or all irregularities.
