– PURDUE TO TAKE ON WILDCATS IN CHICAGOLAND FOR SECOND YEAR IN A ROW –

No. 19 Purdue baseball continues Big Ten Conference play with its first northbound road trip of the season, traveling to Evanston, Ill., for the second year in a row for a weekend series at Northwestern.

First pitch at Rocky Miller Park in suburban Chicago is slated for 4 p.m. Friday, 2 p.m. Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday (all times ET).

The Boilermakers (21-5, 4-2 Big Ten) won two-of-three at Northwestern in April of last season to post their first series win in Evanston since 2001.

With the Big Ten schedule being reformed due to the addition of Nebraska, Purdue randomly drew another road trip to Northwestern (10-15, 3-3 Big Ten). Conversely, next weekend Illinois visits Lambert Field for the second year in a row.

Both teams are coming off series wins at home last weekend. The Wildcats took two-of-three against Nebraska, winning Sunday's rubber game behind a complete-game effort from starting pitcher Zach Morton. The junior is one of four NU players that have seen significant action as a pitcher and position player this season.

Saturday's pitching matchup in Evanston could be the top showdown around the Big Ten this weekend. Three-time Big Ten Pitcher of the Week **Lance Breedlove** will be opposed by Northwestern's impressive freshman right-hander Brandon Magallones. They rank one-two in the Big Ten in strikeouts (44 vs. 42) and have both won their first two Big Ten starts.

Magallones, who is 5-0, shutout Iowa March 24, striking out nine over seven innings of five-hit ball. He followed that up with 10 strikeouts over eight innings against a potent Nebraska lineup last weekend.

Purdue will also give the ball to a freshman starting pitcher this weekend. The coaching staff has opted to elevate **Connor Podkul** into the weekend rotation. Podkul will make his first Big Ten start Sunday, moving **Calvin Gunter** to the bullpen where the left-hander should be able to lighten the workload of relief ace **Blake Mascarello**.

Podkul impressed in his first two collegiate starts, helping lead the Boilers to quality résumé wins against Missouri State and Louisville. The 2008 season marked the last time a true freshman (Kyle Cook) started a Big Ten game for Purdue. That was the last season of four-game conference series.

Meanwhile, the Purdue offense will look to ratchet back up its consistent scoring against an NU pitching staff that has compiled a 2.39 team ERA in its first six conference games. The Boilermakers are batting .270 and averaging 5.7 runs per game since returning from spring break. Through the first 17 games, Purdue batted .352 and averaged 8.4 runs per game. However, those latter set of numbers were skewed a bit by the 15-8 win against Notre Dame and 22-1 victory at Murray State.

The pitching has picked up the slack over the last nine games, helping the Boilers post a 7-2 record. But the big innings that the Boilers lived on over the first month of the season have not been as frequent. Purdue has scored four or more runs in an innings only twice in its last 11 games after accomplishing the feat 10 times in the first 15 games of the year.

Cameron Perkins has hit three of his 20 career home runs in six games against the Wildcats. He posted his first collegiate multi-homer game with two long balls against Northwestern at Lambert Field in 2010 and also went deep in last year's series opener at Rocky Miller Park.

Extended first-inning rallies helped lift Purdue to the series win in Evanston last year. The Boilermakers scored five runs in the top of the first of both the series opener and finale. The Wildcats

scored in six of the eight innings in which they batted in the lopsided game two final.

The work of Mascarello (5 IP, 5 H, 0 R, 4 K as a reliever in game one) and Gunter (5 2/3 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 4 K in a rubber game spot start) highlighted the 2011 series on the mound for Purdue.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 380-348 overall record and a 190-178 Big Ten mark through his first 13 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber will make a run at Alexander's all-time wins record (407) this season and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE CONTINUES BIG TEN PLAY WITH RETURN TO NORTHWESTERN

- After winning four of five at home last weekend and defeating Anderson University Wednesday at Victory Field in Downtown Indianapolis, Purdue travels to Evanston, Ill., for the second year in a row for a weekend series at Northwestern. Last season the Boilers posted their first series victory at Northwestern since 2001.
- Purdue head coach **Doug Schreiber** earned his 400th career win March 31 as Purdue defeated Penn State, 2-0, behind a two-hit shutout from **Lance Breedlove**. It was the Boilers' second shutout win of the season, with Breedlove working a combined 16 scoreless innings in the two wins. Schreiber, meanwhile, also continues to close in on Dave Alexander's all-time record (407) for wins as head coach.
- Purdue has been unable to finish off a series sweep each of the first two weekends of Big Ten play. The Boilermakers lost a one-run game at Ohio State March 25 with a chance to sweep. April 1 against Penn State at Lambert Field, Purdue got blown out 16-6. It was the most runs scored by a Purdue opponent since February 2011 and the most by a visiting team at Lambert Field since April 2009.
- The Boilermakers are playing at a Big Ten opponent in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2005-06 when they traveled to Ohio State and Indiana both years. Next weekend Purdue hosts Illinois for the second year in a row.

BOILERS' BATS LEAD THE NATION IN TEAM BATTING AVERAGE ENTERING THE WEEK

- Fueled in part by the .437 average Purdue posted in the Murray State sweep (March 9-11), the Boilers entered the week ranked ninth in the nation with a .326 team batting average. Purdue was also 12th in scoring (7.5 runs per game) and 16th in slugging percentage. The Boilermakers continue to lead the Big Ten but saw their team batting average drop from .349 to .326 after batting only .222 as a team during their home-opening five-game homestand (March 27-April 1).
- The defense has been performing well, too. The Boilermakers were fourth in double plays turned per game and ranked eighth in total twin killings. Purdue has now turned 31 double plays, registering five in the midweek wins against Louisville and IPFW (March 27 and 28).

ANTONELLI DELIVERS BIG HIT AS SCHREIBER WINS 400TH & PURDUE REACHES 20 WINS

- **Chris Antonelli** delivered the go-ahead single in the seventh inning of a scoreless game and help lead Purdue to a 2-0 win against Penn State March 31. The win was the Boilers' 20th of the season. The team reached the benchmark before April 1 for the first time in program history. Purdue closed the month of March with a 15-3 record.
- Head coach **Doug Schreiber** also his 400th career game March 31. He has now recorded his 100th, 250th, 300th and 400th career wins against Penn State. He received a Gatorade shower from his players during the postgame huddle in left field. The next landmark for the 14th-year head coach is Dave Alexander's all-time wins record (407) at Purdue.
- Antonelli made his first start of the season in the landmark win and after a lengthy at-bat, hit a ground ball through the right side to score **Kevin Plawecki** from third base with two outs in the seventh inning. Plawecki singled to open the frame, breaking up the no-hit bid by Penn State left-hander Joe Kurrasch.

BREEDLOVE THE FIRST BOILER TO WIN PITCHER OF THE WEEK THREE TIMES IN ONE YEAR

- Lance Breedlove's complete-game shutout of Penn State in his season debut at Lambert Field (March 31) earned the senior his third Big Ten Pitcher of the Week award of 2012, making the first Boiler in program history to be honored this times in one season.
- Breedlove retired the first 19 batters of the game in order. Both pitchers carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning, as PSU's Joe Kurrasch matched Breedlove for much of the day. But Purdue scored twice with two outs in the seventh and went on to win the game, 2-0.
- Breedlove has won Big Ten Pitcher of the Week each of the last two weeks, working complete-game victories against Ohio State and Penn State. He's the first Boiler to pitch consecutive complete games since Matt Bischoff in April 2009 (also against PSU and OSU).
- Matt Morgan (2007-11) and Bischoff (2007-10) were both three-time Big Ten Pitcher of the Week winners during their careers, but they accumulated those awards over two seasons. Breedlove joins former outfielder Daniel Underwood (2000-03) as the only Purdue players to be recognized by the conference office three times in the same season since the weekly awards program began in 1990. Underwood was a three-time Big Ten Player of the Week in 2003. At the time, Underwood was the first Big Ten baseball player to accomplish the feat.
- Former Ohio State pitcher Alex Wimmers was the last pitcher to be the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week at least three times in the same season. He was honored four times in 2009.
- Breedlove needed only 101 pitches to finish his two-hit shutout of Penn State. It was his fourth start of the season without a walk. He worked seven 1-2-3 innings and retired 27 of the 29 batters he faced, pitching the first complete-game shutout by a Boiler since **Joe Haase** blanked Minnesota on April 2, 2011, at Target Field.

BOILERS NOW 7-0 IN HAASE'S STARTS

- **Joe Haase** put together his third consecutive quality start, working seven innings of two-run ball highlighted by a quartet of 1-2-3 innings, to lead Purdue to a 9-3 win its Big Ten home opener against Penn State March 30. He has tallied 17 strikeouts vs. two walks in his last three starts, all wins.
- Haase did not give up a run until the Nittany Lions scored twice with two outs in the seventh inning. The senior helped bottled up the first five batters in the PSU lineup to the tune of a combined 1-for-21 showing. He struck out five and issued only one walk.
- Haase earned his 12th career victory with his longest outing of the season. The right-hander won for a third consecutive start and Purdue improved to 7-0 in games he has started this season.

ANOTHER LONG ON-BASE STREAK ENDS FOR PERKINS

- In Big Ten play, **Cameron Perkins** had reached base safely in 46 consecutive contests dating back to 2010 until Penn State finally get him off the base paths in the March 31 pitcher's duel. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he had managed to find his way on base in 53 straight games against conference opponents. He compiled an on-base percentage of .419 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 101 times (76 hits, nine walks, 16 hit by pitch).
- After getting robbed of a potential base hit up the middle on a nice play by the Maryland pitcher on Feb. 25 in what proved to be Perkins' final at-bat of the game, the junior's remarkable streak of reaching base safely in 67 consecutive games was snapped. The streak dated back to 2010. Perkins reached base safely at least one in every game he played as a sophomore.
- Perkins reached base safely 133 times during his streak. He collected 98 hits, 12 walks and was hit by a pitch 23 times, good for an on-base percentage of .421.

BIG TEN LEADING BOILERS

- While the offense has generated the majority of the headlines early this season, the Purdue pitching and defense has also carried its fair share of the load to help Purdue earn its national ranking. Entering the weekend, the pitching staff has issued the fewest walks (65) and surrendered the third fewest runs (114) in the Big Ten. The Boilermakers 31 double plays turned, including 25 of the ground ball variety induced by the pitchers, are second in the league.
- While leading the league in team batting average, Purdue is second to Nebraska in many other offensive categories. The Huskers have played five more games than the Boilers entering the weekend. Purdue has struck out the fewest number of times in the league (136).
- Individually, **Kevin Plawecki** enters the weekend leading the conference with 14 doubles and a .649 slugging percentage. He was fifth nationally in doubles per game entering the week. **Lance Breedlove** is tops in the Big Ten with 44 strikeouts and **Blake Mascarello's** five wins are the most in the league.

TALBOTT PLAYS THE HERO IN HOME-OPENING WALK-OFF WIN

- **Stephen Talbott's** walk-off single in the 10th inning punctuated the Boilers' home-opening with an exclamation point. Purdue defeated No. 15 Louisville, 2-1, March 27 in a game that featured two of the nation's top offenses but turned into a pitcher's duel.
- Talbott singled home **Angelo Cianfrocco**, who doubled to open the 10th inning, to join **Sean McHugh** and **Cameron Perkins** as active Boilers with a walk-off hit on their collegiate résumés. McHugh played the hero in Purdue's last extra-inning game, a 12-inning victory against Indiana at Lambert Field on April 29, 2011.
- Starting pitcher **Connor Podkul** did not give up a hit over six innings of one-run ball in his Lambert Field debut. Despite a low pitch count of 59 for Podkul, lefty **Blake Mascarello** took over on the mound to begin the seventh. The Cardinals had three left-handed hitters due up. Mascarello worked four innings of scoreless relief to earn his team-leading fifth win. Head coach **Doug Schreiber** said Podkul is also continuing to build up his pitch count after a heavy work load in the spring and summer of 2011.

RAMER FANS CAREER-HIGH TO LEAD PURDUE TO MIDWEEK WIN

- **Robert Ramer** struck out a career-high nine over eight innings of one-run ball, keeping his team in the game on another slow day for the offense in Purdue's 6-1 win against IPFW March 28.
- Ramer worked four 1-2-3 innings, retiring the final nine batters he faced in order. He recorded five strikeouts his first time through the IPFW lineup and two more in the eighth inning. It was the longest outing of his career.
- Ramer now sports a career record to 9-0. Among the active Boilers with multiple decisions, he remains the program's only undefeated pitcher. Purdue is now 11-1 in games he has started during his career.
- The Boilermakers trailed 1-0 entering the bottom of the seventh but scored three times in the seventh and eighth innings to surge in front. **Cameron Perkins** tied the game with a solo home run to lead off the bottom of the seventh, his team-leading fourth long ball of the season and 20th career.

TWO-OUT RBI TITANS

- **Barrett Serrato** (23 RBIs, 16 with two outs), **Sean McHugh** (12, 9), **David Miller** (11, 8), **Andrew Dixon** (6, 4) **Stephen Talbott** (12, 7) have supplied the majority of their run production in clutch situations this season. All four players enter the weekend having recorded more than half their RBIs with two outs in an inning. Serrato has led the way, collecting 16 of his 23 RBIs with two outs. On two occasions this year, the opposition (East Carolina and Wichita State) intentionally walked **Kevin Plawecki** with two outs and a runner in scoring position to setup a lefty-lefty matchup with Serrato. He delivered a run-scoring single each time.
- McHugh and Serrato have both connected for three-run homers with two outs in an inning this season. McHugh hit his three-run on the first pitch thrown by new WSU reliever Tobin Mateychick in the sixth inning of game two of the series. Serrato's three-run homer capped the seven-run rally in the comeback win against Southern Miss.

BIG SCORING EDGE LATE IN GAMES

- Purdue has feasted on relief pitching for much of the season, best demonstrated by a 117-44 scoring edge from the sixth inning through the end of the game. The Boilermakers have scored 42 runs in the sixth inning, their highest total in any inning. In fact, the run totals in the sixth, seventh (32), eighth (23) and ninth (19) innings rank four of the team's top five most productive innings. Coincidentally, Purdue has only scored 11 runs in the fifth inning.
- The Boilermakers have scored four more runs in an inning 12 times this year. Eleven of those 12 occurrences have come in the sixth inning or later. Purdue has registered extended sixth-inning rallies featuring run totals of nine (Feb. 19 vs. UND), eight (March 10 at Murray), seven (Feb. 26 vs. WCU and March 3 vs. USM) five (March 15 at WSU) and four (twice).
- On multiple occasions this season, Purdue has been able to score runs against an opposing reliever that entered the day having not surrendered an earned on the year. Wichita's Foster Vielock (3 H, 3 ER), Murray's Will Handlin (7 H, 5 ER), Southern Miss' Cameron Giannini (3 H, 4 ER), and Auburn's Dillon Ortman (H, ER) and Cory Luckie (2 H, 2 ER) all failed to hold down the Purdue offense in close games that the Boilers went on to win.
- In the March 27 walk-off win against Louisville, Purdue scored the game-winning run against the Cardinals' closer, Derek Self. He had surrendered only two earned runs in his first 10 appearances of the season entering the day.

BOILERS NOW OFFICIALLY RANKED IN ALL FOUR NATIONAL POLLS

- After debuting at No. 24 in the March 19 USA Today/ESPN Top 25 coaches' poll, Purdue is now nationally ranked in all four major national polls at the same time for the first time in program history.
- Among the Collegiate Baseball Top 30 for the fifth week in a row, the Boilers stayed at No. 22 this week. Purdue remained ranked in the Baseball America Top 25 and National Collegiate Baseball Writers of Association Top 30 polls for the fourth week in a row. The Boilermakers remained No. 19 in Baseball America's poll and moved up to No. 20 in the NCBWA & USA Today rankings.
- The program has earned its first in-season national ranking since February 2001 (Baseball America). The Boilermakers were also nationally ranked in the 2002 NCBWA preseason poll.
- The Boilermakers have been ranked among the Top 30 of Perfect Game USA's national Top 50 all season, staying at No. 15 this week.

MASCARELLO STELLAR IN LONG RELIEF ROLE

- Senior left-hander **Blake Mascarello** has been Purdue's most consistent pitcher over the first seven weeks of the season, earning the win in five of his 13 relief appearances. He was the winning pitcher against Connecticut, Auburn, Murray State (game one), Missouri State and Louisville. He also closed out the series opener at Ohio State for a save. Mascarello has surrendered a run in five of his 13 appearances and helped the Boilers maintain a lead or kept the game tied in all but one game (game four at Wichita State) in which he has taken the mound with Purdue leading.
- While the lefty has been consistently excellent, his work in the Connecticut and Murray State wins stand out. He retired 12 of the 14 batters he faced over four scoreless innings in the season opener against UConn. In the series opener against Murray State, he retired 13 of the 14 batters

he faced. In both instances he closed out the victory.

10-GAME WIN STREAK SNAPPED IN WICHITA; 14-1 START BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- Purdue's 10-game win streak was snapped in a doubleheader sweep at the hands of Wichita State March 17 on the final day of the spring break trip. The Boilermakers lost more games on St. Patrick's Day than they had in the first month of the season (one). Purdue had not dropped both games of a doubleheader since May 2010 at Iowa. The 10-game win streak was the program's longest since the 2001 team won 13 in row.
- At 14-1 before the St. Patrick's Day sweep, the Boilers posted the best one-loss start in program history. Previously, the 1959 team had gone 13-1 before suffering its second loss of the year.
- Purdue has posted its 18 wins against 15 team different teams. The Boilermakers played each of their first 10 games of the season against 10 different opponents.
- While the offense grabbed headlines after scoring 40 runs while batting .437 in the series sweep of Murray State (March 9-11), the pitching and defense also performed well in Purdue's first road sweep since taking all three games of a series at Lipscomb the first weekend of March last season. The Boilermakers only surrendered five runs in the series, with Murray State scoring only one run after the first inning. Defensively, Purdue did not commit an error in the series while turning six double plays.

WITTGREN BREAKS SAVES RECORD AS PITCHING CARRIES THE LOAD IN MSU WIN

- Connor Podkul** did not give up a hit until the fifth inning in his first collegiate start and **Blake Mascarello** and **Nick Wittgren** backed him up with 4 2/3 innings of one-run relief, as solid pitching led Purdue to a 4-2 win at Missouri State March 13.
- Wittgren recorded his 16th career save by retiring six of the eight batters he faced over two innings of hitless relief. The junior officially eclipsed the program's all-time saves record. He entered the night in a three-way tie with former closers Scott Dubach (1985-87) and Andy Helmer (1997-00).
- Wittgren recorded his 16 saves in his first 35 relief appearances. He has converted 16 of his 19 save opportunities since becoming the closer early in the 2011 season. Seven of his 16 career saves have come in appearances longer than one inning.
- Wittgren is the first Boiler to establish a new individual program record since Matt Bischoff recorded his 258th career strikeout to break the all-time record in an April 2010 home win against Northwestern.

DeANO EARNS THE WIN IN HIS COLLEGIATE DEBUT

- Jack DeAno** worked three innings of hitless relief in his Purdue debut, earning the win in the comeback victory against Southern Miss March 3. He retired nine of the 11 batters he faced, highlighted by a 1-2-3 ninth inning. Southern Miss, which had scored 32 runs in its last two games entering the day, racked up nine runs on 13 hits through the first six innings.
- DeAno sat out the 2011 season as a transfer from Vanderbilt. He had not pitched since high school and was listed as an outfielder on the roster his first year with the program. While he could still see action as a defensive replacement or pinch runner, he is now expected to remain a full-time member of the bullpen.

- The first four hitters in the Purdue lineup enjoyed a productive night in the March 2 win at Auburn. **Tyler Spillner** and **Eric Charles** both recorded four-hit efforts at the top of the order, setting the table for **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki**. Perkins and Plawecki both tallied their 100th career RBIs in the victory. Together the four hitters were a combined 11-for-20 with nine RBIs and five runs scored.
- Perkins' game-tying sacrifice fly in the sixth inning plated **Stephen Talbott** and accounted for his 100th career RBI. Plawecki's 100th RBI came on a two-run single in the eighth inning that drove in Spillner and Charles. To go-ahead run had scored on Charles' base hit earlier in the inning.
- In the Murray State series (March 9-11), **Tyler Spillner** posted his 200th career hit (a three-run homer in game two of the series) and **Joe Haase** registered is 100th career strikeout. **Eric Charles** had his 200th career hit & 100th career RBI at the East Carolina Tournament (Feb. 25-26).
- Century-mark career milestones for **Blake Mascarello** (100th career strikeout April 1 vs. Penn State), and Talbott (100th career hit April 4 vs. Anderson) have also been recently achieved. Spillner (99 career RBIs) and Perkins (194 career hits) are closing on other benchmarks as well.

- Purdue pounded out a school-record 30 hits and scored eight runs in an inning twice, reaching the 20-run plateau for the first time since March 2008 in a 22-1 win at Murray State March 10. The Boilermakers sent 12 men to the plate in the eight-run sixth inning that blew the game open and later scored eight times with two outs in the top of the ninth.
- The previous program record for hits was 26, accomplished twice, most recently in a 2006 win at Indiana (25-8). That game also marked the last time Purdue scored 20-plus runs in a road game.
- The Boilers also turned four double plays in a game (March 10) for the third time this year, highlighted by a 2-5-4 twin killing on a MSU sac bunt attempt with two aboard and no outs in the second inning.

- **Stephen Talbott** recorded multiple hits and scored a run in all three games of the series sweep at Murray State (March 9-11), hitting for the cycle over the course of the weekend, and the No. 9 hitter was recognized as the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week for his efforts. Talbott finished the weekend 10-for-17 with four extra-base hits, five RBIs and five runs scored. The outfielder collected four hits in the wins Saturday and Sunday, his first collegiate four-hit efforts.
- Thanks to a two-run double and a home run, Talbott also matched his career high with four RBIs in the series finale. The two-run double came with two outs in the second inning and tied the game. He went deep to left field in the sixth inning to extend the Boilers' one-run lead entering the frame.
- Talbott also recorded two hits in Purdue eight-run sixth inning in the middle game of the series.
- For the second year in a row, the Boilers had at least one player honored as the Big Ten Player or Pitcher of the Week after each of the first four weekends of the season.
- Talbott finished the spring break trip a team-best 16-for-34 (.471) with six extra-base hits and eight RBIs. He remains a perfect 28-for-28 on stolen base attempts for his career.

- After being among the 13 semifinalists nationally a season ago for the Johnny Bench Award, **Kevin Plawecki** has once again been selected to the initial watch list for the award that recognizes the nation's top all-around catcher. The initial watch list featured 43 catchers. More could be added as the season progresses and a group of semifinalists will be announced May 16.
- Plawecki homered on consecutive days in the wins against Southern Miss and Charleston Southern. Both home runs were towering fly balls over the 35-foot-high wall in left field. He went deep in back-to-back games for the third time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in 2010 (at Illinois State and vs. Penn State) and 2011 (games two and three of Illinois series). Among active Boilers, **Ryan Bridges**, **Cameron Perkins** (twice) and **Tyler Spillner** have also homered in back-to-back games.
- Plawecki and Iowa's Dan Sheppard were the only Big Ten backstops named to the initial watch list. Plawecki has batted cleanup in each of the first 26 games this season, starting 21 times behind the plate. He recorded his 100th career RBI in the weekend-opening win against Auburn.

- Closer **Nick Wittgren** finished off two of Purdue's three wins at Auburn's tournament (March 2-4), tying the program's all-time record with his 15th career save and earning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for his efforts.
- Wittgren closed out the victories against Auburn and Charleston Southern, retiring eight of the 11 batters he faced over his three innings of scoreless relief. More importantly, the junior got some big outs when the Boilers need them most. He left the potential tying run at second base while finishing off the Auburn win and fanned the CSU leadoff hitter with the bases loaded to close out the eighth inning.
- Andy Helmer was the last Purdue pitcher to win Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors as a reliever, accomplishing the feat in April 2000.

- Punctuated by a go-ahead three-run homer from **Barrett Serrato**, Purdue scored seven times with two outs in the seventh inning to overcome a six-run deficit and stun Southern Miss, 10-9, March 3 at Auburn's four-team tournament.
- Seven consecutive Purdue hitters reached base safely during the quick-strike rally, which began innocently enough with a seeing-eye single up the middle from **David Miller**. **Stephen Talbott**, **Tyler Spillner**, **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki** each delivered a run-scoring hit to set the stage for Serrato. The senior connected for a three-run homer to right center that capped the rally. Purdue hit for the cycle in the inning, Talbott tripling home Miller and Spillner doubling home Talbott.

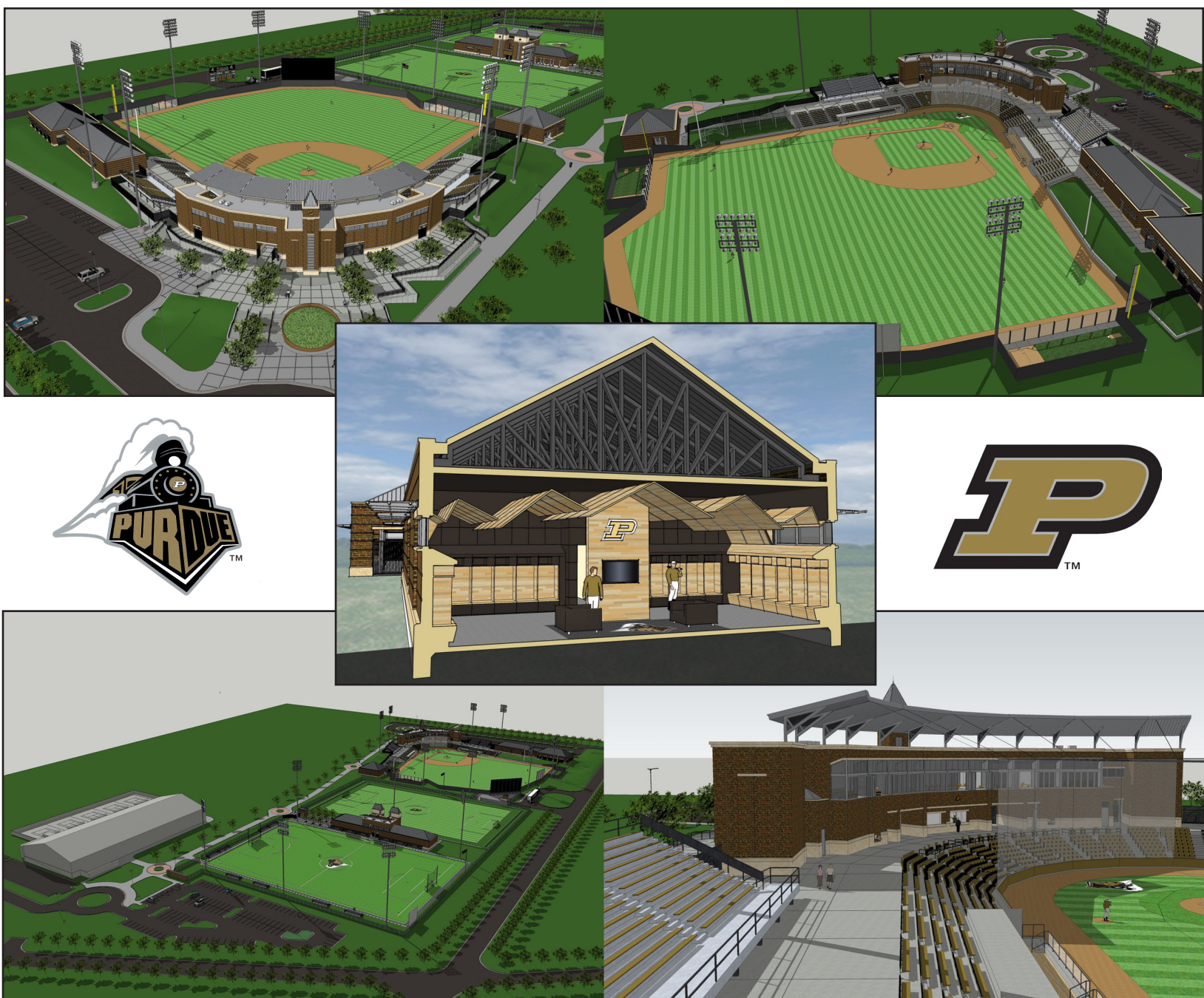

at the Northwest Athletics Complex
Construction Began in Spring of 2011
Stadium to be located near the intersection of
McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus**

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. David Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994. All three Alexanders graduated from Purdue, and Dave played on Purdue's baseball team. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
