THE NOTES TO KNOW

- For the first time in 21 days, the Purdue men's basketball team will play a game in Mackey Arena when it hosts MAC power Toledo at 6 p.m. ET, on Sunday. It marks the final non-conference game for the Boilermakers who are looking to snap a two-game losing skid, albeit to teams ranked in the top 20. The Boilermakers are undefeated at home, having won 23 straight games dating to the 2022-23 season.
- Purdue has won 23 straight home games, the seventh-longest homecourt winning streak in the country, and third longest in Mackey Arena history. The Boilermakers have won 31 straight home games against non-conference opponents, the longest streak in school history.
- The contest marks just the fifth game in the month of December for Purdue, the fewest in the month of December of the **Matt Painter** era and the fewest since the 1952-53 season.
- The 21-day span between home games mark the longest in-season "home" break of the **Matt Painter** era (previously: 20 days in the 2019-20 season) and the longest since the 1998-99 season (32 days; Dec. 12 to Jan. 13).
- Purdue owns the sixth-hardest schedule in the country (KenPom) and the second-most difficult among high-major programs (North Carolina). Toledo marks the first opponent outside the top 32 in the NCAA NET ratings in over a month (North Carolina State on Nov. 28).
- In eight wins, Purdue averages 10.1 turnovers per game, while forcing 10.5. In the four losses, it averages 16.8 turnovers, while forcing 12.2.
- Since the start of the 2021-22 season, Purdue is 40-3 (.930) in regular-season, non-conference play. Kansas (44-6) and Houston (44-6) own the next best non-conference, regular-season records (.880). Among Big Ten teams, Wisconsin is next at 35-7 (.833).
- Purdue has won 25 straight games when holding its opponent under 70 points. The last loss came to Fairleigh Dickinson in the first round of the 2023 NCAA Tournament.
- In the last four years, Purdue has defeated teams ranked No. 1 (Arizona), No. 2 (Alabama), No. 4 (Marquette), No. 5 (Villanova), No. 6 (Wisconsin, Tennessee, Gonzaga), No. 7 (Tennessee), No. 8 (Duke) and No. 9 (Illinois). All but Alabama and Illinois came away from Mackey Arena.
- Purdue is now 100-23 since the start of the 2021-22 season, recording the third-most wins in the country (Houston - 105; Connecticut - 101) during that span. The senior class of **Caleb Furst** (only senior) became the seventh class in school history with 100 career victories.
- Purdue is being outscored in second-chance points (133 to 145) and points off turnovers (152 to 170) by a combined 30 points (285 to 315). A year ago, Purdue outscored its opponents in those categories by a combined 64 points (927 to 863).
- The starting backcourt of **Braden Smith** and **Fletcher Loyer** are 71-15 since their arrival at Purdue, starting every game of their tenure. The duo has combined for 1,909 points, 596 rebounds and 728 assists during their careers, shooting 265-of-666 from deep (.398).
- Braden Smith** needs 37 points to be the first Big Ten player to have 1,000 points, 500 assists and 400 rebounds by the end of his junior year.
- Braden Smith** is the only player in America to have at least 150 points, 100 assists and 50 rebounds. He is on pace to become the first player nationally since 2015-16 (and second Big Ten player ever - **Magic Johnson**) to average 12 points, 8 assists, 4 rebounds and 2 steals in a season.
- Trey Kaufman-Renn** is the only player in America to average 17.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and shoot at least 57 percent from the field. He has scored in double-figures in all 12 games this season and ranks seventh in the Big Ten in scoring.
- Matt Painter** needs one Big Ten win to tie **Ward "Piggy" Lambert** (228) for fourth place on the Big Ten's wins list for conference games.
- Purdue, Duke, Gonzaga and Houston are the only programs in America to have made at least a Sweet 16, Elite 8 and Final Four during their last five NCAA Tournament appearances. Purdue reached the Sweet 16 in 2022, the Elite 8 in 2019 and the Final Four in 2024.

▶▶▶ SERIES WITH THE ROCKETS

- Purdue leads the all-time series with Toledo by a 3-1 margin, but will face the Rockets for the first time in almost 40 years when Toledo visits Mackey Arena on Sunday.
- Purdue is 58-16 all-time against the Mid-American Conference, having won seven games in a row. Under **Matt Painter**, the Boilermakers are 15-1 against teams from the MAC.

- Purdue's schedule already ranks sixth in the country according to KenPom, and is the second-hardest schedule among high-major programs behind North Carolina.
- Including last year, nine of Purdue's 22 non-conference games came against nationally-ranked teams (Gonzaga, Tennessee, Marquette twice, Arizona, Alabama, Ole Miss, Texas A&M, Auburn).
- The Boilermakers' seven quad-one games are tied with Auburn and North Carolina for the most in the country, while the three quad-one victories are tied for the fourth most nationally (behind Auburn, UConn and Oregon).
- Last year's schedule ranked No. 2 in the country in all metrics.

▶▶▶ HOW GOOD THIS PROGRAM IS

- To show how good this Purdue Basketball program is, take a look at these notes.
- ... three non-conference losses are the most since 2019-20 (4).
- ... Purdue is 1-3 in the month of December, its first time with a winning percentage under 40 percent in a month since Jan. 2020 (3-5, .375).
- Purdue's losses in the month of December has come against teams ranked 1st (Auburn), 27th (Texas A&M) and 32nd (Penn State) in the latest NET rankings, all away from home.
- ... Over the last three seasons, Purdue's fourth loss of the year came on March 16 (2024), Feb. 16 (2023) and Feb. 10 (2022).
- ... Purdue has lost back-to-back games for the first time since Feb. 2023, and back-to-back non-conference games for the first time since Nov. 2019 (vs. Texas, Marquette).

▶▶▶ TURNOVERS TELL THE STORY

- One stat determines Purdue's success – turnovers
- Since the 2021-22 season, when Purdue has five or more turnovers than its opponent, Purdue is 20-15 (.571). In all other games, Purdue is 80-8 (.909).
- In Purdue's four losses this season, Purdue has recorded 67 (16.8 / game), resulting in 95 points off turnovers (23.8 / game). In the four games, Purdue has been outscored in points off turnovers by 50 points (95-45), losing the four games by a combined 51 points.
- In Purdue's nine losses since the start of last season, Purdue has turned the ball over 57 more times than its opponent (+6.3 / game).
- In Purdue's 15 losses since the start of the 2022-23 season, Purdue is plus-83 in turnover margin (+5.5 / game).
- Since the 2021-22 season, Purdue is 49-5 when forcing 10 or more turnovers in a game. When Purdue has single-digit turnovers, Purdue owns a 35-2 record in that span.
- Purdue has played nine teams that ranked in the top 100 in defensive turnover percentage (Ole Miss, Penn State, Marquette, Maryland, NC State, Northern Kentucky, Texas A&M, Texas A&M-CC), including four of the top 13 (Ole Miss, PSU, Marquette, Maryland).

- With 16 NCAA Tournament berths, seven Sweet 16 appearances, five Big Ten regular-season championships, two Big Ten Tournament titles, two Elite Eight appearances, a trip to the Final Four, an appearance in a National Championship game and an international gold medal on his résumé, 20th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter was named the 2019 and 2024 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to nine straight NCAA Tournaments – the fourth-longest active streak in America. Included in that stretch are Sweet 16 appearances (and beyond) in five of the last seven tournaments.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.
- Painter will enter the 2024-25 season second on the school's all-time wins list (447) behind legendary mentor **Gene Keady** and ahead of **Ward "Piggy" Lambert**, both of whom have been inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Has averaged over 23 wins a season in his 19 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year (9-19 record), the average balloons to 24.3 wins per year over the last 18 seasons.
- Has won at least 25 games in 12 of his 20 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Painter has averaged 11.9 wins per year in conference play, the third-best average in Big Ten Conference history.
- He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.
- Coach Painter's 16 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of April 1, 2024 – Painter is 53 years old).
- Purdue has finished first, second or third in Big Ten play in 11 of the last 17 years, including in eight of the last 10 years.
