BOILERS BEGIN SIX-GAME HOMESTAND WITH THREE-GAME WEEK Longest Homestands

• Purdue rebounded from a 1-0 loss to Butler Aug. 29 with back-to-back shutout wins over Labor Day, going 2-1 on the first half of its current six-game homestand. The second half of the homestand figures to be more of a challenge. Milwaukee won a game at the 2011 NCAA Tournament and was the preseason co-favorite in the Horizon League. West Virginia has a win over defending national champion Stanford, which was ranked No. 1 at the time, and took Penn State to overtime last weekend. Entering the week, Central Michigan's only loss was against PSU and the Chippewas played nationally-ranked Marquette to a scoreless draw. The Boilermakers will play those three opponents in a span of six days.

• The six-game homestand will be the third longest in program history. The Boilers played eight consecutive games at home last season from Sept.

2-25 but posted just a 2-4-2 record during that stretch. Four of the eight games went to overtime, including losses to USC and Kansas on consecutive Sundays.

• Purdue has otherwise excelled in homestands of four games and longer over the years. The Boilermakers have had a homestand of at least four games in eight of the last nine seasons, compiling a combined 24-7-5 record in those consecutive games at the Varsity Soccer Complex.

PAWLIK'S HAT TRICK HIGHLIGHTS RAINY DAY WIN

 All four goals in the Sept. 2 win against Evansville were scored by Purdue players named Jordan, highlighted by a hat trick from Jordan Pawlik. After Pawlik's natural hat trick had given the Boilers a 3-0 lead early in the second half, Jordan Frick recorded her second career goal to cap the scoring.

· Pawlik's hat trick was only the fourth in program his-

tory, tying a program record for goals in a game. But it was also the fourth hat trick at the Varsity Soccer Complex in less than a calendar year's time. Purdue's Kellie Phillips (Oct. 13), Nebraska's Morgan Marlborough (Sept. 23) and Michigan's Nkem Ezurike (Oct. 16) also scored three goals in a game at the VSC last season. Of the four hat tricks in program history, only Courtney Coppedge also scored three goals in consecutive fashion to account for the other natural hat trick in the record book.

- Pawlik had missed the first two games of the team's six-game homestand due to an injury sustained in practice on Aug. 26. She now leads the team with five goals, all five coming as part of multi-goal efforts. Loredana Riverso and Parrissa Eyorokon (2007) were the last Boilers to have at least two multiple-goal games in the same season.
- The Boilermakers had 13 corner kick opportunities in the Evansville win, the team's highest total since recording 16 in a 2009 win versus Evansville.

LOVE NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- **Kim Love** was selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after going the distance at center back as the Boilers surrendered only one goal in the first three game of their six-game homestand. Not only has Love started each of the first six games this season, the freshman has also yet to leave the pitch during game action. Fellow center back **Jessica Warren** has done the same.
- Purdue held Butler without a corner kick opportunity Wednesday in a frustrating 1-0 loss. The lone goal of the night was scored on a second-half penalty kick. Love then helped the Boilers post shutouts in weekend victories against Tennessee-Martin and Evansville. It was Purdue's first set of consecutive shutouts since September 2010. Purdue allowed only 13 shots on goal in the three games.
- Love joins Alex Hairston, Chinyelu Asher and Warren as active Purdue players to win Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. She is one four Purdue freshmen to start at least once (along with Melissa Casella, Emma Lancaster and Makaela Nellams) and is among the eight that have seen action this season. Love is also one of seven players on the team overall that have started each of the first six games of 2012.

HAIRSTON SETS UP FOUR GOALS IN TWO GAMES

- Alex Hairston posted multi-assist efforts in back-to-back games, setting up four of Purdue's six goals in the wins against Tennessee-Martin and Evansville. Her right-to-left crosses led to goals by **Chinyelu Asher** and **Hadley Stuart**, scored just over six minutes apart, versus UTM. Hairston then assisted on the first two goals of **Jordan Pawlik's** hat trick versus Evansville.
- Hairston became the first Boiler since Shauna Stapleton in 2007 to record consecutive multi-assist games. Annette Kent (2003) and Kelly Haxton (2003) have also accomplished the feat. Hairston is one of five active Purdue players with a multi-assist effort on their college résumés.

THREE SHUTOUT WINS IN THE FIRST SIX GAMES

- With three of the Boilers' first four wins coming in shutout fashion, Purdue has already matched its 2011 total for team shutouts. After **Clara Kridler** went the distance in the Aug. 31 win against Tennessee-Martin, she was one of three Purdue goalkeepers to see action in the next game against Evansville, another shutout victory. In the process, Purdue recorded its first set of consecutive clean-sheet efforts since September 2010 (vs. Wisconsin and Northwestern). With that Wisconsin game ending in a scoreless draw, the Boilers had not won back-to-back games in shutout fashion since October 2009.
- The 2007 season marked the last time Purdue recorded three shutouts in its first six games. But there was a season-opening scoreless draw among that stretch. The 2000, 2002, 2003 and 2006 teams also had three shutout victories in their first six games of the year.
- Halfway through the six-game homestand, Purdue has surrendered only two goals in 466 minutes of action at the Varsity Soccer Complex this season. Those two goals have been scored on a penalty kick and following a corner kick.

WILD NIGHT AT LOUISVILLE ENDS IN OVERTIME LOSS

- In a wild game that featured seven goals, a power outage and two 11 Marquette 10, Purdue 1 (1998) brief delays due to darkness, Louisville scored in the 102nd minute 10 - Purdue 8, Indiana 2 (2011) of double overtime to defeat Purdue, 4-3, Aug. 24.
- The game marked only the second time in program history the Boil- 8 Purdue 8, Evansville 0 (2003) ers have scored three goals in a loss. A September 2002 overtime 8 - lowa 7, Purdue 1 (2000) win at Oakland (4-3) and an October 1999 loss to Iowa (6-3) repre- 8 - Purdue 7, Valpo 1 (2000) sent the two previous games in program history that saw both teams 7 - Louisville 4, Purdue 3 (2012) score at least three goals. The Boilermakers have now been involved 7 – Penn State 6, Purdue 1 (2010) in a game that has featured seven-plus goals 16 times, compiling a 7 – Purdue 5, Loyola 2 (2009) 10-6 record in those games.
- Louisville opened the scoring in the fifth minute and tallied a late 7 Purdue 7, Indiana 0 (2007) equalizer in the 86th minute. Purdue held the lead for 22 minutes on 7 - on 5 other occassions before '07 the night but could not make Chinyelu Asher's late goal in the 83rd minute, which broke a 2-2 tie, holdup.

TWO GOALS IN SCHOOL-RECORD TIME ON BACK-TO-BACK FRIDAYS

- Four of Purdue's first six goals this season were scored in a grand total of 93 seconds of actual game action. That's because on consecutive Fridays, the Boilers scored twice in less than a minute. In her Aug. 24 return to Louisville, where she played in 2010 and 2011 before transferring to Purdue, Jordan Pawlik scored twice in a span of 45 seconds to help the Boilers overcome an early 1-0 deficit. Hadley Stuart helped setup both goals. The 45 seconds elapsed represents the smallest amount of time between goals in program history.
- · A week earlier, Alex Hairston and Stuart scored 48 seconds apart in the second half to help Purdue defeat Toledo in shutout fashion in a season opener for the second year in a row. Coincidentally, Pawlik assisted on both scores.
- The previous program record for the smallest amount of time between two goals both scored by Purdue was 55 seconds. Shauna Stapleton and Parrissa Eyorokon scored back-to-back in a November 2007 blowout
- · Pawlik and Stuart represent the only active Boilers with a multi-goal and a multi-assist effort on their college résumés. Pawlik has accomplished the feat in only three games at Purdue.

HAIRSTON'S GOLDEN GOAL LIFTS PURDUE TO FIRST OVERTIME WIN SINCE 2009

- Alex Hairston scored in the 106th minute of double overtime to propel Purdue to an overtime win against Eastern Illinois Aug. 22. It was the Boilers' first overtime win since November 2009, the regular-season finale against Iowa. Purdue had gone 0-4-4 in its eight games longer than 90 minutes since. All eight overtime affairs had been at home.
- · An own goal was the difference in Purdue's last overtime win. Sylvia Forbes' golden goal four days earlier in an overtime victory at Indiana was the last of its kind credited to a Purdue player.

GAME-WINNING GOALS IN BACK-TO-BACK SEASON OPENERS & FIRST TWO GAMES

- · With five game-winners among her team-high eight career goals, Alex Hairston has had made the most of her scores. She accounted for the game-winning goal in both games of the season-opening weekend. This marks the second year in a row she has recorded the first two game-winners of a season.
- · Hairston is the first player in program history to account for a game-winning goal in back-to-back season openers. She's also the first player to score in the first game of consecutive seasons since Annette Kent scored in four straight from 2000-03.
- · Jessica Okoroafo was the last Boiler to score the game-winning goal in each of the first two games of the season, accomplishing the feat in 2009. Hairston joined Okoroafo as the only players in program history to account for the first two game-winning goals of a season twice in a career. But since Okoroafo did it as a freshman (2005) and senior (2009), Hairston is the first Boiler to score the first two game-winners of a season in consecutive years.

INSTANT IMPACT FROM LANCASTER & PAWLIK

- Newcomers Emma Lancaster (a true freshman) and Jordan Pawlik (a junior transfer from Louisville) both started the first two games of the new season. Both players also finished the season-opening weekend with two assists. Lancaster helped setup each of Alex Hairston's goals and both scores proved to be gamewinners. Pawlik, meanwhile, assisted on the goals scored by Hairston and Hadley Stuart a program-record 48 seconds apart against Toledo. Pawlik joined Mollie Kuramoto and Jordan Frick as active Boilers with a multi-assist game during their careers.
- · Kim Love, Melissa Casella, Makaela Nellams and Nicole Hively also made their Purdue debuts during the season-opening weekend. Fellow freshmen Jessica Bernard, Kate Fowee and Samantha Rosa have seen action since. Hively saw her first action after redshirting in 2011 with a foot injury.

WARREN, FRICK & STUART AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

- Team captain Jessica Warren and fellow upperclassmen Jordan Frick and Hadley Stuart should prove critical to Purdue women's soccer's success in 2012 as indicated by their selections among the Big Ten Players to Watch as the new season begins.
- Warren was selected as team captain in the spring. She has played in 48 consecutive games and 59 of the 61 the last three seasons. This year she'll have an opportunity of adding her name to the list of Boilers that have scored a goal in each of their four years. Warren went the distance in 10 of the 12 games in which she started at center back last season. She could return to a midfield position this year but her versatility to play in either part of the field should be beneficial.
- Frick was one of three returning Boilers to start all 20 games in 2011. She and classmate Mollie Kuramoto, who will miss this season due to injury, demonstrated the highest level of consistency among the sophomore field players a year ago. The suburban St. Louis native ranked second on the team in minutes played last season while serving as an outside back and corner kick specialist. She helped setup four goals and scored for the first time as Boiler.
