Incorporated in 1999, ASA has over one thousand members from diverse backgrounds including clinical microbiologists and infectious diseases physicians, respiratory and ICU physicians, microbiologists, scientists, pharmacists, veterinarians, infection control practitioners, undergraduate and postgraduate students, and industry representatives from pharmaceutical and diagnostic/research biomedical companies. Although membership is primarily based in Australia and New Zealand, it extends to the USA, Europe, the United Kingdom, and Asia.
