PURDUE TO OPEN OCTOBER WITH HOME GAME VS. NEBRASKA

• As the calendar flips to October this week, the Boilermakers begin the home stretch with their final Friday night game of the year. Nebraska comes to West Lafayette for the third time since joining the Big Ten in time for the 2011-12 school year. Purdue's only win vs. the Huskers as conference rivals was an overtime result in Lincoln in 2012. The Boilers have not beaten Nebraska in West Lafayette since 2005.

BOILERS LOOKING TO END POST-SEPTEMBER STRUGGLES

• From 2000 to 2009, Purdue won 10-plus games for 10 consecutive seasons. Part of the reason the Boilers have not won more than eight games since 2009 is their struggles after the calendar flips to October. Since the beginning of the 2012 season, Purdue has won only two games in October or November (both coming in 2013). Furthermore, the Boilers have not won a game after October 7 since 2011. In fact, the 2011 team was responsible for three of Purdue's six October wins since the start of 2010.

• While it is true that the schedule gets tougher as Big Ten play heats up in October, the Boilers have actually held their own in conference play in September. Since 2010, Purdue is 8-13-3 (.396) in September Big Ten games, accounting for more than half of its point-producing results in conference action the last six years (14-42-4 B1G overall, .267). Ultimately, to have a successful season, the Boilers will have to find a way to win games consistently after Sept. 30 at some point.

NELLAMS SCORES ON PURDUE'S FIRST PK BUT WINLESS DROUGHTS PERSIST

- The Boilermakers were unable to come away with any standings points while making their first trips to Minnesota and Wisconsin since 2011. Friday's loss to league-leading and 18th-ranked Minnesota kept Purdue winless against nationally ranked opponents since a September 2009 win at Texas A&M. Meanwhile, after dropping their second 1-0 game of the Big Ten season Sunday in Madison, the Boilers remained winless against Wisconsin since 2008.
- Oddly, the majority of the active Boilermakers played games at Big Ten newcomers Maryland and Rutgers (in 2014) before they did at Minnesota or Wisconsin. Purdue had played 23 regular-season true road games (including 18 Big Ten matches) in 16 different locations since it last made the Minnesota-Wisconsin road trip in October 2011.
- Makaela Nellams converted on Purdue's first penalty-kick opportunity of the season Friday at Minnesota to account for the only goal of the road trip. It was her third career goal, all coming in Big Ten play.

PURDUE DEFEATS ILLINOIS TO SPLIT BIG TEN-OPENING WEEKEND

• One streak was extended and another came to an end as the Boilers split home games with Illinois and Northwestern during the conference-opening weekend. A 3-1 win Sept. 20 kept Purdue unbeaten (6-0-3) all-time at home against Illinois. But the Boilers' 11-game win streak vs. Northwestern, the longest in program history against any opponent, was snapped in a 1-0 loss Sept. 18. Purdue had not lost to Northwestern since 2004.
• Freshman Hannah Mussallem recorded her first collegiate goal to open the scoring in the Illinois win, joining Melissa Casella as Boilermakers to score their first goals this season. Seniors Kate Fowee (2011 vs. Wisconsin) and Makaela Nellams (2014 vs. Ohio State) also scored their first goals in Big Ten games. Andrea Petrina and Hannah Leinert accounted for

• Freshman Dannah Williams made her first start at center back vs. Illinois after seeing action primarily as a defensive midfielder. Christa Szalach moved into the starting lineup in the midfield, making her first start of the season. Goalkeeper

NEW BOILERMAKER SOCCER COMPLEX ATTENDANCE RECORD ESTABLISHED

• Purdue closed out its Big Ten-opening weekend with a 3-1 victory vs. Illinois in front of a Boilermaker Soccer Complex record crowd of 1,488 on youth soccer day in which the Greater Lafayette Regional Soccer Alliance/Boilers FC club team brought hundreds of fans to the field. The previous Soccer Complex attendance record of 1,318 was established two years ago on GLRSA day vs. Wisconsin. Last season's GLRSA day crowd of 1,305 vs. Ohio State came up just short of the previous record.

LOVE RIDING CONSECUTIVE MINUTES STREAK

- Center back **Kim Love** is the only Boilermaker that has played all 1002 minutes of the season so far and has logged 1,748 consecutive minutes dating back to the final six minutes of the Sept. 26, 2014, game against Minnesota. Love (46) also continues to sport the longest active consecutive games started streak on the team. She has started all 65 games in which she has played for Purdue. Previously, Love played every minute of the 2012 season (1,797) and also logged 1,472 consecutive minutes as a sophomore in 2013.
- Mikayla Lasky played every minute (1,764) last year and logged 3,225 consecutive minutes from September 2013 through the first half of the 2015 season opener. She missed three games due to injury during the season-opening homestand, ending her consecutive games started streak at 36. Megan Kaser was pressed into duty at center back for the first time as a Boilermaker and went the distance in all three games Lasky missed. Lasky returned to the starting lineup in time for the Montana Cup (Sept. 11-13) and also started the Big Ten opener against Northwestern, but has again been sidelined since.
- Fellow defender **Vanessa Korolas** shares the team lead with four assists while ranking third among the field players in minutes played (858). She has started all 30 games since the start of the 2014 season.

BOILERS SHUT OUT FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 2015

- Thanks to a win vs. the host Grizzlies, Purdue participated in the championship game of the Montana Cup the weekend of Sept. 11-13. But the Boilers were shut out for the first time this season in a 2-0 loss to Seattle, a side that qualified for the NCAA Tournament the last two years. The loss also marked the first time this year that Purdue didn't score the first goal or enjoy a halftime lead. The Boilermakers had scored in eight consecutive regular-season games dating back to the finale of the 2014 campaign. It was the program's longest streak since scoring in the first 13 games of the 2013 season.
- The Montana Cup was played in Missoula at an elevation of 3,200 feet. It marked the fourth-highest altitude for road matches in program history.

LEINERT'S EIGHTH CAREER MULTI-GOAL GAME THE DIFFERENCE VS. MONTANA

• Hannah Leinert scored twice in the first half of Purdue's 3-1 win at Montana Sept. 11. It was her first multi-goal game as a Boilermaker but the eighth of her college career after she posted seven in her two years at Illinois State. Leinert also scored the game winner in the Sept. 4 win vs. Evansville. In the process, she became the first Purdue player to account for a game-winning goal in consecutive games since **Maddy Williams** in October 2013.

 Leinert scored her sixth career goal against Evansville only two and half minutes after the opening kickoff. At ISU, she scored five of he 27 goals against the Purple Aces after the two teams met twice bo years. Purdue closed its season-opening homestand with a 4-1 record and five victories overall including the Aug. 14 exhibition win vs. Miar (Ohio) that marked the beginning of the extended home stretch. The Boilermakers have still not conceded a goal in four all-time meetings wi Evansville. Purdue also did not surrender a corner kick for the secon time this season.

EARLY & LATE GOALS BEGINNING TO ADD UP

- The Boilermakers have already scored in the first 10 minutes of a gam five times and the final 10 minutes of a game five times. Not surprisingly Purdue is 4-0 when scoring in the first 10 minutes this season, with tw of those five early goals coming in the win vs. Montana.
- · Meanwhile, the five goals in the final 10 minutes of regulation are a ready the third most in program history. Nicole Robertson (89th minute and **Dagny Olson** (85th) accounted for the dramatic game winners victories vs. Xavier and Baylor, respectively.

CONCEDING QUICK EQUALIZER BURNS BOILERS IN OVERTIME LOSS

- · Missouri defeated Purdue in overtime Aug. 30 to deny the home side a share of the Boilermaker Challenge Cup title for the first time since 2009. The Boilermakers led the game twice thanks to goals from Andrea Petrina and Melissa Casella, but Mizzou equalized only 15 seconds after Casella's go-ahead goal in the 84th minute and went on to hand Purdue its first overtime loss since September 2012 at Michigan State and its first at home since the 2011 Boilermaker Challenge Cup vs. Kansas.
- The 15 seconds between goals in the Missouri loss represented the shortest amount of time between goals for and against in program history. Eight times since 2000, a Purdue game has featured goals for each side less than a minute apart. The Boilermakers have compiled a

5-2-1 record in those games, both losses coming in contests in which the opposition recorded the quick answer.

WILLIAMS THE FASTEST TO 20 CAREER GOALS

- With a goal in the third minute of the Aug. 28 win vs. Baylor, it didn't take Maddy Williams long to record her fifth goal of the year and become the first Boilermaker to score in each of the first three games of a new season. Williams enters the weekend fifth in the PLAYER conference with her six goals. She was sixth nationally in goals M. Williams (13-PR) entering Labor Day Weekend.
- Williams' August goal-scoring rampage during which she scored 10, including the five in the two preseason exhibition games - featured four goals during the season-opening weekend. She scored twice in both the wins against Ohio and Xavier, and in the process C. Coppedge (00-03) reached the 20-goal mark for her collegiate career. The junior accomplished a number of feats with her big opening weekend, most notably becoming the fastest player in program history to reach 20

career goals. She was also the fastest to hit the 15-goal benchmark when she did so in September 2014.

 Williams joined Lauren Sesselmann (2005) as the only players in program history to record multi-goal efforts in consecutive games. Only two other Boilers (Kellie Phillips and Jordan Pawlik) ever accounted for four goals over two games, both posting hat tricks in one of the games. Versus Ohio, Williams became the first player to ever account for both of Purdue's first two goals of a new season and her four goals over the first two games were another program high. Finally, she joined Jessica Okoroafo (2009), Alex Hairston (2012) and Mollie Kuramoto (2013) as the only Boilers to ever score in each of the first two games of a new season.

BOILERS SWEEP SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND AFTER COMEBACK WIN

 Before losing in overtime to Missouri, Purdue started its season 3-0 for only the third time in program history. After winning their opener in 2015: Purdue 4, Xavier 3 shutout fashion (3-0 vs. Ohio) for the eighth time in team history, the 2013: Purdue 4, at Miami 3 (OT) Boilers had to rally to beat Xavier 4-3 Aug. 23. It marked the fourth 2013: Purdue 5, Dartmouth 3 time Purdue won a game in which it conceded three goals. Coinci- 2002: Purdue 4, at Oakland 3 (OT) dentally, three of those four wins have been in the last three seasons.

Most Goals Allowed in Wins

· Despite a big edge in the shot count, the Boilers trailed Xavier 3-2 with just over five minutes to go. But goals by Maddy Williams and Nicole Robertson lifted Purdue to the thrilling victory. It marked the first time since the 2013 victory at Miami (Ohio), another 4-3 final, that the Boilers rallied to win after trailing with less than 10 minutes to go.

FRESHMAN STARTING ON OPENING NIGHT

• Dannah Williams was in the starting lineup as a true freshman for each of the first five games this season. She joined Erika Arkans, Holly Gregory, Megan Kaser, Vanessa Korolas, Kim Love and Maddy Williams as active Boilers to start season openers as freshmen.

PURDUE IMPRESSIVE IN PRESEASON EXHIBITION ACTION; WILLIAMS SCORES FIVE

- · Maddy Williams, Purdue's active goal-scoring leader with 21, accounted for five of the team's six goals as the Boilers won both of their exhibition games in shutout fashion with a combined plus-six goal differential. Williams posted a hat trick in the first 22 minutes of the Aug. 11 win at Milwaukee (4-0) and scored twice in the second half of the Aug. 14 victory vs. Miami University (2-0). Newcomer Dagny Olson also scored on a penalty kick at Milwaukee.
- · Williams' hat trick would have tied a Purdue record for goals in a game if it hadn't come in a preseason exhibition game. There have only been four regular-season hat tricks in program history, the last by Jordan Pawlik in September 2012 vs. Evansville.

THREE TRANSFERS WITH STARTING EXPERIENCE

- · The Boilermakers only have five new players on the roster this year, but three are very experienced transfers that were starters at their previous universities. Hannah Leinert and Dagny Olson were not only starters but also all-conference honorees while playing under Drew Roff at Illinois State. Gabby LaMere was a starting defender for Xavier in 2014. She'll face her former team during the season-opening weekend. All three players started both of Purdue's preseason exhibition games.
- · Leinert, whose sister Katie also played for Purdue from 2008-11, scored 27 goals as a two-time First Team All-Missouri Valley Conference honoree at Illinois State, including an MVC-high 16 in 2013. She was the 2013 MVC Freshman of the Year and MVC Tournament MVP after becoming the first player to record a hat trick in the championship game. Leinert and Olson both scored goals in an NCAA Tournament game as well. Olson also converted on the game-winning penalty kick in the 2013 shootout at Louisville that sent ISU to the second round. Olson was a two-time Second Team All-MVC honoree and scored 10 goals as a midfielder for the Redbirds.
- · LaMere started 17 games for Xavier in 2014, contributing to three shutouts. The Musketeers surrendered only 23 goals in their 19 games.

EXCELLENT DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT IN 2014, BUT GOAL SCORING BOTTOMED OUT

- · A vastly improved defense for Purdue in 2014 was not enough to overcome a drastic drop in goal scoring. With 26 goals against, the Boilermakers conceded 17 fewer goals than in 2013. But the 19 goals they scored in 2014 were the least in program history and 15 fewer than a year ago.
- The 17 fewer goals conceded marked the best year-to-year improvement in program history. But the defense had little margin for error after Purdue was shut out nine times to match the 1999 team for its most ever. Six of the 11 losses – including five at home – came in 1-0 fashion, another program high. Only once before (22 goals in 2004) had the Boilers failed to score at least 25 goals in a season, much less 20.

BOILERMAKERS BEGIN NEW SEASON, NEW ERA WITH NEW COACHING STAFF

· New Purdue head coach Drew Roff was hired in December, becoming only the second head coach in program history. He led Illinois State to five NCAA Tournament appearances and six Missouri Valley Conference regular-season titles in his eight seasons (2007-14) as head coach. The Michigan State alum brought his former ISU assistants, Jim Schneiderhahn and Katie Baumgardner, with him to Purdue. Roff and his assistants were named the MVC Coaching Staff of the Year five times during his Illinois State tenure. Schneiderhahn has worked with Roff since 2011 and was part of three MVC Coaching Staff of the Year winners. After her playing career as a goalkeeper at Ohio State (2008-11), Baumgardner joined Roff's ISU staff in 2012 and was part of MVC Coaching Staff of the Year winners in 2013 and 2014 as the Redbirds went a combined 16-0 against MVC rivals and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament both years.
