## GAME NOTES

- With the win, Matt Painter now is 144-65 in his career at Purdue.
- Purdue has now won 24-straight in Mackey Arena. This is the second longest streak on the Mackey Arena records list.
- The Boilermakers are 93-12 at Mackey Arena under the direction of Matt Painter. Purdue is 39-11 under Painter in the month of December, having won 17 of their last 18 December games.
- This was the third time the Boilermakers and the Eagles have faced-off. Last time they played was 11/17/08; Purdue senior Robbie Hummel led the team in scoring. Hummel had 18 points in the game. In today's contest he had 13 points; he has scored in double figures in every game this season.
- Purdue averages 8.5 makes from behind the arc per contest. In today's game they had nine three pointers made.
- The Boilermakers are forcing opponents into an average of 16.2 turnovers per game. In today's game Purdue forced 16 turnovers.
- In the first half the Boilermakers had a run of 10-2 spanning 4:52. The Eagles had cut the lead to one point before Purdue made this run. Senior Lewis Jackson and junior Kelsey Barlow both hit three pointers during the run.
- Junior John Hart made his first appearance of the season for the Boilermakers. Hart has been recovering from foot surgery.

## TEAM HIGHS AND LOWS

- Hummel led the Boilermakers in points and rebounds, 13 and eight respectively.
- The leading scorer off the bench for Purdue was sophomore Terone Johnson. Terone had nine points for the game. Redshirt freshman Anthony Johnson had seven for the game. Coming into today's game both had combined to average 14.7 points per game.
- Purdue controlled the offensive glass in today's game. As a team the Boilermakers had 15 offensive rebounds. Leading the way on the offensive boards were Hummel and junior D.J. Byrd who had four each. Byrd had a season high six rebounds for the game.

## CAREER ACCOLADES

- Sophomore Travis Carroll had a new career high in blocks with three for the game.
