## #BOILERNOTES

The Boilermakers continue their early-season homestand Thursday, welcoming Western Illinois to Mackey Arena for a 7 p.m. ET tip, live on the Big Ten Network. It marks the eighth all-time meeting between the Boilermakers and Leathernecks, and the first since 2010.

Purdue has started the season at 2-0, needing some late-game heroics to edge out Harvard for a home-opening 66-65 win Sunday. Junior Ae'Rianna Harris canned the decisive free throw with 0.8 seconds left and stole the ensuing inbounds pass to cap off a 19-point, 14-rebound performance. Sophomore Karissa McLaughlin and junior Dominique Oden both finished in double figures as McLaughlin tallied 17 points and six assists, while Oden had 15 points and three steals. The Boilermakers were near-perfect at the free throw line, converting 17-of-19 tries.

Western Illinois got the season off to a bumpy start, falling at home to Missouri (89-64) and Drake (98-71) before earning their first win of the season Monday. The Leathernecks downed visiting MacMurray College 136-39, breaking the program's scoring record and hitting a school-record 28 3-point field goals. Head coach JD Gravina moved into second all-time on the Leathernecks' coaching wins list with the victory.

**TEAM NOTES**

- Purdue is in its 44th season of women's basketball, holding a 845-466 all-time record
- The Boilermakers opened the season on the road for the third straight season and the fourth time in the last five years, earning an 80-38 win at Ball State
- Purdue is now 36-8 all-time in season openers, including a 9-6 record on the road and a 12-1 mark under Versyp
- The win was the fifth-largest road win in program history and the biggest since a 43-point win at Butler in 2006
- The opener is the 36th time Purdue has held an opponent under 40 points, remaining undefeated all-time when doing so, and the 44th time the Boilermakers have beat a team by 40 points or more
- Purdue pulled down 51 rebounds, it's most in the last two seasons, and the Boilermakers' 24 offensive boards were their most since securing 25 vs. Northwestern in 2014
- The Boilermaker bench chipped in 33 points, its highest mark since adding 54 points vs. Incarnate Word in 2015
- Purdue had 16 steals against Ball State, its most since Nov. 28, 2012 vs. Georgia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge
- The Boilermakers are now 42-2 all-time in home openers, including a 12-1 mark under Versyp
- Sunday's one-point win over Harvard marked Purdue's first since a 74-73 win over Iowa in 2014
- After shooting 55 percent at the free throw line in the opener, the Boilermakers bounced back and cashed in 17-of-19 against Harvard
- The Crimson were the first of three inaugural opponents on the Purdue schedule this season, and the Boilermakers are now 143-54 all-time in first-ever meetings
- In its first two games Purdue is averaging 20.5 offensive rebounds per game and 20.0 second chance points
- Purdue owns an active streak of 28 consecutive wins when leading after three quarters, including a 17-0 mark last season, and last surrendered a fourth-quarter lead on Jan. 15, 2017 to 11th-ranked Ohio State
- The Boilermakers' four returning starters marks their most since the 2011-12 season, when they returned four as well
- With Ae'Rianna Harris and Dominique Oden earning Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media, Purdue is one-of-two schools to have two players on both teams (Iowa)

**HEAD COACH SHARON VERSYP**

- In her 13th season on the Boilermaker sidelines, Versyp now has the longest tenure of any coach in program history
- She is the winningest coach in program history, owning 259 victories at Purdue
- Has nine 20-win campaigns in 12 seasons with the Boilermakers, and has won at least 20 games in 12 of 18 career seasons as a head coach
- Versyp is tied with Lin Dunn for the Boilermakers' career Big Ten Conference wins mark at 120 heading into 2018-19
- Her 129 career Big Ten wins are ranked eighth in conference history, are third-most among active coaches and are seven wins shy of moving up to fifth all-time (136, Jim Foster, Ohio State)
- Her 22 career Big Ten Tournament victories are an event record, breaking the previous mark (shared by Jim Foster and Rene Portland) with Purdue's 2017 quarterfinal win over Indiana
- She's led the Boilermakers to the Big Ten Tournament championship game six times in 12 seasons (four titles)
- Versyp has guided Purdue to a program-record nine NCAA Tournament appearances in 12 seasons
- The Boilermakers are 1-of-25 schools to make at least nine tournaments over Versyp's tenure as head coach, and 1-of-5 schools in the Big Ten Conference

**#1 KARISSA MCLAUGHLIN**

- Her six assists against Harvard marked her 15th career game with at least five, improving her squad's record to 13-2 when she hits the mark
- Hit four 3's at Ball State to open the season, her sixth career game with at least four triples
- Earned 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors, becoming 10th player in Purdue history, fifth under Versyp and first Boilermaker since 2013
- Her 75 3-point field goals in 2017-18 are most-ever by a Purdue freshman, third-most in a season in Boilermaker history and second-most by a returning player in the Big Ten

**#2 ABBY ABEL**

- Named the co-Grand Marshal of the 2018 Indianapolis 500 Festival Parade for her work with the Special Olympics
- Was the keynote speaker at the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games in Seattle
- Created an annual Special Olympics "Play Unified" event at Purdue, which has been held at Cardinal Court in Mackey Arena the last two years with students from across the athletics department and campus

**#3 LYNDESEY WHILBY**

- The Boilermakers' leading scorer off the bench after two games, averaging 9.5 points in 16.5 minutes per game
- Averaging a team-high 23.0 points per 40 minutes
- Hitting 80 percent from 3-point range (4-5)
- Transferred to Purdue after one season at Texas Tech, where she averaged 7.2 points in 30 games and nine starts for the Red Raiders
- A three-time Georgia AAAAAA State Champion at McEachern High School

**#5 CASSIDY HARDIN**

- Started the season-opener at Ball State, becoming the second freshman in as many years to do so (McLaughlin)
- Averaging 2.5 assists in 17 minutes per game
- Hit 96 3-pointers as a senior at Center Grove High School, a school record and the fifth-most in a season in Indiana state history
- Made 260 career 3-pointers, good for eighth-most in state history
- McDonald's All-America nominee

**#11 DOMINIQUE ODEN**

- Led the team with 17 points in the opener, marking the sixth time in the last eight games she's led the Boilermakers in scoring
- Hitting a team-best 47.6 percent from the field (10-21)
- Matched a career high with four steals at Ball State, and has a conference-best seven steals after two games
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- Earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media
- Averaged 18.8 points over the final 15 games of the 2017-18 season, topping the 20-point mark nine times
- Led Purdue in scoring at 14.1 points per game, becoming the first sophomore to lead the Boilermakers since 2009-10
- Her nine 20-point games are tied for third-most in Purdue history by a Boilermaker sophomore and the most in Big Ten and postseason play

 - Currently 11th on Purdue's career 3-point percentage list, hitting 36.8 percent from deep  
 - Interning in the school of civil engineering for the 2018-19 academic year, working on a variety of projects on campus including Ross-Ade Stadium and State Street

### #12 NORA KIESLER

- Graduated in August of 2018, with her bachelor's degree from the Krannert School of Management  
 - Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree  
 - Interned in the John Purdue Club in the summer of 2018

### #13 AJAH STALLINGS

- Second preferred walk-on in Versyp's 13 seasons as Purdue's head coach  
 - 2018 Indiana high school honorable mention all-state  
 - Featured by ESPNW in 2015

### #15 LÉONY BOUDREAU

- Along with Dawson College teammate Tamara Farquhar, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history  
 - Majoring in biomedical engineering with goals to work with and build prosthetics for paraolympic athletes

### #22 JENELLE GRANT

- Transferred to Purdue from the University of the Pacific, where she appeared in 56 games for the Tigers, including 23 starts  
 - Averaged 7.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game in 2017-18  
 - A native of London, England, she's the first british player in Boilermaker history

### #23 KAYANA TRAYLOR

- Earned her first career start Sunday vs. Harvard  
 - Put up 12 points, four assists and three steals at Ball State, hitting 6-of-6 at the free throw line  
 - Second Purdue freshman in as many years to score in double figures in their first career game (McLaughlin)  
 - Set Martinsville High School records for scoring (2114), assists (437), free throws (472) and games played (98)  
 - 2018 Indiana Miss Basketball finalist  
 - McDonald's All-America nominee

### #25 TAMARA FARQUHAR

- Matched a career high with 13 rebounds in the season opener, including four on the offensive end  
 - Also tied career-high marks at Ball State for steals, three, and assists, two  
 - Started 17-of-34 games as a freshman, becoming one of five rookie starters for Versyp's career  
 - Set top-10 Purdue freshman marks for rebounding (163) and blocked shots (28)

- Along with Dawson College teammate Léony Boudreau, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history

### #30 NYAGOA GONY

- Tallied five points, nine rebounds and a pair of blocked shots in her collegiate debut, playing 16 minutes  
 - Led Lincoln High School to its first state championship appearance in 14 years in 2018  
 - Two-time honorable mention all-state honoree  
 - Led the state of Nebraska in rebounding in 2015-16

### #32 AE'RIANNA HARRIS

- Posted her 10th career double-double and first of the season with 19 points and 14 rebounds vs. Harvard  
 - Tied for 15th in program history on the double-double list  
 - Blocked three shots in the season opener, marking her 35th career game with at least three rejections  
 - Named to Lisa Leslie Award preseason watch list for the nation's top center  
 - 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)  
 - 2018 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the third Boilermaker to earn the honor and third sophomore in conference history to take home the award  
 - One-of-3 players (only one to return in 2018-19) in the NCAA last season to post 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots

 - The second player in Boilermaker history to block at least 100 shots in a season, rejecting 105, three shy of Purdue's single-season record and tied for 13th-most in a season in Big Ten Conference history

### #45 FATOU DIAGNE

- Sat out the 2017-18 season at Purdue due to injuries (foot)  
 - Played on back-to-back NJCAA National Championship teams at Gulf Coast State College  
 - Second player in program history from Senegal, following Aya Traore (2004-06)

### OPPONENT NOTES

- Western Illinois comes to Mackey Arena for the first time since 2010, meeting the Boilermakers for the eighth in series history  
 - The Leathernecks are 1-2 on the season, falling to Missouri and Drake to open the year before an 136-39 over Division III opponent MacMurray College on Monday  
 - Western Illinois set program records for scoring and 3-point field goals as they hit 28-of-59 from distance  
 - The victory made head coach JD Gravina tied for second in program history in wins, matching Bea Yeager (1971-82) with 122  
 - The Leathernecks have been one of the top teams in The Summit League over the past few seasons, winning the 2017 conference title and earning an NCAA Championship bid, and earning a WNIT bid in 2018  
 - Junior Annabel Graettinger is leading the Leathernecks in scoring through three games at 17.0 points per game, including an 8-for-8 performance against MacMurray on Monday
