SETTING THE SCENE

- Purdue welcomes Michigan to town for Homecoming as the BoilerMakers and Wolverines open Big Ten play.
- The BTN Tailgate show makes the trip to West Lafayette for the first time. The set will be at Cary Quadrangle, located immediately south of Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Purdue and Michigan square off for the first time since Oct. 6, 2012, when the Wolverines beat the BoilerMakers 44-13 in Ross-Ade Stadium.
- The game pits the two Big Ten head coaches who played quarterback in the NFL against each other. Jeff Brohm and Jim Harbaugh are two of the three head coaches in the Big Ten who played quarterback at the division I level (also Wisconsin's Paul Chryst).
- Purdue wrapped up the non-conference slate with a dominant 35-3 win at Missouri.
- Michigan finished its non-conference schedule with a 3-0 record after knocking off Air Force last week 22-13.
- The game is Purdue's third of the season against a Power Five Conference foe. The eighth-ranked Wolverines are the second ranked opponent the BoilerMakers play this season after opening with then-No. 16 Louisville.
- Purdue is 2-9-1 all-time against teams ranked eighth in the AP Poll. The last win over the No. 8 team in the country came Sept. 8, 1984 when the BoilerMakers beat Notre Dame 23-21 in Indianapolis.
- The game is Purdue's second of the season on Fox.

SERIES HISTORY

- Purdue and Michigan meet for the 59th time in series history. The BoilerMakers are 14-44 all-time against the Wolverines, including 9-16 at home.
- The meeting is the earliest in series history and the first time the teams meet in September.

HOMECOMING AT ROSS-ADE STADIUM

- Purdue is 50-40-4 all-time in Homecoming games.
- The BoilerMakers are looking for their first Homecoming win since 2011. Purdue beat #23 Illinois that year 21-14.
- Purdue is 0-1 all-time against Michigan in Homecoming games. The lone loss came in 1948.
- Saturday's game matches the earliest Homecoming in program history. The BoilerMakers played Sept. 23 Homecoming games in 2000 and 200, both wins over Minnesota.
- The last Purdue coach to win his first Homecoming game was Joe Tiller in 1997 when Purdue knocked off No. 24 Wisconsin 45-20.
- The BoilerMakers are 6-13 in Homecoming games when facing a ranked opponent.

▶ HEAD COACH JEFF BROHM (More on page 9)

- Jeff Brohm was named the 36th head coach of the Boilermakers on Dec. 5, 2016, becoming the first signal caller to lead the Cradle of Quarterbacks in nearly half a century.
- Brohm, who played collegiately at Louisville and for seven seasons in the National Football League, is widely regarded as one of the most innovative offensive masterminds in college football.

Brohm's Playing Career

- He was a three-year starter at Louisville, playing for the Cardinals from 1989 to 1993.
- He still ranks sixth in program history in touchdown passes (38), seventh in total offense (5,410), eighth in completion percentage (.562), eighth in passing yards (5,451), eighth in passing efficiency (129.97), ninth in passing attempts (715) and ninth in completions (402).
- Brohm was voted the team's Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior, and his number 11 became part of Louisville's Ring of Honor in 2006.
- Brohm still has the 11th longest touchdown pass in school with an 80-yard strike to Ralph Dawkins vs. Texas in 1993.
- Brohm threw 20 touchdown passes in 1993, which is tied for 10th most in a single season.
- Brohm played in the NFL with the San Diego Chargers (1994), Washington Redskins (1995-96), San Francisco 49ers (1997-98), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (1998), Denver Broncos (1999) and Cleveland Browns (2000).
- In eight career games - all with the 49ers - he completed 37-of-58 passes (63.8 percent) for 353 yards with one touchdown and one interception.
- His best game came Oct. 27, 1996, when he completed 19-of-30 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown to lead San Francisco to a 10-9 win over the Houston Oilers.
- In 2001, Brohm played in the XFL for the Orlando Rage and was named first team All-XFL.



Brohm at Western Kentucky

- Brohm came to the Boilermakers from Western Kentucky, where he compiled a remarkable 30-10 overall record (.750 winning percentage), including a 19-5 Conference USA mark (.792), from 2014 to 2016.
- The Hilltoppers were league champions in 2015 and 2016, the school's first back-to-back titles as an FBS member.

- They won the 2014 Bahamas Bowl (49-48 over Central Michigan) and the 2015 Miami Beach Bowl (45-35 over Miami, Fla.), as well as the 2016 Boca Raton Bowl (51-31 over Memphis under interim head coach Nick Holt).
- Western Kentucky was ranked No. 24 in the final 2015 Associated Press poll.
- Under Brohm, the Hilltoppers averaged 44.6 points, 356.6 passing yards and 526.2 yards of total offense per game over three seasons.
- Their starting quarterbacks completed 69.2 percent of their passes and threw 131 touchdowns with merely 25 interceptions.
- Western Kentucky broke more than 75 school offensive records since 2013, when Brohm served as assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

More On Brohm

- Brohm was a standout player at Trinity High School in Louisville, Kentucky.
- He won the Kentucky Mr. Football Award as a senior in 1988 while leading the Shamrocks to a state championship and undefeated season.
- Brohm was named the Kentucky High School Player of the Decade for the 1980s and was inducted into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 2014.
- A native of Louisville, Brohm (born April 24, 1971) earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1994.
- He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Brady, and a daughter, Brooke.
- Jeff is one of four family members to be a football letterwinner at Louisville, along with his father, Oscar (quarterback 1966-69), and brothers, Greg (wide receiver 1989-92) and Brian (quarterback 2004-07).
- The Brohm family, including mother, Donna, and sister, Kim, was inducted into the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame in 2013.

- Michigan senior offensive lineman **Patrick Kugler** is the younger brother of former Purdue center and captain **Robert Kugler**. Robert graduated in 2015.
- **Tony Levine**, Purdue's special teams coordinator, co-offensive coordinator and tight ends coach, was the head coach at Houston in 2013 and 2014 and had **John O'Korn**, Michigan's backup quarterback, as his starter both years. O'Korn appeared in 20 games, including 16 starts, for Levine and threw for 4,068 yards and 34 touchdowns. Under Levine, O'Korn set Houston freshman school records in touchdowns (28) and completions (259).
- Michigan backup quarterback **Brandon Peters** is the younger brother to Purdue volleyball junior defensive specialist Brooke Peters.
- The Wolverines have two players from Indiana - **Peters** (Avon/Avon) and running back **Chris Evans** (Indianapolis/Ben Davis).
- Purdue has five players from Michigan - **Eddy Wilson** (Pontiac/West Bloomfield), **Tim Cason** (Clarkston/Clarkston), **Navon Mosley** (West Bloomfield/West Bloomfield), **Bearooz Yacobi** (Dearborn/Dearborn) and **Wade Buckman** (Holland/Holland).

- **In 1967:** When junior quarterback Mike Engelbrecht was injured, sophomore Mike Phipps got the starting nod for the Boilermakers' season opener against Texas A&M at the Cotton Bowl. Phipps threw his first collegiate touchdown pass – a 35-yarder to senior halfback Bob Baltzell in the first quarter – and junior halfback Leroy Keyes rushed for a touchdown and threw for another to lead Purdue to a 24-20 victory.
- **NOTEWORTHY:** Wendell Phillips High School is located on the South Side of Chicago and opened in 1904. It is named for Wendell Phillips, an abolitionist who was one of the leading members of the American Anti-Slavery Society. The high school traces its history to 1875, when South Division High opened as the first public high school on Chicago's South Side.

WEEK 3 REWIND

- The Boilermakers won at Missouri 35-3.
- Purdue picked up its first non-conference road win since Sept. 1, 2007 when the Boilermakers won at Toledo 52-24.
- The win was Purdue's first non-conference win over a Power Five team since Sept. 29, 2007 when the Boilermakers beat Notre Dame at Ross-Ade Stadium 33-19.
- The win Purdue's first road win over a non-conference Power Five team since Sept. 17, 2005 when the Boilermakers won at Arizona 31-24.
- It was the first time Purdue held an opponent without a touchdown since the Boilermakers beat Southeast Missouri 59-0 on Sept. 17, 2011.
- It is the fewest points allowed in a road game since Oct. 25, 1997 when the Boilermakers won at Illinois 48-3.
- The 32-point win is Purdue's largest on the road since Sept. 4, 1999 when the Boilermakers won at Central Florida 47-13.
- Purdue scored on its first drive of the game with a 5-yard run from **David Blough**. The Boilermakers have scored first in all three games this season.
- Purdue outgained Missouri 230-17 in the first quarter and led 14-0.
- The last time Purdue led 14-0 after the first quarter on the road was 2007 at Minnesota.
- Purdue led 28-3 at the half. It is Purdue's biggest halftime lead on the road since the Boilermakers led 35-7 at Northwestern on Nov. 7, 1998.
- Purdue had 19 first downs in the first half while holding Missouri to four.
- The Boilermakers outgained Missouri 370-91 at the half, including just 23 rushing yards allowed.
- The Boilermakers recovered a fumble in the first half, their sixth recovery of the season. Purdue had four fumble recoveries all of 2016.

- Purdue finished with 26 first downs. The Boilermakers have had at least 25 first downs in all three games this season.
- It is the first time Purdue has won back-to-back games since the end of 2012 when the Boilermakers won their last three regular season games.
- Purdue outgained Missouri 407-203, including 205-70 on the ground.
- Purdue dominated the time of possession battle 43:43-16:17. That is the most time of possession the Boilermakers have had in more than 20 years.
- Purdue won the turnover battle 3-1 and outscored Missouri 7-3 off turnovers.
- The defense gave up just 2 of 11 third downs, while the offense converted 8 of 17.
- The Boilermakers were 4-for-4 in the red zone and are now 13-for-13 on the season inside the opponent's 20-yard line.
- The Boilermakers came up with two interceptions in the game, their first two for the year.
- Purdue is now 7-2 all-time against Missouri and 12-7 all-time against teams currently in the SEC.
- **Blough** made his first start of the season and completed 22 of 28 passes for 187 yards and a touchdown. He was 15 for 17 for 147 yards in the first half and also had a rushing score.
- **Elijah Sindelar** entered the game midway through the second quarter and led Purdue to a touchdown on his first drive. The score was a 5-yard pass to **Jackson Anthrop**. Sindelar finished 4 for 6 for 85 yards and a touchdown, as well as one interception on a tipped ball.
- **Markus Bailey** picked off the first pass of the season for the Purdue defense and returned it to the Missouri 2-yard line. The Boilermakers would score four plays later.
- **Kamal Hardy** picked off the first pass of his career in the fourth quarter to thwart Missouri's best chance at a touchdown.
- **Malcolm Dotson** recovered a fumble on a muffed punt, his first recovery.
- Purdue's 35 points scored are its most in a road game since Oct. 18, 2014 when the Boilermakers fell at Minnesota 39-38.
- The 35 points are the most in a road win since Oct. 4, 2014 when Purdue beat Illinois 38-27.

30-PLUS POINT ROAD WINS SINCE 1967

- The Boilermakers boast 10 road wins by 30-plus points in the last 50 seasons and 26 in school history. Six of them came before 1900.

- At Missouri, the Boilermakers were 4-for-4 in the red zone with four touchdowns.
- Seven of Purdue's red zone touchdowns have come through the air.
- In the red zone this season, Purdue is 15 for 19 passing with seven touchdowns.
- David Blough** is 12 for 13 with four touchdowns, while **Elijah Sindelar** is 3 for 6 with three scores.

DEFENSE MAKING PLAYS

- Purdue's defense had a pair of goal line stands against Louisville and the reigning Heisman Trophy winner, Lamar Jackson.
- The first came in the opening quarter when the Cardinals had 3rd & goal at Purdue's 1. Danny Ezechukwu picked up a Jackson fumble and dragged him to the 37-yard line.
- The second came early in the second quarter. Again at Purdue's 1, Ja'Whaun Bentley stripped running back Jeremy Smith as he reached for the end zone. Markus Bailey picked up the loose ball and returned it 19 yards to the Boilermakers' 20-yard line.
- The Cardinals had eight trips into the red zone and scored just three touchdowns and three field goals. The field goals were from 23, 30 and 32 yards.
- Purdue also stopped Louisville without points before the half as the Cardinals got to Purdue's 14-yard line as the clock expired.
- Louisville had four takeaways in the game, including one returned for a touchdown. On the other three, the defense forced two three-and-outs and came up with a fumble recovery.
- Against Ohio, Purdue stopped the Bobcats three times on the Boilermaker side of the field. Twice the stop led to a punt, while the other was a sack on fourth down.
- For the year, Purdue's defense has allowed scores on 11 of 40 possessions (27.5 percent), while forcing 18 punts (45.0 percent) and seven turnovers (17.5 percent).
- The longest pass Purdue has allowed this season is 39 yards vs. Louisville. It is the only 30-plus yard play the Boilermakers have allowed this year.
- Purdue is one of just nine teams to allow one or less 30-yard plays this season.
- The longest run Purdue has given up this season is 24 yards, which came against Ohio. Purdue has given up just two runs of 20-plus yards this season.

»Dominant at Missouri

- The defensive effort at Missouri was something not seen out of a Purdue team in a long while.

- Purdue held Missouri to 17 yards in the first quarter, 91 at the half, and 203 for the game.
- The defense forced five three-and-outs, while allowing more than one first down on a drive just on one of 13 drives.
- The most plays allowed on a drive was six, which happened just twice.
- Missouri's longest drive was 57 yards and ended with an interception by **Kamal Hardy**.
- The defense gave up just four first downs in the first half and 10 for the game.
- The score was 21-0 before Purdue allowed its second first down.
- The defense picked off two passes and recovered a fumble.
- Only three receivers were able to catch a pass.

PAIR OF TOUCHDOWN PASSES, PAIR OF QBS

- Elijah Sindelar** and **David Blough** both threw two touchdown passes against Louisville.
- The Boilermakers have not achieved that feat in a game since 1998 when the Boilermakers beat Indiana 52-7 in Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Drew Brees was 20 for 33 for 237 yards, four touchdowns and an interception before David Edgerton came in and completed 3 of 4 passes for 37 yards and two scores.
- Against Ohio, Sindelar had one touchdown pass, while Blough had three.
- At Missouri, Blough and Sindelar both threw for a touchdown.

BLOUGH DOMINANT IN FIRST HALVES

- David Blough** is 30 for 34 passing (.882) for 402 yards and three touchdowns, against zero interceptions, in first halves this season. He also has a rushing touchdown.
- Against Louisville, he was 9 for 10 for 80 yards and a touchdown in the first half. The one incomplection was a drop.
- Against Ohio, Blough was 6 of 7 for 175 yards and two touchdowns in the first half. The lone incomplection was a throwaway.
- At Missouri, his first start of the year, Blough was 15 of 17 for 147 yards with the incomplections coming on a drop and a throwaway. He also scored the game's first points on a rushing touchdown.

11 Purdue scored in its first 11 quarters of the season, before holding its 35-3 third-quarter lead at Missouri and winning by the same score.

9 Purdue is looking for its first win over a top-10 team in nine tries. The last time Purdue beat a top-10 team was No. 7 Ohio State in 2009.

8 Purdue is 8-for-8 on & Goal situations, scoring a touchdown on all eight possessions.

7 In the red zone this season, Purdue quarterbacks are 15 for 19 passing with seven touchdowns.

2 Danny Ezechukwu is tied for the national lead with two fumble recoveries.

1 Cole Herdman is No. 1 in the nation among tight ends in yards per reception this year. He averages 28.6 yards per catch this year.

0 Schopper has 12 punts on the season and zero have gone into the end zone for a touchback.

MORE TD PASSES THAN INCOMPLETIONS

- **David Blough** was 11-13 for 235 yards and three touchdowns against Ohio.
- He is the first Purdue quarterback to throw more touchdown passes than incompletions in a game (minimum 10 attempts) since Kyle Orton went 23 for 26 for 329 yards and five touchdowns against Ball State on Sept. 11, 2004.

CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH A TD PASS

- **David Blough** has thrown a touchdown pass in 15 straight games. That is the fourth longest active streak among FBS quarterbacks. This chart can be found on page 10.
- Blough is the first Purdue quarterback to throw a touchdown pass in at least 15 consecutive games since Drew Brees had a touchdown pass in 18 straight games in 1998 and 1999. Brees had a TD pass in all 13 games in 1998 and the first five games of 1999.

BLOUGH NAMED A MANNING STAR OF WEEK

- For his performance against Ohio, **David Blough** was named one of eight Manning Stars of the Week.
- Blough had the highest quarterback rating in the country for the week (minimum of five action plays) with a rating of 99.4.

BLOUGH AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS

- **David Blough** ranks 24th among active FBS quarterbacks for career passing yards with 5,336.
- That is eighth among non-senior QBs.
- He is second in the Big Ten behind only Ohio State senior J.T. Barrett.
- Blough ranks 14th in passing yards per game for his career with 222.3.

NEWCOMER NUMBERS

- Purdue had 16 newcomers (freshmen, transfers, 2016 newcomers who redshirted last year) play in the season opener. Seven more played against Ohio, including three true freshmen.
- Redshirt freshman **Jackson Anthrop** had the biggest day numbers-wise with seven catches for 82 yards and two touchdowns. He also had a carry for four yards and nine punt return yards.
- Junior college transfer wide receiver **Isaac Zico**, a junior, had two catches for 12 yards.
- Freshman **KeyRon Catlett** had four kickoff returns for 51 yards.
- **Spencer Evans**, a junior kicker who transferred from Baylor, made two extra points and put three of his five kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks.
- Grad transfer linebacker **T.J. McCollum** tied for second on the team with nine tackles.
- Grad transfer cornerback **Josh Okonye** tied for second on the team with nine tackles, including 1.0 for loss.
- Junior college transfer safety **T.J. Jallow** had six tackles.
- Grad transfer right tackle **David Steinmetz**, Northern Illinois transfer left guard **Shane Evans** and redshirt freshman left tackle **Grant Hermanns** all started on the offensive line.
- Redshirt freshman **Jared Sparks** played for the first time at quarterback and receiver against Ohio. He finished the game with four carries for 24 yards.
- Freshman **Derrick Barnes** played his first game against Ohio. In his second game - at Missouri - Barnes tied for second on the team with five tackles.

BRING THE BALL BY BENTLEY? BEWARE.

- Senior linebacker **Ja'Whaun Bentley** forced two fumbles against Louisville in the opener, both recovered by the Boilermakers.
- Bentley is one of just four players in the country who forced two fumbles in the first week of the season.
- He is one of just two who did so against a Power 5 Conference team.

HONORING BOB DEMOSS

- Throughout the 2017 season, the Boilermakers are honoring Bob DeMoss, the patriarch of the Cradle of Quarterbacks and a member of the Purdue Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Game with a helmet sticker and a flag atop section 101 of Ross-Ade Stadium. DeMoss, a former Boilermaker quarterback and head coach, passed away July 23 at age 90.
- DeMoss initially gained fame as a freshman at Purdue in 1945. He helped the Boilermakers win their first four games and move into the national rankings at No. 9. Their next opponent was fourth-ranked Ohio State on Oct. 20 in Columbus. Purdue raced to a 28-0 lead and went on to an improbable 35-13 victory before 73,585 fans, the most ever to watch the Boilermakers at that time.
- DeMoss went on to be Purdue's primary quarterback through 1948, passing for 2,759 yards and 23 touchdowns during his career, and then played professionally with the New York Bulldogs in 1949.
- DeMoss subsequently embarked on a 42-year tenure at Purdue as an assistant coach (1950-69), head coach (1970-72) and assistant athletics director (1973-92). Along the way, he recruited and developed many members of the Cradle - Dale Samuels, Len Dawson, Bob Griese, Mike Phipps and Gary Danielson - earning fame as a "quarterback architect."
- DeMoss was the last quarterback to coach the Boilermaker until head coach Jeff Brohm.



HOPKINS AND HERDMAN

- Junior Cole Herdman and sophomore Brycen Hopkins entered the season as the top returning Power Five Conference touchdown-catching tight end duo after combining for seven TD grabs in 2016.
- No returning Power Five tight end had more touchdown catches than Hopkins' four last year.
- This season, Herdman and Hopkins have combined for 16 catches for 341 yards and three touchdowns.
- All seven of Herdman's catches have been for first downs, while five of Hopkins' nine catches have moved the chains. Another of Hopkins' grabs was for a touchdown on a 2nd & goal.
- Herdman leads all tight ends this season with 28.6 yards per catch. Hopkins is fifth among Power Five tight ends at 15.6 yards per catch.

- **Tario Fuller** has started all three games at running back this season, the first three starts of his career.
- Against Ohio, he eclipsed 100 yards with more than 7 minutes left in the second quarter.
- He finished the game with 16 carries for 142 yards and a touchdown, the first score of his career.
- It is the first time Fuller has rushed for 100+ yards in a game. He is the 71st player in school history with at least one game rushing for 100+ yards.
- Fuller is the fourth player on the current roster with a 100+yard rushing game.

- Fuller needed two starts to have a 100-yard rushing game, though in the opener, he started alongside Jones, while against Ohio he was the lone running back starter.
- Fuller's 142 rushing yards are the most by a Boilermaker since Jones rushed for 145 yards in Purdue's season opener against Eastern Kentucky last season. They are the most against an FBS opponent since Jones' 157 against No. 2 Michigan State in 2015.
- Fuller's previous long rush for his career was 9

yards, which came last season against Nevada. Against Ohio, Fuller averaged 8.9 yards per carry on 16 carries and had rushes of 9, 9, 13, 22, 23 and 39 yards in the game.

- Purdue has won four games in a row when it has a 100-yard rusher.

ESTABLISHING THE GROUND GAME

- The Boilermakers have established the run during its back-to-back wins.
- Against Ohio, Purdue rushed 44 times for 263 yards and a touchdown.
- At Missouri, the Boilermakers rushed 50 times for 205 yards and three scores.
- The Missouri game is the first time Purdue has rushed the ball at least 50 times since Dec. 27, 2011 in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl against Western Michigan. The Boilermakers rushed 56 times in that game.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

- Twelve Boilermakers have made their first start for the Old Gold and Black this season, including 10 that came in the season opener against Louisville.
- Senior wide receiver **Anthony Mahoungou** made his first start against Louisville and had four catches for 33 yards, including one that went for a first down.
- Redshirt freshman **Grant Hermanns** made his first collegiate appearance as the starter at left tackle against Louisville. He is Purdue's first freshman - true or redshirt - to start at left tackle in the season opener since Mike Otto in 2003. Otto went on to be drafted by the Tennessee Titans in 2007.
- Junior **Shane Evans**, an immediately eligible transfer from Northern Illinois, started his first collegiate game. Evans, who appeared in 18 games for the Huskies, was the starting left guard against Louisville.
- Graduate transfer **David Steinmetz** is no stranger to starting as he now has 31 collegiate starts. The first 29, though, came at FCS Rhode

Island. He started his first FBS game at right tackle against Louisville.

- Junior kicker **Spencer Evans** is an immediately eligible transfer from Baylor. He was their starting kickoff specialist, and started at the same spot for Purdue against Louisville. He also made two extra points, splitting time with **J.D. Dellinger**.
- Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Jackson Anthrope** started at one of the wide receiver positions against Louisville and led the team with seven catches for 82 yards and two touchdowns. He is the first freshman with two touchdowns in a season opener since Kory Sheets had a pair of scores against Akron in 2005. Sheets' TDs came on a blocked punt and a rush. No freshman receiver has hauled in two touchdown catches in a season opener since pre-1999.
- Sophomore **Tario Fuller** carried the ball eight times for 29 yards against Louisville. He was the team's leading rusher in his first career start.
- Graduate transfer linebacker **T.J. McCollum** has started 27 games at the FBS level, but 25 came before joining the Boilermakers. The transfer from Western Kentucky, who started at UAB, was second on the team with nine tackles in the opener.
- Graduate transfer cornerback **Josh Okonye** appeared in 37 collegiate games at Wake Forest, but his first start came against Louisville. He finished with nine tackles, including the team's only tackle for loss.
- Junior college transfer safety **T.J. Jallow** made his first start against Louisville. He finished with six tackles.
- Junior defensive tackle **Keiwan Jones** made his first start against Ohio and finished with two tackles.
- Junior offensive lineman **Eric Swingler** made his first career start at Missouri. He was officially a tight end.

BROHM BRINGS THE OFFENSE

- The Boilermakers scored 107 points in their first three games under head coach Jeff Brohm.
- That total ranks as the fourth-most by a Purdue team under a first-year coach. Here are the top 10:

- Brohm's point total came against two Power Five conference foes.

SURE-HANDED HERDMAN

- Junior tight end **Cole Herdman** has caught at least one pass in 20 straight games.
- In that span, he has 51 catches for 615 yards and five touchdowns.
- He extended the streak in the opener with an 11-yard reception from David Blough in the second quarter against Louisville.
- Against Ohio, Herdman's streak continued with a 62-yard touchdown reception from Blough in the second quarter. It was the longest reception



of his career.

- At Missouri, the streak continued when Elijah Sindelar hit him for a 54-yard gain in the second quarter. It was the second longest reception of his career and the longest non-touchdown catch.
- Herdman has seven catches this year, all for first downs.

SEASON ODDS AND ENDS

- **Jackson Anthrop** had two touchdown catches in the season opener against Louisville to become the first freshman in school history with multiple receiving TDs in a season opener (freshman became eligible to play varsity in 1972).
- **Ja'Whaun Bentley** forced two fumbles in the season opener, one of just four players in the country to do so in week one.
- Transfer kicker **Spencer Evans** had seven touchbacks against Ohio matching Purdue's total for all of 2016. Evans has 14 touchbacks through the first three games.
- No returning FBS tight end had more touchdown catches last season than **Brycen Hopkins**, who had four. Hopkins has two through two games this season.
- Purdue's schedule is tied for the sixth toughest in terms of bowl teams from last year. The Boilermakers face nine teams that played in a bowl last season.
- The Boilermakers have thrown at least one touchdown pass in 20 straight games. The last time Purdue did not have a touchdown pass was Oct. 17, 2015, when the Boilermakers fell at Wisconsin 24-7.
- **David Blough** is 16 for 21 for 215 yards on first downs this season.
- **Joe Schopper** has 12 punts for 586 yards, an average of 48.8 yards per punt this season. That ranks fourth in the country this year. Half his punts have been 50+, while five have been downed inside the opponents 20. He has zero touchbacks.
- For his career, Schopper has 49 punts downed inside the 20, compared to just eight touchbacks.

EARLY LEADS

- Purdue has scored first in all three games this season.
- The Boilermakers have also had the halftime lead in all three games this year.
- Dating to last season, Purdue has scored first in six straight games.

FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE COMPLEX

- The football performance complex, which is located adjacent to the north end of the Mollenkopf Athletic Center, was completed in August of 2017.
- The three-level structure – amassing 112,000 square feet – includes a locker room, team meeting room, position group meeting rooms, player development room, weight room, sports medicine and hydrotherapy area, nutrition station, and coaches' and support staff offices, as well as a grand entrance lobby showcasing the Boilermakers' history and tradition.
- The state-of-the-art complex has significantly enhanced the football student-athlete experience. In addition to the first-class amenities, having all of them located in one facility results in more efficient use of the student-athletes' time. Previously, football-related facilities were housed in multiple buildings.
- A \$65 million project, the football performance

complex was designed by Populous, while construction was managed by the Hunt Construction Group. The groundbreaking ceremony took place April 15, 2016 – with 11 Purdue Super Bowl champions in attendance – and construction took 16 months. The facility was dedicated Sept. 8, 2017.

BLOUGH PERFORMANCE OVATION-WORTHY

- Junior quarterback David Blough has put up impressive numbers on the field, but his biggest ovation may have come at the Big Ten Football Media Luncheon in Chicago over the summer.
- Blough was selected by the conference as the student-athlete keynote speaker for the luncheon and was given five minutes to talk about his platform as a student-athlete.
- Blough received a standing ovation after delivering a message about football teaching life. He mentioned how football challenges individuals to rise above adversity and work with the diversity within their communities or locker rooms.
- Blough also touched on his service trips to South Africa where he and teammates have worked at an orphanage.

BLOUGH'S SUMMER WITH THE MANNINGS

- Junior quarterback David Blough spent time this summer working at the Manning Passing Academy in Thibodaux, Louisiana. He was selected by a panel that included Archie Manning.
- At the camp, which was in its 22nd year, counselors worked extensively with the younger campers, from 1-on-1 instruction to teaching technique and fundamentals, to various other drills.
- Blough was among more than 25 other college quarterbacks, including Lamar Jackson of Louisville.
- In evening meetings, Blough and the other college quarterbacks were able to pick the Mannings' brains on everything from game preparation, film study, technique and more.

BLOUGH ON MULTIPLE WATCH LISTS

- Blough was named the the Wuerffel watch list. The award, named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Danny Wuerffel, is presented annually to a player who best

- combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement.
- Blough is also on the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award watch list.
- The Golden Arm Award is presented at the end of each football season and the winner is selected based on his accomplishments both on and off the field. Candidates must be a college senior or fourth-year junior on schedule to graduate with their class.

SECOND QUARTER SUCCESS

- Through three games, Purdue has dominated the second quarters.
- The Boilermakers are outscoring their opposition 45-6 in second quarters this season.
- Against Louisville, Purdue outscored the Cardinals 7-3 in the second quarter.
- Against Ohio, Purdue outscored the Bobcats 24-0.
- At Missouri, Purdue outscored the Tigers 14-3 in the second quarter.
- Second quarter success is a staple of Jeff Brohm teams. In his fourth season as a collegiate head coach, Brohm teams score an average of 14.73 points per second quarter. That ranks No. 1 of any active head coach in the country since 2014 (min. second year).

THE CAPTAINS

- The Boilermakers voted on captains in the team's first meeting of fall camp. Six individuals were chosen with three on offense and three on defense.
- The offensive captains are junior center **Kirk Barron**, junior quarterback **David Blough** and senior wide receiver **Gregory Phillips**.
- The defensive captains are senior linebacker **Ja'Whaun Bentley**, senior linebacker **Danny Ezechukwu** and senior cornerback **Da'Wan Hunte**.
- Barron, Blough, Ezechukwu, Hunte are Phillips were selected for the first time in their career.
- Bentley has been voted a captain three years in a row. He is the first three-time captain in program history.

THREE-TIME CAPTAINS

- Bentley is Purdue's first three-time captain in school history. The feat is not only rare to Purdue, it is scare in college football.
- Just six current athletes in FBS are a three-time captain, including Bentley.

1967 BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON FACT

- When junior quarterback Mike Engelbrecht was injured, sophomore Mike Phipps got the starting nod for the Boilermakers' season opener against Texas A&M at the Cotton Bowl on Sept. 23.
- Phipps threw his first collegiate touchdown pass – a 35-yarder to senior halfback Bob Baltzell in the first quarter – and junior halfback Leroy Keyes rushed for a touchdown and threw for another to lead Purdue to a 24-20 victory.

- Purdue allowed just 10 first downs at Missouri, which is tied for the second best effort by a Brohm team.
- The Boilermakers allowed just 203 yards at Missouri, which is the third best effort by a Brohm team and best against a Power Five team.
- Danny Ezechukwu had a 34-yard fumble return against Louisville, which is the third longest fumble return by an individual under Brohm.
- Jackson Anthrop's two touchdown receptions against Louisville are the 24th time an individual under Brohm has caught at least as many touchdowns in a single game.

LONG DRIVE CONTEST

- The Boilermakers have 14 touchdown drives on the season. Of those 14, 10 have been at least 60 yards.
- Purdue's longest touchdown drive this season is 97 yards, which came against Ohio. The Boilermakers went 9 plays, 97 yards in 4:03 capped by a 1-yard **Tario Fuller** touchdown run.
- At Missouri, Purdue had its second longest touchdown drive of the year, marching 96 yards for the score. That drive was 13 plays, 96 yards in 6:59 capped by a **Richie Worship** 3-yard touchdown run.
- The third longest touchdown drive of the year is 87 yards at Missouri. The Boilermakers used seven plays in 2:49 to score, capped by a 36-yard run by **Fuller**.
- The Boilermakers also had an 84-yard touchdown drive against the Bobcats, which now ranks as the fourth longest drive of the year. That scoring drive was 10 plays, 84 yards in 5:05 capped by a 5-yard pass from **David Blough** to **Jackson Anthrop**.
