GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 776-411 all-time, including a 408-126 mark at home.
- Purdue is 190-92 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 307-157.
- Purdue is 184-81 in December, including a 95-20 mark on its home court. The Boilermakers are 12-5 all-time on Dec. 21, including a 7-1 mark in Mackey Arena.
- Purdue is 23-17 all-time in the 11th game of the season.
- The Boilermakers are 60-58 all-time against teams from Ohio.
- Purdue is 498-186 when playing in its home state of Indiana.
- Purdue is 28-9 all-time against teams from the Horizon League.
- Wright State is the 186th opponent in Purdue's history. The Boilermakers are 133-53 all-time in inaugural meetings.
- The Boilermakers outrebounded Wright State, 52-51, marking their highest single-game rebounding total this season.
- Purdue assisted on 21 of 27 field goals for the game (.778), improving its season assisted basket percentage to 69 percent.
- The Boilermakers outscored the Raiders in the paint, 38-22.
- Purdue committed more turnovers than its opponent for the first time this season, 15-13, as Wright State outscored Purdue off turnovers, 17-8.
- Despite 27 offensive rebounds, Purdue held the Raiders to just 13 second-chance points.
- Wright State's .224 field goal percentage (17-76) was the lowest by a Purdue opponent this season, as was its .063 three-point percentage (1-16).
- The Raiders' 76 shots were the most by a Purdue opponent this season, as were the 51 rebounds.
- Purdue blocked a season-high 12 shots, including eight in the first half. They have blocked at least six shots in four straight games, and are now tied for 41st nationally in the category.
- Purdue is limiting opponents to 47.2 points per game over its last three outings, holding them to just 31.6 percent from the field.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- Whitney Bays made her second all-tournament team of the season, earning BTI Invitational MVP honors as well after finishing with 16 points, 13 rebounds, three blocks, two assists and two steals.
- Her second straight double-double is her fifth of the year and 13th of her career, moving into a tie for eighth all-time at Purdue with Leslie Johnson.
- Liza Clemons joined her on the all-tournament team after her third straight game in double-figures. She posted 11 points, seven rebounds and a career-high four blocks.
- Andreona Keys made five-of-seven from the floor, matching her career high with 12 points.
- Ashley Morrisette posted 11 points, four assists, three rebounds, two blocks and two steals.
- April Wilson finished with six points, seven rebounds, eight assists and a pair of steals.
- Hayden Hamby dished out a career-high five assists.
