• **Ross Learnard** has emerged as Purdue's relief ace. He has worked 19 consecutive scoreless innings over his last 11 appearances, the longest streak by a Boilermaker since Matt Bischoff (22 innings) in 2007.

## - AROUND THE HORN -

• The Boilermakers host rival Indiana for the first time since sweep a three-game series at Lambert Field in 2011 (April 29-May 1). The teams have played only eight times since, two at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament and six in Bloomington (3 in 2014, 3 in 2016). Purdue has played 103 home games against 23 different teams since last hosting Hoosiers.

• The Boilermakers rebounded from an ugly game one loss at Ohio State to take the series, limiting OSU to just two runs over the final two games of the series. Purdue rallied to win a series after losing the opening game for only the third time since the start of 2010. The road team has now won eight straight Purdue-OSU series dating back to 2007.

• The Boilermakers won seven straight games from March 13 to 24, their longest win streak since posting 10 straight victories in April 2012. They also won their home opener (March 28) for the 12th time in the last 16 years, rallying for a pair of runs with two outs in the ninth inning to steal a 3-2 win vs. Kent State. **Logan Poissall** drove in the game-winning run with an infield single.

### BIG TEN PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Feb. 20, 2017
- March 6, 2017

- Struck out a career-high 10 over 7 2/3 shutout innings at Santa Clara, the most Ks by a Purdue pitcher since March 2012 at Ohio State.
- First Purdue pitcher to win each of his first three weekend starts since 2011.
- Retired 27 of the 32 batters he faced in complete-game shutout at SEMO.
- Struck out nine over seven innings of one-run ball at Texas State while leading Purdue to its first season-opening win since 2013.
- Retired 21 of the 24 batters he faced at Texas State and did not have to work from the stretch until there were two outs in the seventh inning.
- Purdue's first Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honoree since May 2012 and only the fifth Boilermaker to win the award twice in the same season.
- Became the first Purdue pitcher to start consecutive season openers since Matt Bischoff started three straight from 2008 to 2010.
- Pitched in a team-high 21 games in 2016, starting the opener of each of the first five weekends.
- A year ago, became Purdue's first non-freshman since 2011 to make his first start on a weekend, and did it in a season opener.
- Excelled as a reliever in 2016, compiling a 1.34 ERA and .168 batting average against over 14 appearances, surrendering only 24 hits while striking out 32 in 40 1/3 innings pitched.
- Pitched a career-high seven innings at ETSU and Penn State, working seven scoreless innings vs. PSU to allow Purdue to rally and force extra innings.
- Made five of his seven appearances in Big Ten play as a freshman in 2015 despite not making his collegiate debut until April 11.
- Team MVP in football, basketball and baseball each of his upperclassman years at Tippecanoe Valley High School; all-state defensive back & wide receiver, area player of the year and second team all-state performer in basketball.

- Gave Purdue his best performance of the season in the game two win at Ohio State, retiring 13 of the first 14 batters & working a season-high 7 2/3 innings.
- Bounced back from a tough season-opening outing with a quality start at Little Rock, losing a 2-0 pitcher's duel after surrendering just one run over six innings.
- Became Purdue's first left-hander to start on the mound since Jordan Minch made the last of his 25 career starts in May 2014.
- Only 12 of Purdue's 472 2/3 innings pitched (2.5 percent) last season were worked by left-handed pitchers.
- Appeared in 21 games, making 12 starts and recording 67 strikeouts in 70 innings pitched as a freshman at Coffeyville Community College in Kansas.
- Helped the Wisconsin Rapids Rafters win the 2016 Northwoods League title, recording five wins and 55 strikeouts over 60 innings pitched; also worked 4 1/3 innings of one-run ball, striking out six, in his playoff start.
- His high school did not sponsor baseball so he ran track in the spring while also playing football and basketball.
- Played legion baseball in the summer, helping his team win the class C Nebraska state title in 2014; also part of a Platte championship team in basketball.
- All A honor roll student and homecoming king.
- His mother Deb played volleyball at the University of Nebraska at Kearney.

- Was Purdue's weekend-opening starter in all six of his starts in 2015; was shut-down for the season with a back injury after his start vs. Butler.
- Gave up just one run on three hits over 5 1/3 innings to earn the win in the 2015 series opener at Oklahoma.
- Pitched a career-high six-plus innings against Northern Illinois, two of the four runs he was charged with scoring in the seventh after he left the game.
- Left the 2015 Big Ten opener against Rutgers with two outs in the fifth inning with Purdue leading 3-2 after starting the conference opener as a freshman.
- Chicago Catholic League Player of the Year as a senior after batting .417 and posting a 9-1 record with 88 strikeouts on the mound.
- Two-time all-state and First Team All-Catholic League as an upperclassman.
- Batted .429 with an 8-1 record, 82 strikeouts and 0.97 ERA on the mound as a junior to earn Area Player of the Year honors from the Southtown Star newspaper.
- Offensive team MVP honors as a junior after averaging 14 ppg in basketball.

## HEAD COACH MARK WASIKOWSKI

Mark Wasikowski, an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the Universities of Oregon, Arizona, Florida as well as Southeast Missouri State during his career, was hired as the head coach of Purdue baseball in June 2016.

Wasikowski has played and coached in the College World Series. He helped lead teams to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances during a successful 20-year run as an assistant coach. He also won an NCAA championship as the starting third baseman and a captain on Pepperdine's 1992 College World Series team.

Wasikowski (pronounced WOZ-uh-COW-ski) played for and worked under three-time national Coach of the Year Andy Lopez for a combined 18 years. He was part of Lopez's coaching staffs at both Florida (1999-2001) and Arizona (2002-11) before joining George Horton's staff at Oregon in the summer of 2011, spending five seasons with Horton in Eugene. Wasikowski was an assistant coach on Arizona's 2004 College World Series team, the same year that Horton led Cal State Fullerton to the national title.

Wasikowski has been an assistant coach on teams that have made 11 NCAA Regional appearances since 2003, including six straight seasons from 2010 to 2015. Oregon qualified for the NCAA Tournament in four of his five years, hosting two Regionals and a 2012 Super Regional. When Lopez took over the Arizona program in 2001 with Wasikowski by his side, the Wildcats had been to one Regional in the last nine years. During Wasikowski's 10 years as an assistant in Tucson, Arizona qualified for the postseason seven times.

Wasikowski is the 20th head coach in Purdue's 129-year history, but only the Boilermakers' fourth full-time skipper since 1978.

Wasikowski has coached 117 players that have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, a list highlighted by 28 big leaguers. During his 10 seasons at Arizona, Wasikowski coached 59 Major League Baseball draft picks and 22 future big leaguers. As the recruiting coordinator, he assembled the Wildcats' 2012 national championship team, leaving for Oregon before the start of the 2011-12 school year. Oregon was one of only three teams nationally to win 40-plus games every year from 2012 to 2014. During his five seasons in Eugene, the Ducks had 23 players drafted. Oregon also had a perfect 1,000 APR score as recently as 2015.

Wasikowski was a two-time All-West Coast Conference honoree at Pepperdine after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Hawaii and Rancho Santiago Junior College. He was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 1993 MLB Draft, but opted to remain at Pepperdine to finish his bachelor's degree in business administration while serving as a student assistant under Lopez during the 1994 season. He also has a master's of business administration from Southeast Missouri.

Wasikowski was inducted into the Pepperdine Athletics Hall of Fame along with all of his teammates from the 1992 national championship team. He led the Waves in doubles as a junior and hits as a senior, guiding Pepperdine back to the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

Wasikowski and his wife, Lori Jo, are the parents of two daughters, Joelle and Kelsey.

As a player, I left Arizona much better than when I arrived. He was very good at the mental part of the game and pushing us to get to places we didn't know we could go. I still talk to Waz about once every three months. He is very loyal, and I would trust his character to run my program."

## RUNS TOUGHER TO COME BY SINCE SCORING 16 IN MIDWEEK OPENER

• The Boilermakers have experienced lots of ups and downs offensively over the first month and a half of the season. Since scoring 16 runs on 21 hits in the midweek opener at Ball State (on a day the wind was blowing in), Purdue has scored just 21 runs over the last nine games (2.3 per game). A shutout win at Iowa, a ninth-inning comeback vs. Kent State and a 2-1 win in the rubber game at Ohio State has helped Purdue go 4-5 over those nine games. Six of the 21 runs were scored over the first four innings of the game two win at Ohio State.

• Since hitting seven home runs in the Southeast Missouri series (March 3-5), the team's most in a weekend since 2006, the Boilermakers have hit just one run homer (**Jacson McGowan** in game 4 at Santa Clara) in their last 18 games. The weather has played a big factor in some of those games though.

• Purdue entered the opening weekend of Big Ten play leading the Big Ten in runs scored (135) but has since slipped to fifth. With **Evan Warden** (17) and **Harry Shipley** (14) ranked 1-2 nationally in hit by pitch, the Boilermakers led the conference in that category (43) as well as sacrifice bunts (32). Purdue is also second in doubles (59) and sacrifice flies (17), but has had the most base runners erased in the conference via caught stealings (16).

## BOILERMAKERS BEGIN HOME-HEAVY STRETCH

• After playing each of its first seven weekends on the road, Purdue will be at home for five of the next six weekends. Eighteen of the Boilermakers' next 25 games through May 14 are scheduled to be played at Alexander Field. Purdue's 14 true road wins are easily the most in the Big Ten and more than the program had in the last two seasons combined (10). Minnesota and Michigan State both have 10 true road wins this year as the only other Big Ten teams to have reached double figures. Purdue and Minnesota were the only two teams to play each of their first two Big Ten series on the road.

• The Boilermakers have won road series at Southeast Missouri, Santa Clara and Ohio State this year. The 2012 season marked the last time Purdue won three true road series. The Boilermakers had only won three total true road series in the four years since. At OSU, Purdue rallied to win a series after losing the opening game for only the third time since the start of the 2010 season.

• The Boilermakers won 10 games in March, posting a double-figure win total in a month for the first time since May 2012 (10-5). Purdue will now look to carry over its winning ways to Alexander Field. Entering the weekend, Purdue is just 26-53 at home since Alexander opened in 2013. The program's most home wins was eight (8-12) in 2015 and best winning percentage was .438 (7-9) in 2014. The Boilermakers have won just three of their 18 home weekend series at Alexander.

## LEARNARD & HUNTER RIDING NOTABLE STREAKS

• **Skyler Hunter** and **Ross Learnard** have been Purdue's most consistent performers entering the weekend. Hunter has reached base safely in 18 consecutive games and Learnard has pitched 19 consecutive scoreless innings over his last 11 relief appearances.

• Hunter has reached base safely in every game since the start of the spring break trip, batting .375 (24-for-64) with a .419 on-base during the 18-game streak. After delivering a two-run single in the sixth inning of the 2-1 win at Ohio State on April 2, he has driven in the go-ahead run in five of the Boilermakers' last 10 wins dating back to March 13. He has recorded a team-high 16 RBI over the last 15 games, batting .500 (9-for-18) with runners in scoring position during that stretch. He also scored the game-winning run in the March 28 walk-off victory vs. Kent State.

• Learnard (22 IP) and fellow reliever **Dalton Parker** (19 2/3 IP) have both allowed run(s) in only one inning this season. Learnard's streak is the longest by a Purdue pitcher since Matt Bischoff worked 22 consecutive scoreless innings in 2007. Learnard did not allow an inherited base runner to score until the April 4 loss to Indiana State. For the season, he has stranded eight of nine inherited runners. He has earned two wins and a save during his streak while making seven of his 11 appearances in Purdue victories.

• **Nick Dalesandro** reached base safely in 22 consecutive games from Feb. 24 to April 1. His streak was the longest among active Boilermakers and the first 20-game single-season run by a Purdue player since Kyle Wood (24) in 2014. Dalesandro batted .395 (34-for-86) with a .448 OBP, eight extra-base hits and 19 RBI.

## TEAM HIGHLIGHTS AS PRE-CONFERENCE PLAY WRAPPED UP

• Purdue recorded season highs for hits (21) and runs (16) in the Ball State win. It was the team's first 20-hit game since a March 2015 win vs. Northern Illinois. The 16 runs were the most since scoring 19 in a win at East Tennessee State in March of last season.

• In their series win at Santa Clara, the Boilermakers swept a doubleheader for the first time since February 2015 vs. Sam Houston State in Corpus Christi, Texas, and swept a doubleheader on an opponent's home field for the first time since March 2012 at Ohio State.

• Purdue Won a four-game series on the road for the first time since February 2011 at Morehead State, swept a four-game series for the first time since April 2008 vs. Minnesota and swept a four-game series on the road for the first time since April 2001 at Northwestern.

• The Boilermakers have won a pair of non-conference series this year, their first on the road since March 2013 at Evansville.

## HUNTER NAMED BIG FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- After driving in the go-ahead run in three of the five wins on the spring break trip, **Skyler Hunter** was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week. He had a 10-game hit streak from March 10 to 24 and was 11-for-23 with 13 RBI during Purdue's seven-game win streak.
- Hunter put together 17 productive plate appearances in 26 trips to the dish during the first six games of Purdue's win streak. He had a pair of three-run doubles, two walks, a hit by pitch, three sacrifice flies and a sac bunt during that stretch. With a runner on third base and less than two outs, he drove in that runner in all seven of his opportunities.
- Hunter hit safely in every game of each of Purdue's three four-game series this season. Four-game series have not been as common since the Big Ten switched from four- to three-game conference weekends beginning in 2009, but he's the first Boilermaker to accomplish the feat since 2008 nonetheless.

## DALESANDRO NAMED TO JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

- **Nick Dalesandro** is part of the first edition of the watch list for the 2017 Johnny Bench Award, which recognizes the top Division I catcher. The sophomore opened the season as the starting catcher and remains a valuable versatile performer, also starting game in all three outfield positions for the Boilermakers.
- Dalesandro heated up at the plate in March. He entered the month just 4-for-26 with no extra-base hits, but batted .437 with 18 RBI in the first full month of the season. He homered in back-to-back games at Southeast Missouri, the first two long balls of his collegiate career, and drove in a run in the first six games of March. He was 14-for-32 (.438) with five doubles and eight RBI on the spring break trip.
- Dalesandro joins Kevin Plawecki (2011, 2012), Sean McHugh (2014) and Jack Picchiotti (2016) as recent Purdue players to be on the Johnny Bench Award watch list. Plawecki was one of three finalists in 2012 after being among the 15 semifinalists the year before. McHugh also advanced to the semifinalist list in 2014.
- Drafted by the Detroit Tigers in June 2015 after his senior year of high school, Dalesandro has started games at catcher, all three outfield spots and pitcher as a Boilermaker. Rare is the college player who is able to handle the defensive needs and responsibilities of both catcher and center field. He has throw out 22 base stealers to go along with nine outfield assists in his career.

## ANDREWS NAMED BIG TEN PITCHER OF THE WEEK AGAIN

- **Tanner Andrews** retired 27 of the 32 batters he faced in his first career complete-game shutout, striking out eight in the series opener at Southeast Missouri. He did not allow the leadoff man to reach base safely until the ninth inning, working five 1-2-3 frames total. He didn't allow a runner to reach third base and was most dominant against the four through nine hitters, a segment of the SEMO order that was a combined 1-for-20. He posted his shutout in a ballpark that yielded a combined 42 runs over the final two games of the series.
- Andrews is the fourth Boilermaker to win Big Ten Pitcher of the Week at least twice in the same season. Around the Big Ten, OSU's Brad Goldberg (first two weeks of 2013) was the last pitcher to win it twice over the first three weeks. Andrews pitched Purdue's first complete-game shutout on the road since May 2012.
- Andrews struck out a career-high 10, the most by a Purdue pitcher since March 2012, over 7 2/3 shutout innings at Santa Clara. He led the Boilermakers to another shutout win in the series opener at Iowa. Dating back to the final weekend of 2016, five of his last eight appearances on the mound have come in shutout wins for Purdue.

## BOILERMAKERS HIT SEVEN HOMERS AT SEMO

- Purdue won its series at Southeast Missouri behind **Tanner Andrews'** complete-game shutout Friday and the lineup producing 13 runs Saturday. The Boilermakers hit seven homers, including six of the two-run variety, over the final two games of the series. **Nick Dalesandro** and **John LeGare** both homered on consecutive days. **Harry Shipley** also connected for his first collegiate long ball. **Alec Olund** and **Jacson McGowan** went deep as well.
- Purdue's four home runs in the 13-5 middle game win were its most since also hitting four in a May 2012 win at Iowa. Meanwhile, the seven homers were the Boilermakers' most in a series in the BBCOR bat era (2011-present). Purdue had not hit seven homers against a single opponent since a March 2010 two-game midweek series at Missouri. It had been since April 2006 at Indiana for the last time the Boilermakers had seven long balls in a weekend series.
- Led by Andrews, the Boilermakers have won their first game of a weekend in each of the first three weekends of a season for the first time since 2012. But things have not come as easy on Sundays. Purdue is 0-3 on Sundays, getting outscored 44-12 while surrendering a double-figure run total in all three losses.

## POISALL ENJOYS EMOTIONAL WEEK, MEMORABLE DEBUT

- **Logan Poisall** doubled and homered in his first two at-bats as a Boilermaker during the season-opening weekend. Those were the high points of an emotional roller coaster of a week for the JUCO transfer from California. He learned of the passing of his father Jack on Thursday (Feb. 16) and did not arrive at Texas State's field until the fourth inning of the season opener. He was featured by D1Baseball.com and MLB Network the week of Feb. 20, attending the services for his father in Fresno before flying to Little Rock to rejoin the team Feb. 23.
- Poisall started the final three games of the series at third base, finishing the weekend 4-for-12 with two walks and four runs scored. He would have been the starting third baseman on opening day, but was not permitted to travel with the team because his eligibility was not officially verified until the team bus had already left for the airport. Players must be officially eligible to play in order to be allowed to travel with the team. Poisall learned his father passed away while the team flight he was originally scheduled to be on was in the air.
- After he was cleared to play by the NCAA, Poisall flew from Indianapolis to Charlotte to San Antonio on Friday. Purdue's dugout erupted with joy when Poisall finally rejoined his teammates in the fourth inning of the season opener. The Boilermakers entered the frame with a 4-0 lead and blew the game open with a four-run frame, winning their first game under new head coach **Mark Wasikowski** 9-3. Poisall led off the eighth inning with his pinch-hit double down the left field line. He was one of three Boilermakers to go deep in the first inning of the Feb. 18 doubleheader.
